START A NEW HABIT - SPEND TIME WITH GOD'S WORDS 4th SUNDAY ADVENT LESSON ON LECTIO DIVINA – DIVINE PRAYER

Lectio divina is a method of praying the Scriptures. What better way to get to know God than by spending time with God's spoken word?

The practice of *lectio divina* traces its roots back to the early centuries in the Church. By the sixth century, <u>St. Benedict</u> had made it a regular practice in most monasteries. Today *lectio divina* is a widely held practice by many laymen and laywomen.

Lectio divina is a slow, rhythmic reading and praying of a Scripture passage. You pick a passage and read it. Notice what arises within you as you read it. Then you read it again, and then again, noticing what words and phrases grab your heart and noticing the feelings that arise. You respond to God about whatever is stirring within as you read and pray with the passage. Finally, you rest and let God respond and speak to you.

Let's consider the formal steps. To begin, you might open with a short prayer, (see Holy Spirit Prayer below). Ask God to guide your prayer time. Try to silence your mind and put off the cares of the day. You could make an act of Faith, Hope, and Charity. Simply; Lord I believe in You help my unbelief, Lord I Hope in You increase my Trust in You, Lord I Love You show me how to love You more. Then do the following:

Read.

Slowly and thoughtfully, read the Scripture passage the first time.

Did a word or phrase capture your attention and grab your heart? Linger with it whenever this happens.

Reflect.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. What is God saying to you in this passage? offering you? asking you? What feelings are arising within you?

Respond.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. Respond to God from your heart. Speak to God of your feelings and insights. Offer these to God.

Rest.

Possibly read the passage another time. Sit quietly in God's presence, asking, "What are you saying to me?" Rest in God's love and listen.

Concrete resolution.

What is God calling you to do with what He has said to you. Practice a virtue like generosity, apologize to someone, do a kind act for someone who may have come to mind during your prayer time etc.

As you end your prayer period, you might close with an Our Father or another short prayer. It might be helpful to jot down in a journal what arose during this time. What did you say to God, and what did God offer you?

Come Holy Spirit Prayer:

Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful, enkindle in us the fire of your love, send forth your Spirit and we shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit, help us to know what is truly right and always rejoice in his consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

4th Sunday Advent

Gospel Mt 1:18-24

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.

In a week from now our church is going to look a little different. There will be decorations of Christmas trees, lights, flowers, and a manger scene will be set up. This is my first Christmas here and I have not seen our church at Christmas, so I look forward to seeing it. I have seen pictures. And the reason of our decorating will be on the little baby lying in the manger. And throughout the Christmas Season we will focus on different characters in the scene Mary, the shepherds, and the magi and how they relate to the baby in the manger. An important character and role to this scene that often gets overlooked is Joseph.

As I reflect on the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I think we give great attention to Jesus obviously and many have a strong devotion to Mary that is seen every day with people coming into church praying the Rosary. Unfortunately, little attention is given to Joseph, and unfortunately, we seem not to know much about him. Joseph, I think is an important person for us to pay attention. One of the things I appreciate about Pope Francis has invited us to give more attention to Joseph, Pope Francis has included Joseph's name to be apart of the Eucharistic Prayer and from December 8, 2020-December 8, 2021 Pope Francis dedicated this year to Joseph.

Joseph in a way reminds of offensive linemen on the football field. Offensive linemen typically do not get credited for scoring touchdowns, passing yards, rushing yards, receiving yards, or any of the notable statistics. Yet without their contribution of protecting and leading their teammates would not have their notable stats. A

matter of a fact a good play does not get started without a proper exchange between the center and the quarterback. Similarly, Joseph protected, and lead Mary and Jesus and he seems to get little credit and gets overlooked. Yet what Joseph contributed was very important.

In our scriptures today attention is given to Joseph and the role that he played. In our scriptures today we learn that Joseph and Mary are betrothed, engaged to be married. And before Mary and Joseph are living together Mary is found to be pregnant with a child by the Holy Spirit. One can only imagine the thoughts, feelings, and emotions Joseph may have experienced at the moment.

Regardless of what Joseph was experiencing. What I think is most notable about Joseph is that he was a man of faith and he wanted to do things right. Yes, Mary was pregnant, but no Joseph did not want to expose Mary to this embarrassment that may have cost her, her life. The angel appeared to Joseph in a dream telling to "not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home" (Matthew 1:20). It is through the Holy Spirit that Mary has conceived this child and Joseph is to call this child Jesus. Joseph is told that God is with him. Joseph trusts in God and does the right thing. Joseph took Mary into his home. After Jesus's birth we will encounter Joseph acting in faith again, when Joseph and Mary flee with the child Jesus to Egypt when Herod orders the massacre of all boys under the age of two.

I think we are called to be like Joseph, at times life is going to put obstacles in front of us, and we will be called to act in faith and do the right thing. And like Joseph we may not get attention for acting in faith and doing what is right, but we do the good that we do because we know our act of faith and our good has an impact on another. And without us it would never get done.

NEW SYMBOL FOR THE MISSIONARIES OF THE PRECIOUS BLOOD IN THE UNTIED STATES PROVINCE

When the Missionaries of the Precious Blood created their United States Province from the former Cincinnati and Kansas City Provinces earlier this year, they knew they would need a new symbol for this new entity. The process of creating a new symbol began as it ends, with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Four Missionaries were asked to participate in a discussion of their own call, their experience of the Congregation, its mission, and their understanding of Precious Blood spirituality. They did a deep dive into the Congregation's identity. One question they were asked: If the Congregation was a person, what would be its personality traits? Some of their answers were: "Empathy; a person who really listens; nonjudgmental; integrity; looking at current events and ready to respond in love; respect for others; compassionate; spiritual; humble." Their thoughts were distilled and sent to a design firm that came up with the first round of symbol design drafts. The committee of four Missionaries took a long look, rejected a few designs outright, made recommendations on the rest, and set the designers back to work.

The drafts that made it through that initial process went on to the Provincial Council. Council members studied the design drafts, rejected some, and asked the artists to refine others. The drafts went through several more rounds. The council studied not only the symbol design but the words that went with it. Council members were unanimous on the design that they ultimately chose. Elements of the design include the cup, cross, and covenant. The wine that is filling the cup is both flowing in, representing God's Spirit infused into the Community, and flowing out to the world. It shows movement, because "Missionaries are not statues," as St. Gaspar said.

"This process has allowed us once again to talk about who we are and how to present that to the world," said Fr. Jeffrey Kirch, C.PP.S., provincial director. "I appreciate the input of the council and of those four Missionaries who talked so vividly about their vocation and the identity of the Congregation that we all love. The new symbol was born out of all of that. I hope we can embrace it."
