FROM THE DESK OF FR. MATT

I would like to welcome Fr. Tim McFarland, C.PP.S. to Glandorf, he is going to be covering the parish while I am away on vacation/pilgrimage. As you are reading this, I am either somewhere in enroute to Rome or in Rome for a pilgrimage with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. One of my hopes on this pilgrimage is to see Pope Leo XIV.

Over the last month/couples Sundays we have been celebrating solemnities the Ascension, Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Who says Catholic do not celebrate, over the past few weeks

have done a lot of celebrating? Something to note about these solemnities is they are movable celebration. They are not celebrated on the same date each year Ascension forty days after Easter Sunday (but our local church pushes it to Sunday), Pentecost fifty days after Easter Sunday, and the Most Holy Trinity and Corpus Christi have been the Sundays after Pentecost. Today once again we celebrate a solemnity today we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, and what is different about today's solemnity it is not a movable solemnity but is celebrated every year on June 29th regardless of what day of the week it falls on. This year we get the privilege of celebrating today on Sunday as today's solemnity trumps a Sunday in Ordinary time celebration.

In recent years a message that I have heard Catholic speakers say that 'we are meant for greatness'. I will not deny this idea we are meant for greatness; I will accept the premise that we are meant for greatness, but how can we achieve greatness? The simple answer would be to live the faith, and you will achieve greatness. Another answer would be to look at someone you perceive to be great and follow their example. I believe this is called this 'act until you achieve'. Two examples of greatness to follow would be Saints Peter and Paul. Now just because I say they are great does not mean they were perfect because Peter and Paul were not perfect by no means. Peter when asked if he was associated with Jesus denied it three times and Paul, he was a persecutor he had permission to bring back in chains anyone that said they were followers of Christ. Peter and Paul were not perfect, but the Lord continued to work with them, and their hearts were changed over time. Paul had his 'fall off the horse moment' and had a change of heart and from that moment he preached the message of Christ. We hear a testament of Peter's faith in scriptures today when Jesus asks the disciple who am I and Peter answers

by saying "You are Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). Peter firmly believes this as we also hear in scriptures today that he was put in prison on account of his belief. Our faith tradition believes that both Peter and Paul were martyred for giving witness to Christ. It is because of this we believe they have achieved greatness.

Like Saints Peter and Paul, we are not perfect either and we could list our imperfections, yet the Lord continues to work with us. Like Peter and Paul, as we continue to allow the Lord to work with us and as we allow the Lord



to work with us we can achieve this greatness that is talked about. As we celebrate the great apostles today Saints Peter and Paul as the Lord used them to achieve greatness, may we also allow the Lord to use us to achieve greatness in us as well.







Today we are celebrating the feast of Saints Peter and Paul. They are such important saints that their feast day takes the place of the usual Sunday. Saint Peter was the chief of the Apostles.

You are Peter ...

He was close to Our Lord, and the only one that Jesus told, "you are Peter (which means rock) and on this rock I will build my Church..." Saint

Peter had a hard time accepting that Jesus had to die, and he also denied Jesus. But he was sorry afterward and became a strong leader for the disciples after Jesus went back into Heaven. Saint Peter was the Church's first pope.


Saint Paul was a Jew who at first was against the Christians. He even helped to persecute them. But then Jesus appeared to him and Paul became a Christian and a great preacher. His mission was to preach to the Gentiles, the people who didn't know about God or His promises. He wrote many letters that are now part of the Bible.

Both Saint Peter and Saint Paul preached and taught about Jesus and brought the Faith to many people and places. But the Roman government did not like the Christians. The emperor Nero began killing the Christians, and among those

killed were Peter and Paul. Their deaths didn't stop the Church from growing, though. When people die for God it brings even more grace into the Church.

Today we should thank God for sending us these great saints, and we can also pray that we will help to spread the Faith.
