Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and with today's feast the Church officially draws the Christmas Season to a close. After Mass today the manger scene, the Christmas trees, the wreathes, lights, and the various other Christmas decorations go back into storage. Along with decorations going back into storage our lives return to reality, our lives go back to 'normal'. A matter of fact this past week we had that taste of reality/normal there was no holiday in the middle of the week that gave us extra days off work and/or school. This past week was a regular 5-day work/school week. My grandmother liked Christmas and she did not like to see the Christmas Season end. Grandma did not like it when the Christmas Decorations got put away. But I will be honest, I do not think it was the Christmas Decorations that got put away that she did not like, but I think it was the unintentional thing that can seem to get put away with Christmas decorations that she did not like. What is the unintentional thing that I am referring to?

In my Christmas Homily I spoke about giving gifts but also about receiving gifts. And pointed out that the most important gift for us to receive was the baby Jesus. During my Christmas homily someone received a little baby Jesus statue, but I also pointed out that there are other ways to receive this gift than just receiving a little statue. While I think most would agree on the importance of receiving this gift, I think the other important question to answer is why is it so important to receive this gift? When we receive the gift of the baby Jesus, we might be receiving an object but more importantly we receive an important message. And that message is the voice that is heard after Jesus was baptized "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). When we receive the gift of Jesus, when we receive this true gift, this is the message that you hear, you are God's beloved child, and God is pleased with you. And when you hear and experience this message it gives you a warm fuzzy feeling on the inside, it gives you peace. When you experience this gift, it helps you feel valued and needed among other good things that it does for us. As you have journeyed in this Christmas Season, I think many of you have experienced this gift. While you may experience this gift, especially in this Christmas Season, it is really a gift that you are meant to experience throughout the year. However, sometimes as we put Christmas Decorations away, sometimes this gift, this thing, this message can unintentionally get put away. And when this gift is put away, that warm-fuzzy feeling and peace and value can seem to go away. And if this gift gets put away, if these feelings go away, it can leave us feeling depressed and sad.

Today as the Christmas Decorations go back into storage, may we remember to keep the gift of Jesus out. May we each day take to share this gift with someone to remind them that they are God's beloved child and that God is well pleased with them. For as you share this gift with another person that gift will get returned to you.



SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT

All suspected or actual acts of physical or sexual child abuse, or neglect, must be reported to the Putnam County Job and Family Services by calling 567-376-3777. Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday- Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident--leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call. Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.

INITIATION OF ADULTS INTO THE CATHOLIC FAITH (RCIA/OCIA)

Is a journey through which interested adults and older children are welcomed and gradually introduced to the Roman Catholic Faith, Sacraments, Worship and way of life. In response to their inquiries, these people are properly instructed so that you can discern (through reflection and prayer) whether you are indeed called to Catholicism. Catechism Corner*Meaning of Jesus' Baptism*

In today's Gospel, Jesus is baptized by John the Baptist. This fulfills Isaiah's prophesy in the first reading where it was announced, "my chosen one with whom I am pleased". In the Gospel, God the Father announces, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

The effect of the Sacrament of baptism is to remove Original Sin and restore souls to right relationship with Christ. Why then, is Jesus submitting to baptism if he is sinless and does not need to be restored to right relationship with Christ, as He *is* Christ?

The Catechism number 1224, tells us "Our Lord voluntarily submitted himself to the baptism of St. John, intended for sinners, in order to "fulfill all righteousness."

He does this, then, to restore *us* to righteousness and show us that baptism is necessary for this restoration. We are not only restored to Christ, the Son, but to the entirety of the Trinity, as the Gospel reveals the Trinity in its fullness at Jesus' baptism. We see Christ present and announced as the Son by the voice of the Father coming from Heaven, and finally a dove, the Holy Spirit, coming down on Jesus.

Jesus' baptism was His first public ministry. "Jesus' public life begins with his baptism by John in the Jordan," (CCC, 535) and "The baptism of Jesus is on his part the acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's suffering Servant... Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all mankind. At his baptism, "the heavens were opened" - the heavens that Adam's sin had closed – and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Spirit, a prelude to the new creation." (CCC, 536)

Jesus was an example to us. He *is* the source of all grace, the manifestation of holiness that we are all called to and created for. Through His Incarnation, Jesus came to show us 'the way' to righteousness, to holiness, to walk in the Kingdom. HIS way is THE way.

Jesus began his ministry to open the gates of heaven through baptism. He shows us the way to enter through those gates is through baptism. Jesus' own words testify to this when He tells Nicodemus in John 3:5, ""Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit."

Jesus' baptism was not for Him. It was for us, as it manifested He is God, sent to redeem us. He shows us the importance of baptism, as it was the entry to His public mission. He is our example of holiness and He shows us the way. The Sacrament of Baptism was established by Jesus for His Church, for us, to impart His saving grace onto all people that we may enter through the gates of eternal glory with Him.

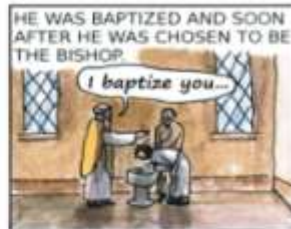

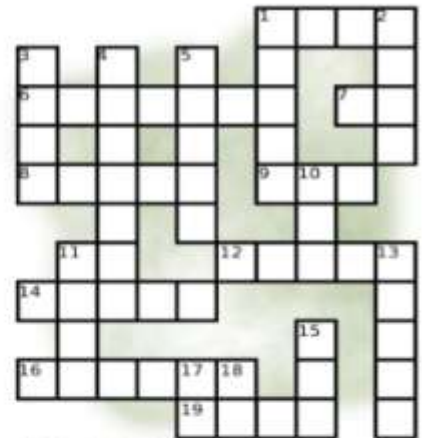
