**Our Lady's Brown Scapular Promise
July 16, 1251, to Saint Simon Stock**

“Whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire.”

October 13, 1917, at the last apparition at Fatima Our Blessed Mother appeared, dressed as Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. Silently she held out to the world the brown scapular – the sign of personal consecration – the sign of eternal salvation. Lucy of Fatima explained: “The Scapular and the Rosary are inseparable.”

Your SCAPULAR, then, should take on deep meaning for you. It is a rich present brought down from heaven by our Lady herself. “Wear it devoutly and perseveringly,” she says to each soul, “it is my garment. To be clothed in it means you are continually thinking of me, and I in turn, am always thinking of you and helping you to secure eternal life.”

Saint John Paul II cited two truths the Scapular brings out: “The continuous protection of the Blessed Virgin, not only along the pathways of this life, but also at the moment of passing into the fullness of eternal glory” and “the awareness that devotion towards Our Lady cannot be limited to the occasional prayer in her honor, but must become a ‘habit’, that is a permanent way of Christian living, made up of prayer and the interior life, frequent recourse to the Sacraments and the concrete exercise of the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.”

So, what's stopping you from being enrolled in the Brown Scapular or if you've been lax in wearing it begin again to devoutly wear it and pray the rosary every day.

Fifteen Promises of Mary to Christians Who Recite the Rosary

(Given to St. Dominic and Blessed Alain)

1. Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the rosary, shall receive signal graces.
2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the rosary.
3. The rosary shall be a powerful armour against hell. It will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
4. It will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means!
5. The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the rosary, shall not perish.
6. Whoever shall recite the rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, and he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall remain in the grace of God and become worthy of eternal life.
7. Whoever shall have a true devotion for the rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
8. Those who are faithful to recite the rosary shall have during their life and at their death the light of God and the fullness of His graces, and at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
9. I shall deliver from purgatory those who have been devoted to the rosary.
10. The faithful children of the rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in heaven.
11. You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the rosary.
12. All those who propagate the holy rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.
14. All who recite the rosary are my beloved children, the brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ.
15. Devotion of my rosary is a great sign of predestination.

Fr. Tony**

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. The Holy Spirit came upon Mary and the apostles in the form of tongues of fire. Jesus gives his apostles the courage to leave that upper room and go out to proclaim the gospel. We receive this Holy Spirit in baptism and it is continued in the sacrament of confirmation. In confirmation we receive the seven gifts of the spirit. We receive wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude,

knowledge, piety, and fear of God. These gifts motivate us and push us to build the kingdom. Brothers and sisters there are times when we need direct divine intervention from God. Our own motivation does not urge us on to be God's representatives in the world. I can think of the time when I first read at mass. It was when I was in the third grade at Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Ottawa, Ohio. I was nervous in the service. I asked God for his help that day and he delivered. That tradition of asking God for help before mass is my daily tradition. God was getting me ready to have mass when I was eight years old. I am realizing life and its responsibilities get to be too much at times. It is like swimming out into the ocean and eventually we get tired and scared because we are too far from land. We need a life jacket or a raft to hang on for a while. Jesus is that life saver. As we read in the breviary, God gives us the strength of the wild ox and he makes us green as sap.

In today's gospel we see, "Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." God does give us what we need. Be not afraid, you are working for a wonderful boss. He has your back always. He will urge you onto places you thought you would never go. Be not afraid. WEDDINGS: The Toledo Diocese requests all dates be set at the rectory at least 6 months in advance. **Pre-Marriage Class required.** Parties who recently joined our parish who do not live within our parish boundaries, or who do not belong to a family already registered in the parish; need to be aware that we cannot schedule a wedding date until six months after the time of registration. The normal six-month preparation period would apply from that point. Normally only parishioners and those related to our parishioners marry here. Any other person needs prior permission of his/her pastor.
