2 FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today we hear of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. Jesus raised Lazarus but you know what is interesting is that at some point in history Lazarus also died again. So why did Jesus bring Lazarus back from the dead only to have him die again?

Perhaps it was because of the close friendship that Lazarus and Jesus shared. I mean at the beginning of this story Martha and Mary send word to him that the one he loves is ill and we hear our scriptures today we hear the famous verse "And Jesus wept" (John 11:35).

Perhaps Jesus brought Lazarus back for protection of Martha and Mary. In the culture of Jesus time women were vulnerable because they had no rights and they depended upon men for protection particularly from members of their family a brother or a son or for those that were married a husband. Lazarus dying would have left Martha and Mary vulnerable. And Jesus bringing Lazarus back to life would have restored this dignity.

Perhaps Jesus brought Lazarus back out of concern and because of the relationship that he with Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. But I think that there is more to it than that. I think that Jesus brought Lazarus back out of concern for all of us. I like to think that we are all Lazarus, we are all the old dried up bones that we hear about in our scriptures today, there are parts of our body that is dead because of sin. But also because the spirit of Christ in us we are also a live.

Sometimes in plants you can get a dead branch or sometimes the branches can over grow in places where they become hazardous, or just not look good. Plants in these moments need to be trimmed and pruned so that they can be healthy. During this season of Lent we are called to prune and trim out from lives what is dead and rebalance our lives to be more healthy followers of the Lord. Our Elect and Candidates are called to trim and prune from their lives all that is not of the Lord. For us who are baptized at times in our lives there are parts of us that is dead and needs trimmed away or become unbalanced and not look and we need a trimming to look better. It is when we take the time to do this we can be like Lazarus we get called out from our grave and the Spirit of God is rekindled within our lives.

As we journey in these last days of this season what further pruning do you need to do to your life?

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES ON FEBRUARY 21, 2023

1) Access Control Update

- a) Updates to the crash bars of the parish center main doors and gym main doors need to be made to better accommodate the access control system.
- b) The rear church entrances side vestibules will have crash bars installed to accommodate the locking mechanisms. The main church entrance will not be modified or included in the access control to maintain the integrity and history of the doors. These doors will still need to manually locked each day. Church staff will lock these before they leave each day.
- c) Once the controls are active, a note will be put in the bulletin to share how access to the church will be available.

2) Capital Campaign Update

a) A letter with update to the parish published in the bulletin last week.

3) Handicap Parking Curb

a) Parish Council and Finance Committee discussed concerns of the new curb being a trip hazard. This was discussed at previous meetings. The curb is painted yellow and any additional deterrent raised concern of become more of a hazard related to children potentially climbing on them. The councils voted to take no action on installing any kind of guard rail or deterrent on the curb.

4) New Business

- a) Father and Ashley had a meeting a couple of weeks ago with the diocese attorney to discuss an inquire by Tom Giesken about purchasing a small piece of church property. The request was denied since this section provides access to the parish ground east of the school.
- b) Discussed upcoming needs for new members of the councils. No new members of parish council are needed. 3 new members of the finance committee are up for election. Members were asked to think of potential candidates. It was asked if a posting could be published in the bulletin for interested candidates. Will discuss at the March meeting.
- c) HS student members were asked to consider successors for their seats on parish council.
- d) Question was raised about emergency protocol training for ushers. Suggestion was made to align this training with the fire department annual walk through at church. More discussion at the next meeting. Father Matt suggested in the event of an emergency event, the ushers follow with an incident report focusing on things that need improvement as well as things that went well and potential logistical concerns depending on the timing related to the mass, i.e. communion time reroute people. It was also suggested that there be bottled water available to the ushers in case needed for an incident.
- Next meeting will be meeting on 3/23/23 in church undercroft.

START A NEW HABIT - SPEND TIME WITH GOD'S WORDS 5th SUNDAY LENT LESSON ON LECTIO DIVINA – DIVINE PRAYER

Lectio divina is a method of praying the Scriptures. What better way to get to know God than by spending time with God's spoken word? The practice of *lectio divina* traces its roots back to the early centuries in the Church. By the sixth century, <u>St.</u> <u>Benedict</u> had made it a regular practice in most monasteries. Today *lectio divina* is a widely held practice by many laymen and laywomen. *Lectio divina* is a slow, rhythmic reading and praying of a Scripture passage. You pick a passage and read it. Notice what arises within you as you read it. Then you read it again, and then again, noticing what words and phrases grab your heart and noticing the feelings that arise. You respond to God about whatever is stirring within as you read and pray with the passage. Finally, you rest and let God respond and speak to you.

Let's consider the formal steps. To begin, you might open with a short prayer, (see Holy Spirit Prayer below). Ask God to guide your prayer time. Try to silence your mind and put off the cares of the day. You could make an act of Faith, Hope, and Charity. Simply; Lord I believe in You help my unbelief, Lord I Hope in You increase my Trust in You, Lord I Love You show me how to love You more. Then do the following:

READ - Slowly and thoughtfully, read the Scripture passage the first time. Did a word or phrase capture your attention and grab your heart? Linger with it whenever this happens.

REFLECT- Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. What is God saying to you in this passage? offering you? asking you? What feelings are arising within you?

RESPOND - Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. Respond to God from your heart. Speak to God of your feelings and insights. Offer these to God.

REST - Possibly read the passage another time. Sit quietly in God's presence, asking, "What are you saying to me?" Rest in God's love and listen.

CONCRETE RESOLUTION - What is God calling you to do with what He has said to you. Practice a virtue like generosity, apologize to someone, do a kind act for someone who may have come to mind during your prayer time etc. As you end your prayer period, you might close with an Our Father or another short prayer. It might be helpful to *jot down in a journal what arose during this time. What did you say to God, and what did God offer you?*

Come Holy Spirit Prayer:

Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful, enkindle in us the fire of your love, send forth your Spirit and we shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit, help us to know what is truly right and always rejoice in his consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

5th Sunday Lent

Reading II

Rom 8:8-11

Brothers and sisters: Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you. Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you.
