### SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion. If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and 2 snow emergencies, come if you can get here safely. If Ottawa-Glandorf Schools cancel youth activities, St. John's youth activites will also be cancelled.

# **7** FROM THE DESK OF FR. MATT

"Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him." (Sirach 15:17). Given the choice between life or death, given the choice between good or evil I venture guess that a strong majority of people will choose life and good over death and evil. Our human nature is to choose good over what is bad, by our human nature I do not think that we would ever intentionally choose something bad or evil. But sometimes I think unintentionally we choose the death over life, we choose evil over good.

Our scriptures today remind me of warning labels. Particularly warning labels that would seem to be common sense like the lid on a coffee cup tells you that the liquid is hot or on the deck of your lawn mower telling you not to put your hands or feet under it while the blades are moving. Foot warmers tell you that you should not use them with bare foot. None of these warning labels would seem to be necessary but they are there why? Well, they say for every warning label out someone got hurt because the label was not there.

Again, our scriptures today are a continuation of the Sermon on the Mount. Today Jesus tells us that he is not about abolishing the law or the prophets but fulfilling their message. Jesus speaks to about not killing, not committing adultery, and about not taking a false oath. Under most circumstances I do not think any of us would do any of these things. But as Jesus points out we may not actually do these things, but we can do these things mentally.

Like in how we look at another person sometimes we can be committing adultery with that person in our minds. We are called to see each other as sons and daughters of God, anytime we see each other through lustful desire we are taking the dignity as a child of God away from that person and as Jesus tells us committing adultery. Or think of the last time that you got into a heated argument with someone. What did you say in the argument? Did you say anything that you wish you could take back now? Or how did you leave the argument? So often we can leave these arguments wishing harm for the one we had the disagreement with. Or we might leave never wanting to see or have anything do with this person again. In these cases, we may not be physically killing or harming these individuals but in a certain sense we are killing the relationship not wanting the good for the person we consider to be other. While these may be our thoughts and our feeling, our thoughts and our feelings can also have influence on the actions of our lives.

Warning signs are all around us. Some of these signs would seem to not be necessary, you think we would know the potential harm that could come if we are not careful. Our brains and our minds have the capability of doing great damage and there seems to be no warning sign on our mind or brain. And if we are not careful with what our brain and mind is doing, we can be led into choosing evil and death. While we may not always have control of what we think and feel, we need the Lord's help. The Lord to help us to be in control of ourselves so that we do not unintentionally choose evil and death over good and life.
