Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. We understand today's feast to mean that part in the Nativity Manger Scene when the magi/three kings enter the scene worshiping the baby Jesus and offering gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And in a nutshell, you could say that this is what today's celebration is about. But in doing this we sell today's celebration a little short.

The word epiphany outside of today's celebration, outside of magi/three kings entering the Nativity Scene, we understand it to mean a sudden revelation of knowledge. You might also call it a light bulb experience that suddenly comes to you and changes you. And when we listen to the story of the magi they did more than just enter Nativity Scene to offer their gifts. The magi had an epiphany experience. It began with them looking up at the night sky and discovering a star that indicated a newborn king of the Jews. It is from making this discovery they could have just let it alone lone at that, but they decided to follow the star they wanted to see the newborn king of Jews. So, the magi followed the star, and they probably thought that the star would have led them to a palace. This is probably why they had an audience with Herod. But star ended up leading them to the stable where Jesus was born. It is here they offer their homage to Jesus and give him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. But this is not the end of the magi's epiphany, the end is they did not return to Herod. They returned to their home by a different route; they returned to their home changed by their encounter with Jesus.

Like the magi on the celebration of the Epiphany the light of Christ is meant for us to make our discovery and to get our attention. It from discovery and getting our attention that we choose to follow the light of Christ so that we can see and experience Jesus. And when we follow the light of Christ it can lead us to places, we would least expect. When we encounter Christ, we are sent home by a different route, we are called to live our lives differently. A model of this encountering of Christ is what happens when we come to Mass. We come to Mass because Christ has gotten our attention sometimes it might be the building and other times it might come way by invitation from another person, and still sometimes some other way. Once our attention has been captured, we respond and come to Mass. At we Mass we worship Christ and offer him the gift of our lives. It is after this experience, after Mass, that we are sent back into the world. And because we have had this encounter, we are sent out into the world changed, we are called to return home different, like that magi by a different route. For some this might mean taking a different literal route to get home, but for most of us it is an invitation to live our lives differently because we had this encounter with Christ at Mass.

Like the magi may our encounter with the Lord be an Epiphany moment.



SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion."

If Putnam County is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT

All suspected or actual acts of physical or sexual child abuse, or neglect, must be reported to the Putnam County Job and Family Services by calling 567-376-3777. Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday- Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident--leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call. Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.

INITIATION OF ADULTS INTO THE CATHOLIC FAITH (RCIA/OCIA)

Is a journey through which interested adults and older children are welcomed and gradually introduced to the Roman Catholic Faith, Sacraments, Worship and way of life. In response to their inquiries, these people are properly instructed so that you can discern (through reflection and prayer) whether you are indeed called to Catholicism. Catechism Corner**Epiphany of the Lord**

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, number 528, defines the *Epiphany* as “the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East.” The Epiphany is the feast in which we hear about the arrival of the three wise men, “the magi”. They are representatives of the neighboring pagan religions (CCC 528); they come from all over the world to give homage to the new born King. Their journey shows that “they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations (CCC 528).” This also signifies “pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament (CCC 528).”

Their arrival was foretold in Psalm 72 when it speaks of kings coming from Tarshish bearing gifts to pay homage to the new king. They followed the sign of the North Star that pointed the way to the long-awaited Messiah. This was also foretold in the Book of Numbers, when it referenced the star that would announce the coming of the Messiah. The magi validated the kingship of Jesus by giving them gifts fit for a king: gold, frankincense and myrrh. The magi are a sign that Christ manifested (and still does) himself to people from faraway places. The magi followed the signs foretold of the Messiah. Signs are a means to an end. The sign of the star led to the end: to the Christ child.

The epiphany is more than just a manifestation of God to the gentile world; it is another powerful celebration of the Incarnation and God’s manifestation of himself to the world *in the person of his only Son*. God manifested himself to the poor shepherds and also to the rich kings. Christ’s manifestation to everyone, reveals salvation is for everyone, not just the Israelites, not just the wealthy, not just the high esteemed...but to everyone, even the poor, broken and lost.

Hearts must be open to receive the epiphany that Christ is Lord in order to receive the salvation offered. Ironically, the Scribes and the Pharisees that dismissed Christ as the Messiah are the very people who cited the Scripture passages about him to the kings, and in doing so, led them right to Jesus, yet they didn’t recognize the signs. The kings find the child, are transformed by their encounter and leave by a different route so as not to alert the mad King Herod who knew the signs and also knew that the *fulfillment of prophecy had arrived*. The magi changed their travel directions. In scripture a change of direction signifies a change of heart. The kings had an epiphany in their heart when they encountered the Incarnate Christ.

The Epiphany has a missionary message for all Christians. Just as the magi followed the light of the star and found the Light of Christ, God’s people have been shown the Light. As a result, all Christians are to take that light out to a world darkened by the ravages of sin. We are agents of that Light! We are called daily to bring the Epiphany to the entire world.

Announcement of Easter and the Moveable Feasts

Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year.

Ways to Use Holy Water:

1. Bless your children with it each night by using your thumb to make the Sign of the Cross with holy water on their foreheads.
2. Make the Sign of the Cross on your forehead with it each morning, when leaving the house, when sick or anytime you are in need of God's protection.
3. Bless your house. Your home is the domestic church and is in need of spiritual protection from the devil.
4. Bless your property, lot, and land to keep it set apart for God.
5. Bless your workspace to sanctify your daily work for the glory of God.
6. Bless your car, it is probably the most dangerous place where you spend a lot of time every day to help you stay free of harm.
7. Bless your garden that can bless and sanctify the plants that your family will eat.
8. Bless the sick family members or friends, a corporal work of mercy.
9. Bless your pets, livestock and farm animals because all creation has an end of giving glory to God by bringing nourishment, labor and livelihood to your family.





Mary cooperated with God to bring Jesus into the world so that we could all see and love and worship Him.




