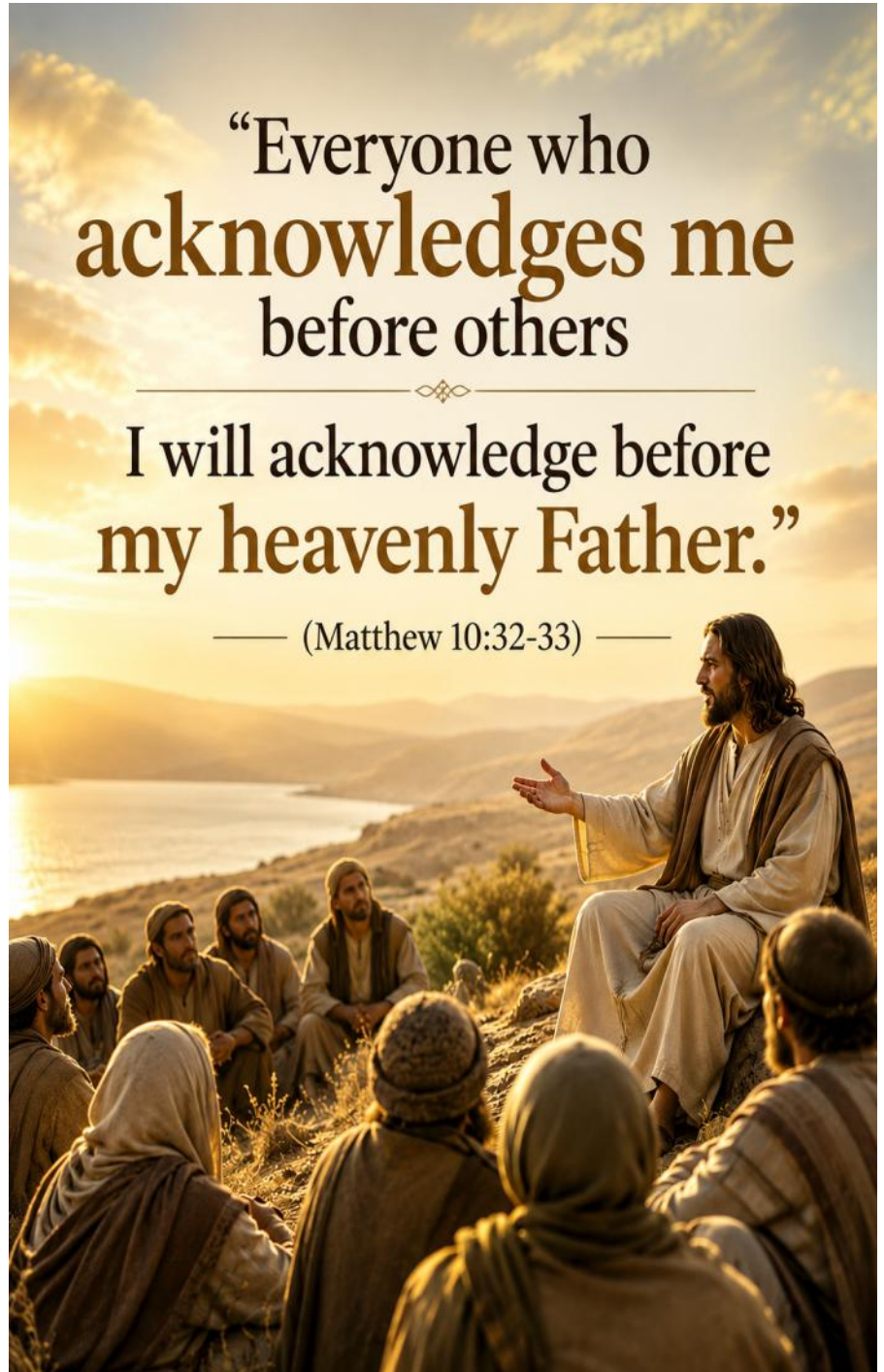

OUR MISSION

Founded by Jesus Christ, St. John the Baptist Catholic Church is the heart of Glandorf. At the heart of our faith are the Sacraments which St. John's is here to evangelize, catechize, and celebrate all of God's people to set their hearts on fire in passionate love of God and neighbor.

“Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly father.” (Matthew 10:32-33).

I think these words from Jesus can leave us with a mixture of feelings. On one hand, I think we like to sound of these words from Jesus, we like the idea of acknowledging our heavenly father before others. We say we want to acknowledge Jesus before others. We might go so far to picturing ourselves on how we might give witness to Jesus in front of others. And in that picture of giving witness to Jesus, we probably see ourselves in some way being a superhero. We picture a pat on the back or positive comments we might receive for giving witness to Jesus or might even see ourselves being in the headline news.

On the other hand, we like the idea of giving witness to Jesus in front of others, we might train ourselves to give witness to Jesus in front of others. But we pray that we will never be put in position where we need to put our training into practice. Because we fear our giving witness to Jesus in front of others might land us in position like Jeremiah was in our scriptures today “Denounce! Let us denounce him! All those who were my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine” (Jeremiah 20:10). Our giving witness to Jesus in front of others we fear might land us with reputation of being a goody two shoes. We fear our giving witness to Jesus in front of others; people will stare at us.

Sometimes our giving witness to Jesus in front of others might land us in position where we end up being a hero or put on trial. But sometimes and I would argue most of the time our giving witness to Jesus in front others is a part of the ordinary that it goes unnoticed. How many of us wear a scapular, a cross, or a religious metal? Or perhaps some of wear a shirt with Jesus or it says something religious or spiritual. Or we might participate in religious events like VBS or a retreat and as part of our participation we are given or purchase a shirt, and we wear the shirt after the event. Or at our homes how many of us put crucifixes up on our walls, statues of Mary, Jesus, and/or saints on shelves or in a garden, and religious pictures up as decorations. Or on Father’s Day how many fathers remind their children that they need to pray before they eat a meal, go to bed, wake up in the morning? These are all examples of ways that we give witness to Jesus in front of others. Some these examples mentioned are ways that we give witness to Jesus that we do we do not even think about as giving witness to Jesus, they just have become part of our routine.

But we need these safe and easy routine ways of giving witness to Jesus in front of others. Because we also know that our giving witness to Jesus in front of others is not always easy, we know that sometimes when give witness to Jesus in front people they are not going to like what we say and do and it may feel like we are on trial. We need the safe and easy ways of giving witness to Jesus to help us prepare for times we give witness to Jesus in front others and we encounter the challenges. Let give witness to Jesus in front of others with faith that no harm will come to us.

Catechism Corner

*The Source and Summit of our Faith:
Eucharistic Worship, Part 2, Introductory Rite*

In order to encounter the Body and Blood of Christ, we must make the choice to meet Him at Mass, at the Liturgy. The word Liturgy comes from the Greek *liturgia*, which means the *work of people*. This work is the *worship and participation* of the people gathered together at Mass, at Church. (CCC 1140) Jesus is present in the Church, the people of God. It is through the Church that God makes the sign of Himself present. This is what a sacrament is – a sign that makes that which is signified present. The Church teaches that Christ is the first sacrament of God. (CCC 775) The sign of His presence becomes a reality to the people of God in four ways at the Mass: 1) Christ is present in the community, 2) Christ is present in the proclamation of the Word, 3) Christ is present in the Body and Blood, in the Eucharist, and 4) Christ is present in the person of the priest.

There is a four-part structure to the Mass: 1) the Introductory Rite, 2) The Liturgy of the Word, 3) The Liturgy of the Eucharist, and 4) The Concluding Rite. Week after week, we gather as Church to encounter the real presence of Christ through the Mass and we are formed into God's people. Today, let's look at the first part of the Mass, the introductory rite.

What is the Introductory Rite? The people of God gather as the Body of Christ to do what Jesus commanded us to do, to remember Him, "to do this as a memorial of me." In this rite, the assembly is called together by Jesus Himself and they are established as Church. This gathering is the first place we encounter the presence of Christ, and an atmosphere of worship and celebration is created.

Structure and Meaning of the Introductory Rite, 3 Parts

The opening song: As people step across the threshold from the world to worship in a sacred space, the procession to the altar is accompanied by singing, fostering a sense of celebration.

The procession: Like the people who processed out of the desert, the procession is a reminder we are a people "on the move", on a journey to the Kingdom of God both now and not yet. The priest moves toward the altar, in the midst of the people, to prepare to offer a sacrifice on behalf of the people and to bring Christ's presence to our midst. (CCC 1344)

Greeting & Opening Prayer: The greeting sets the tone for the Mass of the day and expresses mutual acknowledgement of the presence of Christ. The priest then petitions God to hear our prayers and prepares the assembly to hear the Word of God spoken not just to their ears, but also to their hearts.

The introductory rite brings the people of God into His presence and prepares the heart for sacred worship.
