From the Desk of Fr. Matt

I remember taking a class and the teacher for the class did an excellent job teaching the class, I learned a lot. The teacher had us work hard. And at the end of the class the teacher invited us the students to write down on a piece of paper the grade we think we earned. My initial response was to say that I earned an A. I mean who would turn down the chance to say I earned an A? But as I got to thinking about it is great to have the education and the training. It easy to

give the answers back to the teacher that he or she wants to hear. But if I am not able to put into practice what I learned or was trained to do, what good is it, the education and the training can seem to be rather pointless. In our scriptures today a scholar of the law questions Jesus what he must do to inherit eternal life? Jesus responds to him by asking him how understands the law. The scholar of the law responds by saying "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your hearts, with all your being, and with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27). Jesus acknowledges the scholar of the law that his answer

is correct. The scholar of the law then questions Jesus about who is his neighbor? How does this commandment practically apply?

Jesus then tells a story of a man being robed, beaten, and being left half dead. Three people encounter this man a priest, a Levite, and Samaritan. Both the priest and the Levite see the man and ignore him. The Samaritan helps and cares for the man, he poured oil and wine over the wounds, takes him to an inn care for him and pays for his stay. Jesus asks the priest, the Levite, or Samaritan "who was neighbor to the robbers' victim? He answered, 'The one who treated him with mercy'" (Luke 10:36-37). The answer is obvious, the Samaritan was neighbor to the robbers' victim.

The other thing worth noting is that the priest and the Levite had the capability, the training, and the education to help the man. But they did not, and they may have had 'reasonable excuses' it was not convenient to help the man, they did not want to get involved with the man, purity law restrictions. Whatever excuse, they may of had at the end of the day they were not neighbor to this man.

Each one of us has been given the ability, training, and the education on how to be neighbor, how to treat another with mercy. Each day we are given opportunities to be neighbor and treat another with mercy. The question for us then is do we embrace these opportunities to be neighbor and show mercy to each other or do we make excuses for ourselves why we cannot. The Lord gives us endless mercy may, as we receive this gift from the Lord we called to share this gift those who need to experience Christ's mercy. May we treat each other with mercy, me we follow Jesus's instruction to go and do likewise.
