SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: "Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our YouTube page. Level 1 and Level 2 if you can get here safely you are welcome.

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

The Christmas Season keeps moving rather quickly as today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. When I think of the word epiphany outside of the context of today's feast magi bringing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to baby Jesus. I think of the word epiphany as being one of those turn on light bulb moments where suddenly you get a realization of some piece of knowledge. And in a certain sense this is not too far-fetched in what we celebrate, in celebrating the Epiphany of the Lord today. The magi studied the night sky, and in their studying, they discovered a star that signified a newborn king. You could say this was the magi's epiphany end of story. This would be like a young child learning to read, write, add, subtract in school and then coming home from school not practicing anything that was learned outside the classroom. The greatest gift in learning comes when we can do what we have been taught to do. An epiphany is about more than just when the light bulb has been turned. The moment when the light bulb gets turned on and it inspires us to be/do something different some action follows the light bulb being turned on.

The magi made the discovery of a new star that signified the birth of a newborn king, and it is upon making this discovery they wanted to go see the newborn king, they wanted to pay their homage to this newborn king, they wanted to have an encounter with the newborn king, so they followed the star. And I would venture to guess when they began to follow the star, they probably thought that it would lead them to a palace, I mean this is the logical place where you would think to find a newborn king, but it led them to a stable. The completion of the magi's epiphany comes as they return to "their country by another way" (Matthew 2:12).

Like the Magi, the star of Christ, the light of Christ gets our attention and like with magi this starts our epiphany. The star, the light gets our attention, and we follow because

we want to see, we want to encounter, we want to pay our homage to Christ the king. And as we follow at times we can be surprised to were it leads us. We may not get led to a stable, but we get led to other places of surprise. As I follow the star, the light of Christ it has led me to many places of surprise going to school in Chicago and including being pastor here in Glandorf and I know that I will be led to other places of surprise in the future. And because we follow the star, the light of Christ we are invited to live our lives different, we return to our home by a different way.

CATECHISM CORNER

Introduction

The proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable feasts on Epiphany dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter.

Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year.

Each year the proper dates for Ash Wednesday, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and the First Sunday of Advent must be inserted into the text. Those dates are found in the table which is included with the introductory documents of the Roman Missal. The form to be used for announcing each dates is: the date of month, e.g., " the seventh day of April."

On the Epiphany of the Lord, after the singing of the Gospel, a Deacon or cantor, in keeping with an ancient practice of Holy Church, announces from the ambo the moveable feasts of the current year according to the following text. (The musical notation is found in Appendix I of the Roman Missal, Third Edition.)

we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection who is our Savior.

On the 5th day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten Season.

On the 20th day of April you will celebrate with Joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 1st day of June will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the 8th day of June, the feast of Pentecost.

On the 22nd day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the 30th day of November the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ,

to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever.

Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday- Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident--leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call. Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.

Fr. Giovanni Merlini to Be Beatified on January 12, 2025

Missionaries of the Precious Blood Celebrate an Historic Step Toward Sainthood

The Missionaries of the Precious Blood have announced the beatification of Fr. Giovanni Merlini, its third Moderator General, on January 12, 2025, at the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. The occasion marks a significant milestone in recognizing Fr. Merlini's unwavering dedication to faith, service, and the mission of the Church.

Fr. Giovanni Merlini (1795-1873) was a trusted confidant and successor to St. Gaspar del Bufalo, founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Fr. Merlini's devotion to the Blood of Christ was instrumental in strengthening and expanding the congregation's spiritual and apostolic mission throughout Europe and beyond. He served as the spiritual director of St. Maria de Mattias and was instrumental in her founding of the Adorers of the Blood of Christ, who today number over a thousand sisters ministering around the world. His legacy continues to inspire members of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and their lay collaborators worldwide.
