SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to nonemergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today is the Third Sunday of Advent and the Third Sunday is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word calling for us to rejoice. On this Third Sunday of Advent, we light the third candle on our Advent Wreathe and note the color of this candle is different than the other three. And, to note this Sunday that the color of my vestments today is the same color of our third candle. Many are quick to wanting to call this color pink, officially the church calls this color rose. Rose, pink, what is the difference between the colors? Perhaps a slight difference in shade? I do not know for sure. I am always reminded that Jesus rose from the dead and not pinked from the dead. It is so easy for us to get wrapped up in what color it is, but that is not the point today, we can easily forget what this color symbolizes and what this color calls for us to do. Gaudete, rejoice is what we are called to do today this color rose is meant to help us do that.

In the first two weeks of Advent we have been hearing a message of the importance of being ready. Jesus told us to be watchful and to be alert and this message was almost given to us in a tone that we are to be fearful of the Lord's coming. We are certainly called to be ready, but message of Christ's coming is not something we are supposed to fear. The message that Jesus is coming is good news, the message that Jesus is coming meant to give us hope. The message that Jesus is coming is something that we are called to celebrate, it is a call for us to rejoice, this message is meant to give us joy.

We hear the call to celebrate, to rejoice but perhaps there are some that might challenge this call to rejoice and celebrate. And say we cannot celebrate or rejoice. They might point out "look at the state that our world is in and all the problems that are world has, how can we celebrate, how can we rejoice? We need to fix the world's problems before the Lord comes". I agree that our world has its fair share of problems and no we cannot be happy about those problems, and we have some work to do for before the Lord comes. But we can not solve all the world's problems on our own, some of the problems needs Christ. But we can still rejoice, we often associate being happy and rejoicing as being the same thing but being happy and rejoicing are similar but different.

Woodeene Koenig Bricker explains the difference between being and rejoicing using example of Mary. He explains:

When the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary, he announced "Rejoice, favored one! The word rejoice implies more than the mere feeling of happiness. Interestingly, unlike happiness, which is an emotion over which we have little or no control. Rejoicing, is something we can choose to do. We can choose to express glory or triumph, no matter what we're feeling at the moment it's clear that Gabriel expected Mary to rejoice, yet she must have known that she was undoubtedly going to feel anxiety. He didn't expect her to be happy on command, but he expected her to rejoice. Likewise, we can

rejoice at all times and in all circumstances, not because we feel giddy but because life itself is a celebration.

We rejoice not because the world is perfect and the way it is supposed to be. We rejoice because the gift of life is a gift, we rejoice at the message of the Lord's coming promises to make the world the way it is supposed to be.

CATECHISM CORNER

3RD WEEK OF ADVENT

"Gaudete Sunday" = Joyful Sunday

The third candle on the Advent wreath is rose and symbolizes joy! It is called the "Shepherd's Candle" because it takes us back to the joyful anticipation of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus even before the wise men.

A Joyful Sunday. The Third Sunday of Advent is also known as *Gaudete* Sunday. The word "gaudete" is derived from the Latin words "gaudium," joy, and "gaudeo," to rejoice or be glad. *Gaudete* Sunday occurs eight to thirteen days before Christmas, and the nearness of the feast is reason for great joy.

The Term "Gaudete." Gaudete is taken from the Entrance Antiphon: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near" (paraphrase, Phil 4:4-5). Advent is a time of joyful expectation and eager preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas.

Multiple Reasons for Joy. There is joy in looking forward to the annual celebration of Christmas, but there is also joy in recalling the birth of Jesus on the first Christmas. The joy is heightened because he was born to save us from our sins (Mt 1:21b). The joy also extends to anticipation of the Second Coming, either at the end of physical life or the end of the world, the time when believers will be given the crown of righteousness (2 Tm 4:8) and a place in the Father's house (Jn 14:2) to dwell with God and his angels and saints for all eternity. A Joyful Color. Rose represents joy and may be used as the liturgical color for *Gaudete* Sunday. Violet remains the official color for the Season of Advent, the Third Sunday included, because all of Advent has a penitential tone, a time to be absolved of sin and be in the state of grace for Christmas. *Gaudete* Sunday offers a brief respite to focus on the uplifting, upcoming joyful celebration of the Nativity. *From, A Catholic Spirit, December 10, 2020*







Third Sunday of Advent: Experiencing Joy



THE GRACE I SEEK: to live in joy at the coming of Christ

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to joyfully prepare my heart to welcome you.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"I rejoice heartily in the LORD, in my God is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation." (Isaiah 61:10)

FOR REFLECTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

How is God inviting me to detach my heart from other loves so that he can be the center and true joy of my soul?

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you in a personal way through this passage.

"A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light." (John 1:6–8)

FOR REFLECTION — Contemplate the humble heart of St. John the Baptist, whose life is a school of Christian discipleship. Ask Jesus to help you transform any areas of pride in your heart so that you can grow in humility and prepare a way for him in your own heart— as well as in the hearts of those he is inviting you to share his joy with.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — O God, who see how your people faithfully await the feast of the Lord's Nativity, enable us, we pray, to attain the joys of so great a salvation and to celebrate them always with solemn worship and glad rejoicing. Though our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Third Sunday of Advent)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — Every celebration of the Mass imparts sanctifying grace that helps us to decrease so that our Lord can increase within us. On this Gaudete Sunday, may our lives become a living hymn of praise and thanksgiving to our Eucharistic Lord, who comes to us with humility and love at every Mass. Ask our Lord today for the grace to humbly proclaim the Good News with your life.

LOVE IN ACTION — In the book of Nehemiah, we hear that "... rejoicing in the LORD is [our] strength" (Nehemiah 8:10). This week, respond to the Gospel mandate to care for the poor by reaching out to someone who is homeless or impoverished with a sign of Christ's joy, whether it is a thoughtful card, a pocket Bible with a loving dedication, or some other concrete token.
