FROM THE DESK OF FR. MATT

Important documents that have a lot important legal language in them like banking terms, insurance policies, etc. We all have these documents, how many of us take the time to read them word for word before we sign them? Better yet, how many of us if we read these documents word for word understand the language of these documents? How many of us read these documents get confused by them? I venture to guess most of us would answer no they typically do not read these documents, no they do not understand them word for word, and yes they get confused by these documents. But ironically, we sign these documents anyway. Why? Well, we have a basic understanding of what these documents say, and we trust that they will protect, help and will do for us what we need them to do at the proper times. These important documents remind of our Solemnity today of the Most Holy Trinity.

Today as a church we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. We celebrate and believe that our God who is 100% Father, 100% Son, and 100% Holy Spirit all at the same time and is still one God. Often, when we speak of our family tree and explain that I am part (fill in the name) because my mother was a (fill in the name). In our family tree we speak of the parts that make us up who we are, but our God has three persons yet is one God, our God is one, there is no division/part to our God. How does this work? Theologians throughout the church's history have written countless documents explaining to us how this all works out. They are important documents for us to read, to study, and to try and understand and at the same time they are thick documents to read, they can be confusing, and they can even at times be a little dry. But I think the important thing for us to remember is that the Most Holy Trinity is a mystery which means that we will not ever fully understand. And to explain how the Most Holy Trinity works we can commit an unknown number of heresies.

The point of the Most Holy Trinity is that it consists of three persons Father, Son, and Holy Spirit but we have one God. The most important thing is not about understanding, the most important thing is that we are in relationship with our God. Jesus in our scriptures speaks of the importance of that relationship when he says "that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16). In our prayer life we speak to our belief and our relationship in our belief in the Most Holy Trinity, most notably when we make the Sign of the Cross or pray the Glory Be. We even sing praise to the Most Holy Trinity in many of the hymns that we sing, this praise usually is subtly interwoven in last verses of the hymn.

We are called to in relationship with the Most Holy Trinity but I think it is also important to note that we are called to be in right relationship with our God. Our scriptures today speak to this importance Moses says, "If I find favor with you, O Lord do come along in our company" (Exodus 34:9). Paul writes for us to mend our ways "encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you" (2 Corinthians 13:12). We are called to be in right relationship with our God and each other and it is when we are in right relationship that our God is with us. The question for us today is as we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity is how are we doing in our relationship with God and each other? Is there any mending that we need to do in our relationships?



The State of Ohio is attempting to amend its constitution to guarantee abortion in the state. The proposed amendment will upend parental rights and allow minors to receive abortions and undergo gender transitions WITHOUT parental consent or notification. The pro-choice groups have until July 5th to obtain over 400.000 signatures from Ohio voters in order for the amendment to appear on the ballot in November 2023. WHAT IS HAPPENING?

A proposed amendment to Ohio's Constitution claims to recognize reproductive freedoms, but it furthers a culture of death and removes current safeguards for women. As Catholics, we find the proposed amendment dangerous, unjust, and contrary to our belief in the sacredness of all life.

Where Does the Amendment Say That?

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

- Vague language would challenge any attempt to regulate who could perform an abortion and the standards of care required
- Could eliminate current safety standards, such as the presence of a licensed physician and assurance of hospital access in an emergency

The State shall not... interfere with...an individual's [abortion]... unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means

ENDANGERS PREBORN CHILDREN

- Would force Ohio to abandon protections enacted for preborn children with a detectable heartbeat
- Permits abortions at any time in pregnancy; a clinician could justify a woman's anxiety or depression as a reason for late-term abortion

...in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health


ENABLES-THOSE-WHO-PRESSURE WOMEN INTO ABORTIONS

- Majority of women who have had an abortion report "high levels of pressure" to seek the abortion+
- Anyone who transports, counsels, or pressures a woman into an abortion, including abusers, traffickers, and negligent clinicians, would be protected by law
- Parents would no longer need to give consent or even be informed if their minor is seeking an abortion, removing their ability to report suspected abuse of their daughter



"What does the Eucharist mean to me?"

That was the question posed for school age youth this past October, when our Diocesan Department of Catholic Education asked principals, teachers, directors of religious education and catechists to invite and encourage all parishioners in grades K-12, including all students in Catholic schools, in parish religious education programs, and homeschoolers throughout the Diocese of Toledo, to participate in a intermediate students (third to fifth grade), middle school students (sixth to eighth grade), and high school students (ninth to twelfth grade). The multimedia projects or essay projects were judged based on their creativity, content, and aesthetics. It was a very challenging process to determine three finalists in each category to be recognized for their outstanding work, but with the help of multiple

diocesan wide contest as part of this diocesan year of the National Eucharistic Revival.

Our children and young people throughout our 19 counties were invited to reflect on and answer the question, "What does the Eucharist mean to me?" by writing an essay of one thousand



words or less, or by creating an original piece of art, music, poetry, or short video. The responses were overwhelming! Over 500 students participated either individually or as part of a small group by submitting creative entries which included wonderful videos, innovative works of art (including paintings, drawings and sculpture), inspiring poems, and many heartfelt reflections about their experience of the Lord in the Eucharist. Their works captured what the Eucharist means to them! Their works are an inspiring testimony to their faith in and love for Jesus!

The students' entries were divided into age groups: primary students (kindergarten to second grade), "graders" from the Catholic Education Department, Mrs. Pat Odey-Murray, the Chair of our Diocesan National Eucharistic Revival Team, and yours truly, every one of the submissions were reviewed and appreciated.

On May 4, 2023, in a

special evening event, we honored the three finalists in each category, and their families by inviting them for a tour of Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral, followed by a pizza party in the Monsignor Bernard E. Smith Auditorium celebrating their work, and the announcement of the winners. Every finalist received an age-appropriate book about Blessed Carlo Acutis, young patron of the National Eucharistic Revival. Third place winners also received a holy water font, second place winners also received a Diocesan rosary blessed by Pope Francis, and first place winners also received a framed image of the Eucharistic Revival Logo or of the Lord's Supper, together with a modest monetary gift.
