

SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Today we remember the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. I must admit that it is a little strange and ironic that on Wednesday we celebrated the birth of Jesus, now today in scriptures today he twelve years old already.

We celebrate today the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph as being holy. We see them as being holy and we think this family is a model for our own families to follow. At the same time, I would imagine that many us are uncomfortable with labeling, calling or seeing our family as being holy. I love my family, and I think my family is good for the most part, but I would not go so far as to call or see my family as holy. But if the Holy Family is holy and they are model for our families to follow, I think it is certainly possible for our families also to be holy.

After I baptize a child, I present a prayer card to the parents of that child. A Parents' Vocations Prayer Card for parents to pray for the vocation of their children. On the backside of the card is a picture of a family praying in their family prayer space in their home. And it is a picture not from a long time ago but is a picture of a modern family. Actually I know this family that is pictured on the card, I baptized one of their children she is not in the picture and their oldest child I gave her, her First Communion. This family was my parishioners when I was in Dayton and now, they are Fr. Tony's parishioners. Our former Vocations Director Fr. Steve Dos Santos, C.PP.S. was friends with this family and asked if he could take their family picture for this card and they agreed. I remember when these cards just got printed but before they got disturbed. I got invited over to the family home for dinner on Friday Evening. Normally on Friday evenings Fr. Steve and I would go to eat. On particular Friday, I told Fr. Steve, I was not available to go out to dinner and why. Fr. Steve said "these cards why don't you take one to the family to show them". When I arrived at the family's home, I showed them the prayer card and the dad he embarrassingly smiled at me and said 'we are really not holy'. If many of our families appeared on cards like this, I think many of us would say the same thing about our families 'we are really not holy'.

I think the issue is not that our families are not holy, but I think we misunderstand what it means to be holy. We often associate holiness with being perfect and problem free. You could say that the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph was practically perfect I mean two of the three members never sinned. But they had their share of obstacles before Mary and Joseph were living together Mary was expecting, there was no room for them at the Inn and Mary gave birth to Jesus in stable, in

our scriptures today Mary and Joseph had Jesus lost for three days. Our families are full of sinners and all our families have problems.

Being sin and problem free is not what makes our families holy. What makes our families holy is in how we live in relationship with one another. Paul in our scriptures today gives us recipe to what makes our families holy "Put on as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another; if one has a grievance against another; as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection" (Colossians 3:12-14). When we live our family lives like this that they are holy, it may not always feel like but it is a witness of faith, that makes us holy.

AROUND THE PARISH

CATECHISM CORNER

Each week at Holy Mass we profess our belief in reciting the Nicene Creed. What does it mean when we say we believe in these statements/truths? We will take a look at each statement/truth of the creed and examine it's meaning through the use of the Faith and Life Series by Ignatius Press that is utilized in our parish religious education morning program, 5th Grade curriculum. "I believe in one, holy catholic and apostolic church..."

Since Jesus died on the cross for us, what else needs to be done? Doesn't Jesus' Crucifixion mean that everyone is going to heaven? No. When Jesus ascended into heaven, although he had redeemed all of mankind (opened the gates of heaven), he has not completed his mission of the salvation of mankind. In other words, the gates of heaven are open for us, our hope has been restored, but each of us must still be sanctified in order to enter heaven.

This is where the power of the Holy Spirit enters. In this way, Jesus continues his mission through the Church. It is this one true Church that we can be sanctified through the Sacraments. We cannot do it alone. We simply do not have the capacity to be holy on our own. If we think we can, we are prideful.

We can receive the necessary graces to become holy through the sacramental life of the Church. The Church is an incredible gift that we must treasure. We have been given this gift to have been baptized as Catholics in the one true Church of Jesus Christ.

Jesus founded the Church. He called and taught the Apostles during his ministry on earth. He gave his Apostles instruction so they could continue his mission in the world, and he gave them the power to do his work. At the Last Supper, he instituted the Sacrament of Holy Orders and gave his Apostles the power to consecrate the Holy Eucharist. After his Resurrection, he gave them the power to forgive sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Catholic Church consists of the community of believers united by Christ. The Church can be everywhere, and every parish has the same Sacraments and beliefs as Catholics everywhere. The Church is known as the Mystical Body of Christ. Christ is the head of the Body, the Holy Spirit is the soul, and the members of the body are all baptized persons.

The Mystical Body of Christ is the Communion of Saints, united with Jesus as their head. The Communion of Saints consists of "The Church Triumphant", these are the saints in heaven. These saints can pray for us to grow in holiness, and they can intercede on behalf of the souls in purgatory. "The Church Suffering", these are the holy souls in purgatory. These souls cannot pray for themselves, but they can ask prayers of those in heaven, and pray for us here on earth. Lastly, "The Church Militant" are Christ's people on earth. We on earth can ask the help of the saints in heaven and the souls in purgatory, and can help the souls in purgatory by praying and offering penances for them.

<u>Reflection:</u> How might people see that the Holy Spirit is in you? What is your role right now in the Body of Christ? How well are you carrying out that role? How can you do it better?

<u>Prayer:</u> God, we thank you for sending your Spirit to guide us, and we ask that his gifts may be ever more active in our daily lives. Help us to be faithful members of your Mystical Body, that we may someday join the saints in the Church


