From the Desk of Fr. Tony

the robins singing and the sun becoming brighter but this coming week will deal with our inner souls. This week, holy week, will be an adventure with Christ. During this week, many of you watch the movie, "The Passion," directed by Mel Gibson. It is a harsh movie to see but portrays the true suffering of Christ. Mel Gibson is now working on a new movie called, "The Resurrection." It will be out soon. This week will be difficult because you and I may experience our inner soul's suffering with Christ but there will be a resurrection. Suffering does not last forever.

Many of us have experienced a whole year of lent with covid 19 and other infirmities and cancelations. This past year has tested our resolve. But the one thing I learned was, "Jesus I trust in You." We just have to hold onto Christ tighter when our world is collapsing around us. If we stick by Christ as Mary, John, and Mary Magdalen did, we will be alright. Spend this week with an abnormal amount of prayer. This is the week you draw close to Christ. It is called Holy Week because you are supposed to enter into the holy. You may have to work 50 hours this week but you can pray going to work, at work, and at home. Pretend you are one of the people in the crowd following Christ to the cross this week. Jesus wants to see if you will stick with him in his suffering. The cross always leads to resurrection. God bless you all. Fr. Tony

ANNOUNCEMENT: Playing any sports this year? You are expected to attend both the Fall & Winter sessions of High School Religious Education Groups or Grade School CCD Classes---plus weekend Saturday or Sunday Mass. This includes all players, coaches and their families. Attendance at these groups/classes will be monitored and reviewed. For each class missed (which is not an excused absence) you will be sitting out one game.—To play CYO sports, the following are the only excused absences from CCD: sickness, death in family, college visitation day, parish sponsored event, sport tournament games only with O-G athletes/fans involved, and work (up to 3 missed CCD classes due to work). After the third absence due to work, the player is not permitted to play in a game until he/she returns to CCD class. All other reasons are unexcused. Parents, if your child is sick, please call his/her teacher/leader before class. If necessary, the Parish Council will review attendance or unexcused absence issues on an individual basis.
