From the Desk of Fr. Matt

Is it better to be a Martha or a Mary? Is it better to the one that serves Jesus and the rest of the guests or is it better to be the one that sits and listens at the feet of Jesus? Is it better to be the one that serves or the one that listens? My initial response is to want to question are not both important?

In our scriptures today Jesus tells Maratha "There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her" (Luke 10:42). From this we can get the impression that it is better to listen than it is serve. And this can frustrate the ones that serve, the ones that do. Those that serve or do might object and explain how what they do is important. They might say if someone does not cook the food no body eats, if someone does not check if the guest needs something to drink nobody gets anything to drink. I

agree serving and doing is important, if given choice between serving/doing verse listening, I would probably choose to serve/to do. But sometimes amid serving and doing we can forget, why we are doing what we are doing. Sometimes we need to take the time to listen to remind ourselves why we serve, why we are doing what we are doing.

Several years ago, I went on mission trip to Appalachia and several of the people that I was on the trip with were carpenters, electricians, and had other specialty skills that were helpful in completing jobs at the various work sights. We arrived late in the afternoon on Sunday and that evening we were given a list of the various jobs that needed to be completed and we divided up our group to complete the tasks. At 5:30 AM Monday Morning one my fellow missionaries came woke everybody up and told us it was time to get to work. But before we could go to work, we went to Mass, ate breakfast, and then our guides before sending us out had an orientation for us about the culture of the area and we went over other details. The information was important, but it also delayed our getting out to our worksites and you could sense frustration on some of my fellow missionaries faces "why can we not just get out and do the work we came to do?" Yet our guides were trying to communicate that we were doing more than just replacing windows and floors. We here to change lives not only those we helped but our lives as well. Our guides were trying to get us listen, so that we could see Christ in the work that we were about to do.

In our scriptures today we encounter Abraham showing hospitality to three strangers, that seemed to be just passing through. This showing of hospitality was more than just showing hospitality to strangers passing through, it was culturally appropriate to show this kind of hospitality to a passing guest. But unknowingly some of these guests could have been God's messengers as was in this case. We are called to show welcome and concern for each other, we are called to serve each other. Yes, because our faith teaches us to do this. But most importantly we are serving and welcoming the hidden presence of our God in our midst. May the Lord give us the eyes to see this hidden presence of our God in our midst so that we can serve our God.
