

START A NEW HABIT - SPEND TIME WITH GOD'S WORDS

CHRISTMAS MIDNIGHT MASS - LECTIO DIVINA – DIVINE PRAYER

Lectio divina is a method of praying the Scriptures. What better way to get to know God than by spending time with God's spoken word?

The practice of *lectio divina* traces its roots back to the early centuries in the Church. By the sixth century, [St. Benedict](#) had made it a regular practice in most monasteries. Today *lectio divina* is a widely held practice by many laymen and laywomen.

Lectio divina is a slow, rhythmic reading and praying of a Scripture passage. You pick a passage and read it. Notice what arises within you as you read it. Then you read it again, and then again, noticing what words and phrases grab your heart and noticing the feelings that arise. You respond to God about whatever is stirring within as you read and pray with the passage. Finally, you rest and let God respond and speak to you.

Let's consider the formal steps. To begin, you might open with a short prayer, (see Holy Spirit Prayer below). Ask God to guide your prayer time. Try to silence your mind and put off the cares of the day. You could make an act of Faith, Hope, and Charity. Simply; Lord I believe in You help my unbelief, Lord I Hope in You increase my Trust in You, Lord I Love You show me how to love You more. Then do the following:

Read.

Slowly and thoughtfully, read the Scripture passage the first time.

Did a word or phrase capture your attention and grab your heart? Linger with it whenever this happens.

Reflect.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. What is God saying to you in this passage? offering you? asking you? What feelings are arising within you?

Respond.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. Respond to God from your heart. Speak to God of your feelings and insights. Offer these to God.

Rest.

Possibly read the passage another time. Sit quietly in God's presence, asking, "What are you saying to me?" Rest in God's love and listen.

Concrete resolution.

What is God calling you to do with what He has said to you. Practice a virtue like generosity, apologize to someone, do a kind act for someone who may have come to mind during your prayer time etc. As you end your prayer period, you might close with an Our Father or

another short prayer. It might be helpful to jot down in a journal what arose during this time. What did you say to God, and what did God offer you?

Come Holy Spirit Prayer:

Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful, enkindle in us the fire of your love, send forth your Spirit and we shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth

O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit, help us to know what is truly right and always rejoice in his consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

Gospel

Lk 2:1-14

Mass during the night

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be enrolled, each to his own town. And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Now there were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock. The angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were struck with great fear. The angel said to them, “Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.” And suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: “Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests.”

I would like to wish you and your family a Merry Christmas. As we celebrate the gift of the Christ child being born to us this Christmas. I pray that you would not only celebrate the birth of Christ but at some point, you will have an intimate, heart-touching experience of Christ this Christmas.

A memory of Christmas that I have growing up is when we would gather at grandma's house to celebrate Christmas. Just before we would open gifts, several of my cousins around my and I would get dressed up as magi, shepherds, angels, Joseph, and Mary. Often the costumes that we wore were either blankets, bath robes, or graduation robes. Then we would reenact the story of Jesus birth. It was fun in my younger years and then as I got to my older and when some older cousins lead the play some rebellion got mixed in, like changing the words on a Christmas Carol. Some where there are pictures and video of this play being performed. My grandma was always supportive of what her grandchildren going to sporting events they participated, and I think she particularly liked going events of the fine arts plays and concerts that her grandchildren participated. So, I think watching us perform this played delighted her for this reason. But the real reason why I think grandma wanted us to perform this play. reason that we celebrate Christmas and not all the other gifts and stuff that comes with the season. She did not want her grandchildren to get all caught up in the business of Christmas. Parents, grandparents, and Catechist are quick at reminding/teaching children of the importance of Christmas. But you know I think adults also need to be reminded of this lesson. Like children, adults can also get wrapped up in the business of this season. Cleaning up the house, buying gifts for loved ones, preparing special treats, decorating, and even getting ready to entertain special guests. None of these activities by themselves are bad but sometimes they over consume our time and energy that we can lose sight of what is most important. Sometimes these activities can so consume us that we can lose sight of what Christmas is about that it can lead us to resenting this season. So, how can we prevent this?

Yes, we called to participate in the activities of Christmas, but I think we are called to participate in through a special lens. This lens is simple we are called to live in the moment of Christmas. We called to live in the moment of Christ being born to us in the manger. I think this is part of the reason we come to church. We are called to live in moment entertaining and being with family and friends. We are called live in the moment of giving and receiving gifts. Christmas is a special moment and if we do not pay attention, we can miss those special moment. And these special moments come only once a year and some of these moments come once in a lifetime. As we celebrate the birth of Jesus, let us pay attention to all those special moments.

Children, I think at Christmas have gift for seeing those special moments. How appropriate because today we celebrate Christ being born to us as a child, as a baby. In the scriptures Jesus calls for us to be child-like. We are all children of God, as children of God may we catch the special moment of our God born to us, may we catch all the special moments of this season.

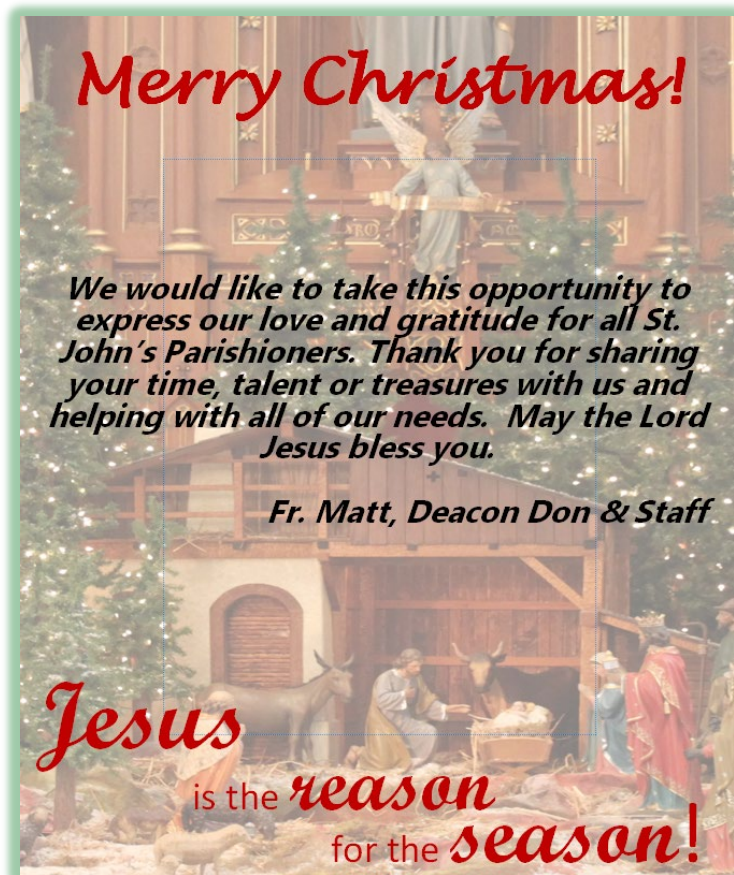
