SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and 2 snow emergencies, come if you can get here safely. If Ottawa-Glandorf Schools cancel youth activities, St. John's youth activites will also be cancelled.

2 FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

A memory of Lent that I have growing up is when I was late elementary-middle school age my parents took me to see what I called at the time a 'Jesus Play' in Ft. Wayne. That was probably the first time that I ever heard the story of Jesus from beginning of his public ministry of working miracles and teaching. I remember during the multiplication of loaves scene; they passed around bread for the audience to eat. The play obviously led up to Jesus's crucifixion, resurrection, and accession where Jesus was lifted up into the ceiling on ropes of some sort.

One scene from the play that stands out in my mind is this scene that we hear in our scriptures today were Jesus got temped by Satan. I remember in this scene Satan appeared the way you expected him to dress in a dark black robe, face painted red with black streaks, and a pitchfork in hand. Satan when he tempted Jesus during this scene it was scary. Even at the end of the play when audience customarily greets the cast, no body really gave any attention to the actor that played the role Satan, I think it was because he looked that scary.

Nearly twenty-five years later, this scene has left its lasting mark on my mind, and I have often thought that if Satan always appeared that scary like he did in that play no one would ever sin. I mean why would you ever give into something that is scary except maybe for the thrill like in the fall when you go to a Haunted House. But I do not know what thrill there is in sin. If I have this thought, I think Satan would also know this and Satan is a fierce competitor and is not going to give up easily. Satan is going to disguise himself, to try and make himself not look so scary, to try and trick us so that we sin. Not only is Satan going to do this, but Satan also has a history of doing this. We have evidence of this happening in our scriptures today in the Garden. Now our scriptures today tell us nothing about what the serpent looked like. But we know what the serpent said to the woman "'You certainly will not die! No, God knows well that the moment you eat of it you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil" (Genesis 3:4-5). Serpent used words to trick the woman. The rest is history from there the woman takes fruit from the tree gives some to husband and they both eat it. This is the first-time human beings were tricked into going against God's instruction, fell into Satan's trap, but not the last time. The scriptures are filled with countless examples of people falling into Satan's trap of sin, not following God's instruction. Not only are the scriptures filled with examples, but our world is also filled with examples people falling into the temptation of sin, not following God's instruction down to that person that we look at in the mirror. We have all fallen into Satan's trap of sin, we are all sinners, we have all disobeyed God. But we also have a God that acquits, forgives us of our sin, a God who does not wants us to stay in our sin.

Lent is a time for us to reflect on those traps that Satan set for us that we have fallen into, a time reflect on where we are not following our God's instruction, and with the help of the Lord to get out of those traps. But it is also a time for us to become more aware of God's instruction and we can better follow that instruction. Lent is about preparing for baptism where at Easter we anticipate celebrating Christ risen from the dead. Where our Catechumens anticipate being washed clean of sin and us who are members renewing our baptismal promises. Reminding ourselves that Christ has come to save us from our sin.

- 1. Handicap Driveway finished final cost of \$68,000. 9 spots added.
- Auto locks for doors-Got a quote from Northwest Security to add auto locks on doors of church, doors on the parish center, and one door on the rectory. Quote was for \$103,404. Motion was approved to move forward with the project by Carl Siefker and Kim Ansley.
- Choir Loft Project-Still looking at options for second entry way to choir loft. Decided to move the door to the top of the stairs in existing stairway and place a decretive rope at the bottom to restrict entry. Looking at adding lights to stairs to make stairs safer.
- 4. New business-Discussed how we could improve St. Bonifest. Looking for new ideas.

If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident-leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call.

Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.
