These three years will culminate in the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in almost fifty years.

Catholics from across the United States will gather for a once-in-alifetime pilgrimage toward the "source and summit" of our Catholic faith to participate in a unifying National Eucharistic Congress from July 17-21, 2024. They will journey on pilgrimage to Indianapolis OH together to encounter Jesus personally in the Eucharist and be sent back out into their parishes and communities on mission.

Jesus tells his disciples today, "But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming." God is always trying to inform us on what he expects and what will bring us life. Jesus tells us that he is the way, the truth, and the life. The world is not always truthful. Sometimes we wonder if

On an early Sat. morning of Park Fest in 2011, Fr. Tony called me about providing funeral Luncheons for parishioners who lost family members since the parish now had use of the Cafeteria. We talked about caterers and such. I think Fr. Tony asked me to be the chairman (to long ago to remember). Told him I would consider it, but I felt that I needed a co-chairman. I went to Park that night and talked to Darlene Miller- asked her if she would be interested in co-chairing this undertaking. She said "Yes". Called Fr. Tony the next week and set a time with him to discuss food prices, menu and cost to families. Fr. Tonys' idea was to provide a service not to make money. He thought family of the deceased should hire a caterer, I think Fr. Tony was surprised to hear that I thought I could cook the meal with the help of volunteers, cost to families would be cheaper As I would also volunteer my time. We contacted ladies in the parish to prep food, bring desserts, serve and clean up. On Oct. 11, 2011 we served the first luncheon and all went well. Since then we have served almost 200 luncheons. We have currently 75 men and women who volunteer to Work at the luncheons and 65 volunteers who bring desserts. THANK YOU to all the volunteers and a special thanks to Darlene Miller for saying "YES". We couldn't do this without each and everyone of you. And to Fr. Tony, I am most grateful to you for trusting my ability to cook for a large group of people – a skill I didn't know I had. May God bless you with good health and happiness in your new assignment.
