# START A NEW HABIT - SPEND TIME WITH GOD'S WORDS 3rd SUNDAY ADVENT LESSON ON LECTIO DIVINA – DIVINE PRAYER

Lectio divina is a method of praying the Scriptures. What better way to get to know God than by spending time with God's spoken word?

The practice of *lectio divina* traces its roots back to the early centuries in the Church. By the sixth century, <u>St. Benedict</u> had made it a regular practice in most monasteries. Today *lectio divina* is a widely held practice by many laymen and laywomen.

Lectio divina is a slow, rhythmic reading and praying of a Scripture passage. You pick a passage and read it. Notice what arises within you as you read it. Then you read it again, and then again, noticing what words and phrases grab your heart and noticing the feelings that arise. You respond to God about whatever is stirring within as you read and pray with the passage. Finally, you rest and let God respond and speak to you.

Let's consider the formal steps. To begin, you might open with a short prayer, (see Holy Spirit Prayer below). Ask God to guide your prayer time. Try to silence your mind and put off the cares of the day. You could make an act of Faith, Hope, and Charity. Simply; Lord I believe in You help my unbelief, Lord I Hope in You increase my Trust in You, Lord I Love You show me how to love You more. Then do the following:

# Read.

Slowly and thoughtfully, read the Scripture passage the first time.

Did a word or phrase capture your attention and grab your heart? Linger with it whenever this happens.

# Reflect.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. What is God saying to you in this passage? offering you? asking you? What feelings are arising within you?

# Respond.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. Respond to God from your heart. Speak to God of your feelings and insights. Offer these to God.

# Rest.

Possibly read the passage another time. Sit quietly in God's presence, asking, "What are you saying to me?" Rest in God's love and listen.

# Concrete resolution.

What is God calling you to do with what He has said to you. Practice a virtue like generosity, apologize to someone, do a kind act for someone who may have come to mind during your prayer time etc.

As you end your prayer period, you might close with an Our Father or another short prayer. It might be helpful to jot down in a journal what arose during this time. What did you say to God, and what did God offer you?

# **Come Holy Spirit Prayer:**

Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful, enkindle in us the fire of your love, send forth your Spirit and we shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit, help us to know what is truly right and always rejoice in his consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me."

As they were going off, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John, "What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind? Then what did you go out to see? Someone dressed in fine clothing? Those who wear fine clothing are in royal palaces. Then why did you go out? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written: *Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you.* Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent and the Third Sunday of Advent is also referred to as Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin calling for us to rejoice, on this Sunday we are called to rejoice. Today we have reached the exact middle point of the Season of Advent, two weeks in and two more weeks to go, Christ is soon to come. A part of that call to rejoice we light the third candle on the Advent Wreath and note the color of the candle is different from the other three. And today priests and deacons are given the opportunity to wear vestments of that same color. Officially the church calls the color rose and many others incorrectly like to call the color pink.



Last year or two years ago I was home with family on the evening of the Third Sunday of Advent. My brothers asked me what color of vestments that I wore for Mass? And I told them that I wore rose. Then they tried to make fun of me for wearing pink it is not masculine to wear pink and I agree. Outside of today you probably will not see me dressed in this color. I also had to remind them that the color is rose and not pink. Then they asked me "do I like to wear this color?" To which I replied, "two Sundays a year." Now I do not think this qualified in answering their question.

But two Sundays a year I happily wear rose vestments. This color may not be a masculine color but I like what this color symbolizes and what the color calls for us to do. In October people tend to wear pink in support of women's health and this is wonderful. Wearing the color Rose today is also a wonderful symbol. Rose, Gaudete, rejoice Christ is coming soon, this is good news, this is something for us to celebrate. We take our faith serious and that is good thing but sometimes I think that we can take our faith so seriously that we can forget to rejoice, celebrate in the good news of our faith. If our faith is not something that we celebrate, what good is our faith?

In our scriptures today John the Baptist sends his disciples to Jesus with a burning question John wants to know if Jesus is the Christ? The signs that Jesus is performing points to him as possibly being the Christ. When asked, Jesus does not directly answer the question but responds by saying "the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed" (Matthew 11:5). If you were blind, lame, a leper, deaf, or poor and you got restored to good health this would certainly be a reason to celebrate, to rejoice. The Lord has touched our lives and this is certainly a reason for us to rejoice and celebrate. Our world is not perfect, a matter of fact our world is far from perfect but when the Lord comes the Lord will restore our world to perfection and this will certainly be a reason for us to rejoice and celebrate. In anticipation of what will be we are called to rejoice.

Even in our imperfect world today we are still called to rejoice, Mary gives us an example. As Woodeene Koenig Bricker explains in 365 Mary "It's clear that Gabriel expected Mary to rejoice, yet he must have known that she was undoubtedly going to feel anxiety. He didn't expect her to be happy on command, but he did expect her to rejoice. Likewise, we can rejoice at all times and in all circumstances, not because we feel giddy but because life itself is a celebration". On this Gaudete Sunday may we embrace the call to rejoice.






