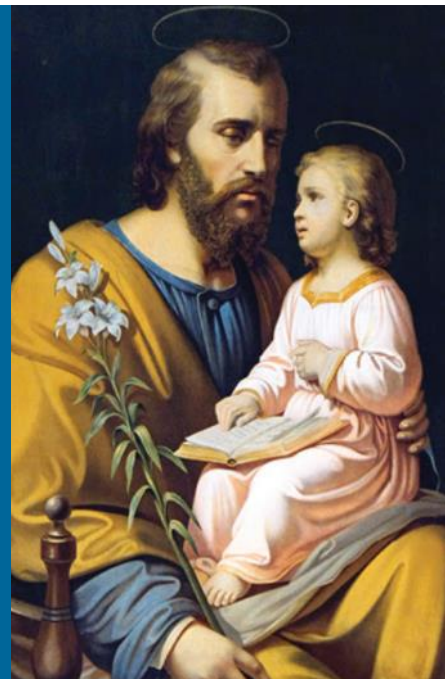

2 FROM THE DESK OF DEACON DON

We see in the Gospel this weekend where Jesus is passing through towns and villages and is preaching in synagogues. He is healing the sick and giving words of encouragement to the downtrodden but his work never seems to end. The people are hanging around Him and he sees the distress in their eyes. “They look like sheep without a shepherd,” He says. And He has pity on them. This was Jesus’ observation and reaction over two thousand years ago but has it really changed at all today? All you need to do is read the newspaper or go on social media to realize that things aren’t much different. People all around are upset and driven to despair by the difficulties and the seeming absurdity of life. When we look around, we get the same impression that Jesus got when he looked at the crowds around him. Even Christians no longer seem to know what master to follow, or whom to trust. Moral relativism seems to be the new faith where we can pick and choose what we want to believe. We follow our own instincts and moral path rather than follow the path that Jesus Christ set up; adhering to the Catholic Church’s teachings through Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and the Magisterium. And there is a message of hope in that He called His disciples to reach out to others and hand down the message that Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Some of us are called to the religious life and others are called to witness to Christ by raising a family that is focused on Him as our Savior. St. Paul in the 2nd reading also gives us hope when he says, “When we were still powerless” and “while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.” Jesus took us in hand as we were and performed his work of transforming us, thereby justifying us in the sight of His Father. And then Paul says, “We shall be saved by Him from God’s wrath.” What a warm and fuzzy feeling (road to Emmaus) it is to know that if we keep Jesus as the center of our lives, we are on the right path to sharing life with Him in Heaven. My prayer for you this weekend is that you will be transformed by God’s love and feel the presence of the Holy Spirit everyday in your life.
