From the Desk of Fr. Matt Happy New Year! Today we begin a new calendar year. As a church we began a new year a little over a month ago. Today as a church we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. As we celebrate Mary today, our scriptures today take us once again to that manager scene we hear of the shepherds coming to the manger scene. Jesus was born in a barn among animals a donkey, a cow, shepherds possibly came with sheep, and there may have been

other animals as well. I often wonder how Mary would have reacted to all the animals and people that came to visit? We often picture this scene as being one of no noise but of wonder and awe. Mary as having little to no reaction to any of her surroundings. But if we did a reality check to this scene things would probably look a little different. Mary probably would have been a little cautious not wanting any animal to come too close. Could you picture Mary's response if a cow licked baby Jesus's head? Or the shepherds when they came, they would have smelt like the sheep they cared for. Some may call it the smell of money, but a mother of a newborn would say it is an unclean smell, a sent that should not come near her baby. Could you imagine the noise the animals made in the barn. To say that none of these things never happened or that Mary had no

response I do not think would be true or normal. Mary may be the mother of God, this may not be normal, but I like to think that Mary would have some characteristics of a normal mother. The scriptures do say much about how Mary responded other then she had a pondering heart, she "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Luke 2:19).

As we say good-bye to 2022 and say hello to 2023 like Mary we also have pondering, reflecting hearts. Mary reflected and pondered on what the shepherds told her about her baby Jesus. We might also reflect and ponder on what the shepherds say about Jesus. This is how we grow in our faith. But you know the focus of my and perhaps also your pondering and reflecting today is more what has happened in 2022 some world and national events but mostly personal events, reflecting upon all that has happened my life in 2022 the good and the joyful as well as the sad, the challenging, and not so good. I think about all the ways in which God was at work in my life and all the ways that God used me as his instrument. Lastly, I reflect and ponder in my heart in hope for what will happen in 2023 for myself but also for our world. I think about how all those ways that God will be at work in our world, how God might work through my life in the year ahead, and how God might choose to use me a his instrument in 2023. Mary has a reflecting, pondering heart. In our journey of faith, we are called to follow the example of our mother and have that same pondering and reflecting heart.

We are called to follow Mary's example but as we begin this new year, I think we also ask Mary to pray for us as we begin this new year. As we begin this new year may Mary be praying for us and most importantly may Aaron's words of blessing be our blessing as we begin this new year "The LORD blesses you and keep you! The LORD let his face shine upon you and be gracious to you! The LORD looks upon you kindly and give you peace" (Numbers 6:24-26).



They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident-leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call.

Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocesan Private Victim's Coordinator at 419-214-4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information.
