SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to nonemergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

Most of us are preparing with joy and happiness for the birth of Christ. And some of us may be experiencing griefs and sorrow during this Advent season. That makes lived faith a hard struggle. And yet we can agree that theoretically at least, that we should, for love of God, count such a struggle as nothing? It is our share in the suffering of Christ, and in the end, it will be as nothing, because Christ will call us beyond all struggles to endless joy with him. God loves each and every one of us unconditionally. At the last supper, Jesus said, "As the Father loves Me, so I also love you." And through this unending faith in God's love that we can really appreciate the mystery of Christmas. Today's three readings present us with the 3 stages of the Messiah: In the first reading, he is still promised. In the Gospel, he is conceived in Mary's womb. And in the reading from Paul, his power goes out to the world. King David wanted to build God a house, or temple. Instead, God built David an eternal house, in the sense of a dynasty. The Jews understood this well as meaning that the Messiah was to be a descendent of David. In the Gospel reading a thousand years later, the promise is fulfilled. A mighty Archangel appears at Mary's home to tell her not to be afraid and that she will bear a son through the power of the Holy Spirit. And Mary, with reverent and obedient love, yields herself to God's plan. In all three readings the Messiah is revealed in the family. First, there is David's family then Mary's family and finally there is the family of the Church, which carries Him to the whole human race. Where love is, there is God; and God knows that where you have the deepest love, you also have the deepest sorrows. Don't let missing love in the home deter you whether you are a husband, a wife, a son, or a daughter. Where you don't find love, put love, and you will find Christ as never before. We also find Jesus in His family at Church. Here at mass, we're immersed in His mystery and presence. We pray that the Holy Spirit, who

sanctified our Mother Mary, may also sanctify our gifts. We are really praying that here and now the Church may bring forth Christ in the Eucharist as Mary brought Him forth in Bethlehem. The great and hidden mystery of Jesus Christ our Savior is flashing out all around us, if we have the eyes of faith to see it, and the heart of love to embrace it. I pray that all of you have a wonderful and Christ-like

Christmas. God bless all.

All coaches and high school players are to spend one hour in Adoration on Eucharistic Day. If you miss, we kindly ask that you sit out one game. CATECHISM CORNER

4TH WEEK OF ADVENT

I know Jesus was born in a manger, but why is that important and what does it mean?

When the child Jesus was born, his mother Mary laid him in a manger (Lk 2:7). The word "manger" comes from the Latin word *manducare* which means "to eat." A manger or crib is a wooden or stone feeding trough or food box that holds hav for larger farm animals like cattle, horses, and donkeys. Mangers were located wherever livestock were kept, places like stables, corrals, or caves. Farmers were sure to keep their mangers well-supplied with fodder at all times so the animals would never go hungry. The cattle can walk up to a manger at any time, and then spend long, leisure hours chomping away, chewing and slowly re-chewing their cud. When Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem there was no room for them at the inn, so they were forced to find lodging elsewhere, probably in a cave where animals were staying. When Jesus was born. Mary would not have wanted to lay her infant on the hard. cold, stone floor. Instead, she had to make due with what was available and the manger proved to be a convenient alternative: the hay was soft, the box was up and off the ground, and the sides tall enough to keep her child safely inside. Once laid there, an angel told the shepherds that they would find their newborn Messiah and Lord "lying in a manger" (Lk 2:12). They went in haste and found the child in the feeding trough and they feasted their eyes on him (Lk 2:16). Jesus was not laid in a manger by accident. It is a major spiritual symbol. Animals go to the manger for physical food, but with Jesus lying on the hay, we can go to the manger for spiritual food. Jesus has an infinite storehouse of nourishment available, and we can approach him any time and never go hungry. Jesus feeds us with Word and Sacrament, his gospel and the Eucharist. Jesus wants us to devour his word (Jer 15:16; Ez 3:1; Rev 10:9 -10), chew on it, slowly ruminate on its meaning, swallow and digest it, and make it part of the fabric of our being. Jesus' Word is like no other food, it has the power to save our souls (Jas 1:21). Not only that, the infant in the feeding trough is the Bread of Life (Jn 6:35), the true bread come down from heaven, and whoever eats this bread will live forever (Jn 6:51). If a person wants to be spiritually well-fed, it is important to read Scripture and receive the Eucharist often. The manger is a momentous sign that Jesus is sustenance for us. The shepherds feasted first. Now it is our turn. Jesus born on the first Christmas is food for our souls. Taken from the Archdiocese of St. Paul &

The last advent wreath candle is referred to as the "Angel's Candle" as we reflect on the good news of God's love brought to us from the angel Gabriel. During this final week of Advent may we rejoice in the endless love that God has for us, and like Mary, may we reciprocate that love by responding, "I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

Advent Wreath Prayer for Fourth Week: Dear Jesus, may the light of your love always shine in our hearts. As Christmas draws closer, we marvel at your great love for us. Let your love transform every aspect of our lives and touch everyone we encounter. Our hearts are open to you, Jesus. Amen.





Fourth Sunday of Advent: Peace that Surpasses Understanding



THE GRACE I SEEK: to allow the peace of Christ to reign in my heart

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze. Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to abandon myself completely to you so that your will may be done in and through me, that I may share in your peace.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

"I will fix a place for my people Israel; I will plant them so that they may dwell in their place... I will give you rest from all your enemies." (2 Samuel 7:10)

FOR REFLECTION — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

How is God inviting me to build a house, a tabernacle, for his Son in my heart so that he can find peace and rest within me and convey his peace, through me, to many hearts?

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you in a personal way through this passage.

"Mary said, 'Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." (Luke 1:38)

FOR REFLECTION —Contemplating the "fiat" of Our Lady that made the Incarnation and our salvation possible, ask Our Lord for the grace to have a simple, humble, and receptive heart like Mary. Ask him to stir up a desire for your heart to be totally open to welcome the Word—Jesus—with faith and trust, repeating with Mary this humble "fiat" that is the pathway to experiencing God's peace, which surpasses our understanding.

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

CLOSING PRAYER — Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Fourth Sunday of Advent)

SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION — At the conclusion of this Advent season, we give thanks for the peace we have received by taking refuge in the hearts of Jesus and Mary. Pray that you can always allow the Word to become flesh in you. Offer your desire that Jesus would find a beautiful, simple, and safe manger in your heart where he can abide with you.

LOVE IN ACTION — Mother Teresa famously said, "Peace begins at home." Identify one concrete action you can take this week to allow the peace of Christ to be at the heart of your home.
