

FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

We are just finishing up the story of the birth of Jesus to Mary and Joseph and then we read in today's Gospel about their flight to Egypt. Astrologers arrive from the east to worship Jesus and bring Him gifts then God speaks to Joseph, through an angel in a dream. Joseph is ordered to take his family to Egypt because of the life of his child was in danger. Joseph leaves in the middle of the night with his family for the 5–6-day journey through a desert. They come to this unknown country and wait and live there until Joseph receives a message to return back to Judea. Joseph settles in the town of Nazareth to avoid any political problems with the Romans around Jerusalem. Joseph gets the orders from God, carries them out, and then returns to Nazareth. Joseph holds the largest place in the story but not the most important one. The one who gives the orders and is the source of it all is God. And the one for all things that are ordered is Jesus. Joseph is serving his family and as far as Mary and Jesus is concerned, logic requires them to obey him strictly. He is the intermediary between God and his family. Such is the relationship of this family and the Church is presenting to us here as a model for all societal life. But in order to be role models in this societal life, one has to practice the virtues that St. Paul talks about in the 2nd reading. We are to show kindness, humility, meekness, patience, and to forgive one another. Above all, we are to practice love which binds all the virtues together. These are what the modern-day families need to practice to emulate what our Holy Family showed to us. We should look into our lives this Christmas season to see if there are ways to increase these virtues and to practice forgiveness to ones that we hold a grudge with. Let us open our minds and hearts to allow the infant Jesus to work in our everyday encounters with societal life. Let us be submissive like

Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

Catechism Corner

THE INCARNATION OF CHRIST

In the Nicene Creed, we answer by confessing: "For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit, he became **incarnate** of the Virgin Mary, and **was made man**." (CCC 456) The "Incarnation" of Christ is when God was born and took on human form. The Catechism #457 tells us the reason for this is, "in order to save us by reconciling us with God, who "loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins", "the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world", and "he was revealed to take away sins".

The Church teaches Jesus was born of a Virgin by the power of the Holy Spirit. He had no biological human father and the conception took place in the power of the Holy Spirit. Both the Gospels of Luke and Matthew attest to this. "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" (Luke 1:34) Throughout the Bible there are many cases in which sterility in which God intervenes in a woman's old age and she conceives a child: Sarah, mother of Isaac; Hannah, mother of Samuel, Elizabeth, mother of John the Baptist. This demonstrates God's power of salvation and redemption in impossible situations.

However, Mary was not sterile. She was fertile. She conceived not through normal human interaction, but through the power of the Holy Spirit. It's a proclamation about the power of God. There are two great contradictions in the gospel that begin and end the Jesus story: 1- The virginal conception "How did he get there?" and 2- The empty tomb "How did he leave?" Both demonstrate the inability of human beings to save themselves. Human beings cannot create a savior nor can they raise themselves from the dead. The Incarnation is the most significant event in salvation history for without it, there would be

no Jesus, no sacred mission, no life, no passion, no death, no ascension to the Father, no sending of the Holy Spirit, no sanctification of humans, and no personal intimate relationship with God. Without the incarnation, humans would never have been elevated to the status of divine beings in heaven. The Incarnation speaks of great love of God. He did not have to become as one of His Creation, yet He did. And He came in a way that was not intimidating or demeaning. He came as a poor, humble baby. People draw a baby close to their hearts when they hold them. Jesus came as a human because He wants us to *know* Him. He prepared for His Incarnation from the beginning of salvation history. For thousands of years, He prepared to show His face to us. This is such a profound moment in history that time itself changed! The moment Christ was incarnate, time changed from BC to AD and all of civilization goes according to this time: the 2025th year of our Lord.

In Jesus' Incarnation, we welcome God as man on Christmas morning and celebrate His Incarnation all throughout the Christmas Season ending on the Epiphany, January 4, 2026. This Christmas Season, come near and bring baby Jesus close to your heart. Behold the newborn King!





CYO student eligibility for St. John the Baptist, Glandorf

St. John the Baptist, Glandorf requirements:

All students must be enrolled in high school CCD before the first class for the beginning of school year to play. Students are expected to attend both the Fall and Winter Semesters of High School Religious Education (CCD) classes. Attendance at these classes will be monitored and reviewed.

For each class missed beyond 3 classes the player will sit out one game per absence. Attendance resets at the end of the team's season for each respective sport.
