APRIL 26, 2020 THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

This is the third Sunday of Easter. We see in today's gospel the account of the road to Emmaus. "That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they

were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them,

but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. These two disciples do not recognize the risen Christ. Jesus' body is somewhat different. You could say he is cleaned up from the passion he endured. Jesus doesn't have a crown of thorns on his head. Jesus is glorified and made new.

If we are true to Christ in this life and the next, this is what will happen to you and me in Christ's second coming. We will get a new body also. Our old body will rise from the grave and our souls will be reunited to our new resurrected body and heaven and earth will be connected. The only time heaven and earth are connected now is when we celebrate mass. All the angels and saints are with us at mass. Even our dead family members who are in heaven.

Jesus' words bring life and new meaning to our old way of life. One of the disciples in today's gospel said, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" When you read the gospels, just imagine Christ is talking directly to you. I know he may be speaking to someone else directly in the gospel but just imagine he is speaking directly to you. God has something for you to take from that gospel reading.
