## FROM THE DESK OF FR. MATT

When I was in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade I got an F in Art Class in the second quarter. I will be honest and say I earned the grade. I will be the first to admit also that I am not good at drawing and I will admit that I probably would not be your first choice to judge art. As we prepare for our Corpus Christi procession today it was suggested that we decorate our sidewalk leading to the altar in our Marian Shrine with chalk art. Our First Communicants drew pictures for us to put on the sidewalk, and I was told to judge/pick the pictures we are going to use. As I began to look at the pictures our First Communicants drew, I was impressed, our First



Communicants are good at drawing, and it was not easy to pick which ones to draw on the sidewalk. Last year we drew the pictures on the sidewalk and Saturday night after we drew them it rained, and they got washed away. I pray that this year that we have favorable weather and they do not get washed away overnight Saturday into Sunday morning. I ended up picking eight pictures to be drawn along the sidewalk this year. In one of the pictures there was quote that caught my attention "receive and he won't leave". What a profound and true statement coming from one of our first communicants.

Of the seven Sacraments the Eucharist is the one sacrament that we can and are encouraged to receive every day. Many of the sacraments are once in a lifetime events, moments and when they are received are profound experiences but are generally not repeated Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Matrimony, and Holy Orders. I mean many of us were baptized as infants and do not remember it, how many of us wish we could do it again so we could remember it? Sacraments of Healing Penance and Anointing of the Sick can be repeated and, in some cases are encouraged to be repeated, many of go to confession a couple times a year and we can receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick multiple times, but typically we do not seek or receive these sacraments every day. The Eucharist is the Sacrament that we can and are encouraged to receive each day/at least once a week. For as we receive Christ dwells in our hearts and lives and does not leave us.

In our scriptures today Jesus uses five loaves of bread and two fish to be enough to feed a crowd of over 5,000 people. What I find interesting about this miracle is before making the five loaves of bread and two fish became

enough to feed the crowd, Jesus preached about the kingdom of God and healed those that needed it. The disciples wanted Jesus to dismiss the crowds so they could go find their provisions. But Jesus told the disciples to feed the crowd themselves, and Jesus worked with what they had five loaves of bread and two fish and made it more than enough to feed the crowd. When we come to Mass, we often come praying for those in need and as we pray, we want Jesus to do something for those in need. Jesus replies to us the way he replied to the disciples



"'Give them some food yourselves'" (Luke 9:13). And like the disciples what we have to give can seem like it is not enough. When we receive the Eucharist, Jesus can use what have, even when it might seem to not be enough to be more than enough to help those in need. As you receive the Eucharist, Jesus will not leave you but will give you strengthen and will help you?

### CATECHISM CORNER

#### What is Corpus Christi Sunday?

Corpus Christi Sunday, also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is a solemn feast celebrated each year to honor the Real Presence of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Corpus Christi is Latin for "Body of Christ."

The feast day was established in 1246 by Bishop Robert de Thorte of Liege, Belgium. It was extended to the universal Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264 after St. Thomas Aquinas, a Doctor of the Church, proposed a feast focused solely on the Holy Eucharist that emphasized the joy of the Real Presence of Jesus. Having recognized in 1264 the authenticity of a Eucharistic miracle in Bolsena, the pontiff established the feast of Corpus Christi on August 11, 1264, as a solemnity for the whole Roman Catholic Church.

Corpus Christi is a "moveable" feast: originally observed on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. In 1970 it was shifted to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday for U.S. dioceses and most of the world.

#### **Traditions of Corpus Christi**

At some parishes on Corpus Christi, after Mass Our Lord is placed in a monstrance that is then carried by a priest to four different altars representing the four corners of the earth. While processing, the congregation follows and sings. At each altar there are readings and prayers. The procession is followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Each year in Rome, the pope presides over a Eucharistic procession on the Feast of Corpus Christi. The procession begins at the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran and proceeds to the Basilica of St. Mary Major, where it concludes with Benediction.

#### Saints on Corpus Christi


Here are a few inspiring quotes from saints about the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ.

- **St. Thomas Aquinas:** "The Eucharist is the sacrament of love: it signifies love, it produces love. The Eucharist is the consummation of the whole spiritual life."
- **St. John Chrysostom:** "It is not the man who is responsible for the offerings as they become Christ's Body and Blood; it is Christ Himself who was crucified for us. The standing figure belongs to the priest who speaks these words. The power and the grace belong to God. 'This is My Body,' he says. And these words transform the offerings."
- **St. Maximilian Kolbe:** "If angels could be jealous of men, they would be so for one reason: Holy Communion."
- **St. Pio of Pietrelcina:** "A thousand years of enjoying human glory is not worth even an hour spent sweetly communing with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament."
- **St. Angela of Foligno:** "If we paused for a moment to consider attentively what takes place in this sacrament, I am sure that the thought of Christ's love for us would transform the coldness of our hearts into a fire of love and gratitude."
- **St. Augustine:** "What you see is the bread and the chalice; that is what your own eyes report to you. But what your faith obliges you to accept is that the bread is the Body of Christ, and the chalice is the Blood of Christ. This has been said very briefly, which may perhaps be sufficient for faith; yet faith does not desire instruction."

#### **How to Make Corpus Christi Come Alive** In Your Home

- I Attend a procession St. John's is having a procession today, Sun., June 22nd to the Marian Shrine. Benediction (special prayers worshiping Christ) will be said, followed by a procession back to the church and then food and fellowship are offered in the parish center! Come celebrate the Real Presence of Christ's Body and Blood with us!
- 2 Go to Eucharistic Adoration or visit Jesus in a church if he's not exposed on the altar - Visiting another parish or Adoration Chapel could be a little Corpus Christi pilgrimage. Spend a few moments in prayer with your family. Children particularly love little chapels, places where they can be close to the Blessed Sacrament. Even if most of the time is spent getting your family in or out of a Church, your Heavenly Father, who "sees in secret" will repay you!
- 3 Read the Last Supper account or John 6 Gather your family in the living room and read the verses of Scripture which recall for us the moment when Christ first gave the Eucharist to his closest friends, the apostles. Every Catholic should know that John, Chapter 6, contains the "Bread of Life" discourse, wherein Jesus teaches that his flesh is true food and his blood true drink.
- 4 Pray a Litany of the Blessed Sacrament Praying litanies works very well with families. Adults and older children can read the invocations, and younger children can join in on the responses. Litanies often contain beautiful images, which are worth discovering and teaching to your family.
- 5 Prepare a small altar in your home Place a crucifix to represent Christ at the center, then decorate with flowers and candles, which you could burn all day in honor of the feast!


