

Why does Jesus bring Lazarus back from the dead, only to have him die again? We hear in our scriptures today Jesus calling Lazarus to come out of the tomb in our scriptures today, but you know at some point Lazarus died again and went back into the tomb. I mean there is no evidence that proves that Lazarus is still alive today, so that would seem to mean that Lazarus died again. So why did Jesus call Lazarus out of the tomb, only to have him go back into the tomb? It appears there should be a punch line to follow this question, but I do not have one.

The death of Lazarus would have been sad news for his sisters Martha and Mary for a couple reasons. The obvious Lazarus was their brother, and they loved him, and it is sad when someone you love dies. Another reason is the culture of the time would have made things difficult for Martha and Mary. In the culture of Jesus's time women did not have many rights and they depended on the protection of men, men that were particularly members of their family a father, husband, son, or brother were expected to take on this role. The death of Lazarus would have left the vulnerable and bringing Lazarus back from the dead would have restored dignity and protection to Martha and Mary.

One reason you could say that Jesus brought Lazarus back from the dead was to protect Martha's and Mary's dignity. But there is also greater reason than to just restore dignity of culture. When both Martha and Mary meet Jesus, they both tell him the same thing "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died" (John 11:21, 32). Both Martha and Mary believed that Jesus could done something to save Lazarus but now they feel as though it is too late Lazarus is dead. I think we could say the same thing about our lives when tragedy hits, we can question where Jesus is? Can feel it is too late for him to work in our lives sometimes.

Jesus responds to them by saying that their brother will rise and asks Martha "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone

who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26). Martha says that she believes, and it is with her belief that Jesus calls Lazarus out of the tomb. In two weeks from now at Easter our Elect will say she believes that Jesus is resurrection, will be baptized and we who are baptized will renew our commitment to this belief and will have water sprinkled on us to remind us of our baptism. It is with this belief we have the hope of living forever. While Martha's, Mary's, and Lazarus's bodies may have physically died, because of their faith that Jesus is the resurrection they are alive.

CATECHISM CORNER

Lent: Almsgiving

Of the three marks of Lent — prayer, fasting and almsgiving — almsgiving is surely the most neglected. Yet, scripture tells us, "Prayer and fasting are good, but better than either is almsgiving accompanied by righteousness … It is better to give alms than to store up gold; for almsgiving saves one from death and expiates every sin. Those who regularly give alms shall enjoy a full life" (Tob 12:8-9).

Why is almsgiving better than prayer and fasting? Because it is prayer, and it involves fasting. Almsgiving is a form of prayer because it is "giving to God". It is a form of fasting because it demands sacrificial giving — not just giving something, but giving up something, giving till it hurts.

Jesus presented almsgiving as a necessary part of Christian life: "when you give alms, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by men. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing" (Mt 6:2-3). He does not say IF you give alms, but WHEN. Like fasting and prayer, almsgiving is non-negotiable.

The first Christians knew this. "There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need" (Acts 4:34-35).

That was the living embodiment of a basic principle of Catholic social teaching, what tradition calls "the universal destination of goods." The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#2452): "The goods of creation are destined for the entire human race". But they can't get there unless we put them there — and that requires effort.

As with prayer and fasting, so with almsgiving. If we have a plan, we'll find it easier to do. Throughout history, many Christians have used the Old Testament practice of "tithing" as a guide — that is, they give a tenth of their income "to God." In practice, that means giving it to the poor, to the parish, or to charitable institutions. It's a matter of trusting God, and God will not be outdone in generosity.

Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35), but those who tithe often find themselves on the receiving end as well. Indeed, many Catholics extend the concept of almsgiving beyond money to include time and talent as well, donating a portion of these to worthy causes.

We need to give to God — whom we meet in our neighbor. Whatever we give, whether it's monetary or time or talent, is symbolic of the greater giving that defines the Christian life. As God gave himself entirely to us, so we give ourselves entirely to Him. In the Eucharist, He holds nothing back. He gives us His body, blood, soul and divinity — everything He has. That's the giving we need to imitate.

Charity begins at home, where we daily make the choice to give our time, our attention, our affirming smile, and give generously. But charity must not stop there, because for Catholics "home" is universal, and our family is as big as the world. We need to dig deep and give much where much is needed. But, whenever possible, our charity should also involve personal acts, not just automatic withdrawals from our bank account.

Sometimes all we can give is a smile, but sometimes that is the greatest sacrifice, the greatest prayer, and indeed the most generous and most sacrificial alms. Source: St. Paul Center.com, 2025

CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT

The Diocese of Toledo remains committed to ensuring the protection of children and providing a safe environment for all young people. All suspected or actual acts of physical or sexual child abuse, or neglect, must be reported to the Putnam County Job and Family Services by calling 567-376-3777. Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday- Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident--leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call. Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.

Every April, Catholic parishes and schools across the United States participate in National Child Abuse Prevention Month. While dioceses work year-round to prevent abuse, during this month a special emphasis is placed on the importance of learning how to protect the vulnerable from this evil.

Together, for the next nine days, let's pray that the vulnerable are protected from abuse, and that survivors of abuse may be accompanied on their paths to healing.



Parents of Mass Servers or New Mass Servers: LOOK FOR THE NEW ANNUAL MASS SERVER SCHEDULE COMING MID MAY.

Anyone attending CCD in present grades 5 through 11, not presently a mass server, who wishes to become a server starting at the end of this school year must register using this QR code and attend a training session. High schoolers generally serve weekend and holyday masses, grade schoolers serve weekday masses.

The grade school training or any new servers (attend one): SESSION 1: WEDNESDAY, MAY 7, 2025 after school till 4:30 pm SESSION 2: THURSDAY, MAY 8, 2025 from 6:00 - 7:30 pm

Any eight grade server or anyone that wants a refresher for serving at weekend Mass and Holy Days

SESSION 1: Any time between 3:00pm - 4:30pm on Wednesday, MAY 14, 2025. We will be having multiple training sessions starting every 15mins.

To be clear, all existing mass servers are already registered (and trained). They will continue to be scheduled annually through high school and do not need to register again with this QR code.

Parents of existing servers should only use the QR code to update registration status(data: 1) to be removed from the schedule; 2) update guardian contact address, email, cell phone number; 3) update preferred weekend mass time, 4] change their preference regarding whether heighe should be scheduled to serve with a sibling.

The deadline for registration submittals is April 28, 2025.
