



1Kgs 19:16b, 19-21 Gal 5:1, 13-18 Lk 9 51-62



From the Desk of Fr. Tony Today we celebrate the solemnity of the most holy body and blood of Christ. We give thanks for the eucharist in our lives. It is the center and pinnacle of our Christian faith. The time we spend at mass and eucharistic adoration enlivens and strengthens our faith and souls. Sometimes in the evening I go over to church to spend one on one time with Jesus in the tabernacle. I can tell that someone else is in church besides me and that other is Jesus. It

Some of us, including me, think that we can pave our own way in life but we become disappointed and we realize that we need to stay close to the good shepherd. I want to thank all of you.
