A few years ago, I had someone tell me once they do not like Palm Sunday. I thought to myself, "why not?' You go to church on Palm Sunday and the church gives out palms, they are free you do not have pay for them. Now granted that are not they are not the most appealing of things outside of today. This individual went onto explain that you start out today's Mass with proclaiming Jesus is king waving palm branches and then you call for the crucifixion



of Jesus and at the end of the scriptures today Jesus is dead. I must admit that this individual was right, and it is a strange whirlwind of events we experience our Mass today. But I think this strange whirlwind of events says something about who Jesus is as king.

As we journey from proclaiming Jesus is king and waving palm branches, to calling for the crucifixion of Jesus and his death on the cross in the whirlwind of events. We encounter Jesus on the cross with many wounds. Not only do we encounter Jesus with many wounds but today and particularly this week are invited into these wounds. Because like Jesus with these many wounds, each one of us has many wounds are we invited place our wounds in the wounds of Jesus Christ on the cross. For when we place our wounds in the wounds of Jesus on the cross our wounds are healed.

I was in high school when mom sent me on my first retreat to the Steubenville Youth Conference. Along the way there we made a stop at rest stop to eat lunch. We also were broke down into small groups to share why we were going and what we were hoping to get out this experience. At the time I was not very comfortable with sharing in small groups like this particularly with people I really did not know.

But I was honest, I said "I here because Mom made me". My small group responded by saying "Mom may want you to be here, and I would imagine Mom wants you to get all that you can out of this experience and the way to do that is to fully participate. Even participate in those things that might make you feel slightly uncomfortable". I followed my small group leader's advice, and I got a lot out of the conference. As we begin Holy Week this today, Holy Week in many ways is like a retreat, so I invite you to participate as fully as you able to. The more you can put into this week, the more you will get out of it.

CATECHISM CORNER

Understanding Our Paptismal Promises

As we enter into Palm Sunday, the final week of Lent before Christ's glorious Resurrection, we take a moment to reflect on our Lenten promises and prepare to renew our Baptismal Promise, so as to prepare our hearts more fully for conversion this on Easter. When we renew our Baptismal Promise, we are reminded of our own baptism and the day we are marked as a Child of God. So, what then are the promises we are to renew?

The Baptismal promises are a series of questions asked before baptism into the Catholic Church. The first set of questions asks us to renounce Satan, his works and all of his worldly displays. The second set of questions asks about our beliefs in God the Father, His Son Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, the Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the resurrection of Christ and life everlasting. Here are the six questions of the baptismal promises, which we renew yearly on Easter Vigil or Easter Sunday:

Priest. Do you renounce Satan? **All.** I do. --- **P.** And all his works? **A.** I do. --- **P.** And all his empty promises? **A.** I do. --- **P.** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? **A.** I do. ---

- **P.** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father? **A.** I do. ---
- **P.** Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting? **A.** I do. ---
- **P.** And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life. **A.** Amen.

Ways to Live Out Your Baptismal Promise

Establish a strong prayer life. Make it a habit to read scripture. The Bible is the Word of God and is given to us for instruction. An acronym to remember for BIBLE is: Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth. It is a discipline that will help you draw closer to the Lord. St. Jerome, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of God."

Make use of holy water fonts when you enter and exit a church. Put up holy water fonts by the doors in your home and bless yourself and your family when coming and going from your "domestic church". Slow down the Sign of the Cross you make with holy water, recalling the Holy Trinity.

Not only can you renew your Baptismal Promise at Easter, you can also renew them privately on the anniversary date of your baptism, or during the Easter season as a family. Don't forget to sprinkle holy water.

Use your baptismal candle (or purchase a replacement) to light it on special occasions such as anniversaries of baptism, first communion and confirmation – or whenever you want to recall the flame of faith that lives in you. Display all the baptismal candles in the family in your home throughout the year or as a special centerpiece at Easter.

Baptized into the family of Christ each member of the family has a part in its success. Find a way to get involved in your parish. You are sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit at confirmation, and you have a skill and gift that will benefit your parish. Often times people are hesitant because they think that what they are good at is insignificant. No way! It all matters and is all important!

Renewing the baptismal promises is a way of showing our loyalty to Christ and the Catholic Church. Before we come closer to the baptismal font once again this year to renew our promises, let us check our baptism date first, and celebrate that day just like how we would celebrate our birthdays! With the greatest act of faith, let us make our total commitment this Easter.

LOOK FOR THE NEW ANNUAL MASS SERVER SCHEDULE COMING MID MAY.

Anyone attending CCD in present grades 5 through 11, not presently a mass server, who wishes to become a server starting at the end of this school year must register using this QR code and attend a training session. High schoolers generally serve weekend and holyday masses, grade schoolers serve weekday masses.

On Good Friday morning, JESUS, who had been arrested the night before, was judged by Pontius Pilate, the ROMAN governor. Pilate had him WHIPPED. Then to make fun of Him the SOLDIERS made a CROWN of THORNS and put it on His head. They threw a purple cloth on Him and beat Him with RODS, saying, "Hail, KING of the JEWS!" Then Pilate had Jesus brought out in front of the people and asked them what they wanted to do with Him. The people, who had welcomed Him into JERUSALEM a few days before with their HOSANNAS, now shouted that He should be crucified.
