FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Jesus sent "them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits" (Mark 6:7). I think it is fair to say we like to hear this being sent out two by two, a matter of fact I think many of us like to picture ourselves among this group that gets sent out two by two. While we like to picture ourselves in the group that gets sent out, I think we also have a mixture of emotions about being sent out excited and hopeful about having authority over unclean spirits but also perhaps a bit intimated by the second part of this instruction "take nothing for the journey" (Mark 6:8).

At different times in my life, I have responded to the Lord's call to mission and almost every time the Lord has sent me, I must admit I have not been very good at following Jesus's directions of not taking anything with me for the journey, a matter of a fact I think I have almost, always brought stuff with me for the journey. Two years ago, when I moved to Glandorf, I think it took four vehicles to get my stuff here and another time when I went on a mission trip to Appalachia, we brought a trailer full of tools to help us do our jobs. The closest example I can think of taking nothing for the journey was when I went to Hati, I was only allowed to bring twenty pounds of personal luggage. Twenty pounds is not much when you consider the poverty of Hati and you consider the things you might want to bring with you, at the same time it is bringing something. I wonder if this instruction to take nothing with you from Jesus is literal or figurative? In another place in the gospel Jesus tells a parable of ten virgins going out to meet the bridegroom and we hear that five were foolish they did not bring extra oil with them and five were wise they brought extra oil and they got to go into the banquet. There seems to be some incentive for being ready and prepared, so bringing some stuff on a missionary journey would seem to be important. Perhaps Jesus instruction to taking nothing with us for journey is not so much about what we take but about our trust in God and what keeps us from encountering God.

When we get sent on a missionary journey, we go on these missionary journeys for three reasons:

Because God choses us

Because we want to make an impact on another

Because we want to have an experience of God.

Sometimes what we bring with us our journey that we get sent on, can get in our way of experiencing God. For the twelve in our scriptures today the food, the sack, and money belt bringing these things with them would have gotten in their way of experiencing God. In our

world today there are also things that can get in our way of experiencing God an easy example would be our electronic devices. But other times it is not physical stuff that gets in our way of experiencing God, but it is the thoughts that race

through our heads, it is our planning of every detail that can get in our way of experiencing God.

Regardless of what it is that gets in our way of experiencing God, Jesus challenges to not bring that stuff with us so that we can experience God.
