Jesus said to the Twelve: "Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others,

I will deny before my heavenly Father."

Do not be afraid of people. Fear the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. God loves you and will protect you. You are worth more than many sparrows. Sparrows are dirty and a pain anyway. Do not be afraid. Proclaim God's word to others. Jesus wants you to do that. What keeps you from speaking God's word? Are you afraid of what people might think of you? The highest importance is what God thinks of you. Please acknowledge Jesus in front of others. Minutes for Parish Council Meeting - February 11, 2020

1. Council reviewed the Eucharist Adoration meal on January 19, 2020. Discussion was held about the amount of food such as chips, pretzels, wine, and ice for the coming years. Also, continue to have each parish and finance council member contribute two dozen cookies as dessert. 2. Update on sound system: The installation is complete and adjustments are being made to promote optimal sound. Also, Torrence Sound Equipment Company will help with sound for the video imbedder. 3. Video through Glandorf Fi-Optics (formerly Glandorf Telephone Company) is being installed and possibly start broadcasting in late February. 4. Church Electrical Analysis: It was observed that monthly electrical bills were increasing and the company who installed the VRV system found a compressor, motherboard and some louvers needing attention. The system will be fixed so the A/C will be working this spring. 5. New Business: The crack in the back of church is caused by settling. The darkened spot is fading. No further loss of plaster around the mural. The men's restroom toilet is leaking and will be fixed. There is a down spout dripping on the south side which will be looked at. 6. PARISH POLICY FOR CYO HIGH SCHOOL & PUTNAM COUNTY GRADE SCHOOL BOY'S & GIRL'S SPORTING TEAMS

ANNOUNCEMENT: Playing any sports this year? You are expected to attend both the Fall & Winter sessions of High School Religious Education Groups or Grade School CCD Classes---plus weekend Saturday or Sunday Mass. This includes all players, coaches and their families. Attendance at these groups/classes will be monitored and reviewed. For each class missed (which is not an excused absence) you will be sitting out one game.—To play CYO sports, the following are the only excused absences from CCD: sickness, death in family, college visitation day, parish sponsored event, sport tournament games only with O-G athletes/fans involved, and work (up to 3 missed CCD classes due to work). After the third absence due to work, the player is not permitted to play in a game until he/she returns to CCD class. All other reasons are unexcused. Parents, if your child is sick, please call his/her teacher/leader before class. If necessary, the Parish Council will review attendance or unexcused absence issues on an individual basis.
