SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Merry Christmas, for the last time for this season, as today we draw the Christmas Season to a close as we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of Lord. Today the manger scene, the Christmas trees, the lights, and the other Christmas decorations go back into their place of storage until next Christmas. Tomorrow, we will begin Ordinary time, and in a certain sense the church is a little behind in transitioning to the ordinary. This past week most of our lives have transitioned back to the ordinary. After two weeks in a row of holidays in the middle of the week and days off work and school and parties or festive gatherings of people. This past week there were no holidays, no days off work and school (at least not planned, aka not counting snow days) it was a full five days (or at least supposed to be), and no parties or festive gatherings of people. This was a week of back to the normal, back to the grind. And I think this transition back to the normal, back to the ordinary, back to the grind at the end of this Christmas Season can leave us feeling a little disappointed, depressed, or challenged. What has brought us joy in this season has reached its completion.

We appropriately put away statues, trees, lights, wreathes, etc. at the end of this season. But as we do, there is one decoration that can accidentally end up in storage that is not supposed to end up in storage. As a matter of fact this decoration is supposed to stay out all year. For it is when the decoration gets put away it contributes to our negative emotions but if it stays out then we might understand what Christmas is about. And that decoration would be the message of Christmas.

As we have been celebrating the child Jesus born in the stable of Bethlehem, as we have heard the visits of shepherd and magi. Our God has been very subtly communicating a message to us and at the end of this Christmas Season we hear that message very clearly after Jesus was baptized "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22). Each one of us is a beloved son or daughter of God. And not only are we a beloved child of God, but God is well pleased with each one of us. In this Christmas Season we have experienced this gift of being beloved Child of God as we have received gifts, cards and greetings, shared the company of family and friends, and shared in special moments together. We have let others know they are a beloved child of God by giving gifts, sending

cards, and reaching out to others in various ways. Helping them to feel special, sharing with them special moments. As we draw this Christmas Season to a close it is easy for this decoration of the beloved child of God to get put away. But this gift of a beloved Child of God is meant to stay out all year. As we journey throughout the year, we called to reached out to and reach each other to remind each other that we are beloved children of God. As the Christmas Season draws to a close today, who are you being called to reach out to, to remind them that they are a beloved Child of God, and that God is well pleased with them?

As we look around at the thousands of Christian denominations in the world, how can we know for sure that the Catholic Faith is the one faith founded by Christ with the on truth of Jesus Christ? We can know this the Church through her "marks", which identify her.

The four marks of the Church are named in the Creed. "I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church." These four marks are important for us. They reveal that we have the true Church.

The Church is One

We were founded by Jesus Christ with one set of truths that do not change. We have one visible leader, the Pope.

Jesus gave one sacrifice for salvation.

We are one in the celebration of the Sacraments for our salvation.

Catholics all believe one set of doctrines, one Faith.

We are united in the Mystical Body and through the Holy Spirit.

The Church is Holy

Jesus Christ, her head, and the Holy Spirit, her soul, are holy. Her Scripture, Tradition, and doctrine are holy.

Her sacrifice and Sacraments are holy.

Her saints are holy, and her members are called to be holy.

The Church herself is holy, but not all her members (or even leaders) are holy. This is an unfortunate reality of human weakness and sin, and we pray always that all members of the Mystical Body of Christ, as well as all the people in the world, may become holy. Despite the fact that not all members of the Church are holy, we know that the fullness of the means of salvation is found in the Catholic Church, and so we follow her teachings, receive the Sacraments, and grow in holiness through her.

The Church is Catholic

She is universal because she is for everyone in all places until the end of time.

Catholics are part of a community of faith that encompasses all races, cultures, customs, classes, places, languages, etc.

The Church is Apostolic

The Church was founded by Christ upon the Apostles, who continued his work and spread his teachings. The Church is governed by the successors of the Apostles, our bishops, and the legitimate pastors who continue to transmit doctrine and power without interruption or change.

We profess in the Creed that our Church is "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic." These are the four marks of the true Church of Jesus Christ. The fact that she is united, holy, universal, and led by the successors of the Apostles proves that the Catholic Church is who she says she is.




Jesus Begins His Mission

How can you help bring others closer to God?


