### **SNOW EMERGENCY LEVELS**

Diocese of Toledo Snow Emergency Policy: Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency, during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio, or internet, making a spiritual Communion.

If **Putnam County** is ever under a Level 3 Snow Emergency the regular Mass times will be canceled here at St. John's. There will be a Mass at Noon, if you can get here safely you are welcome. If not, we encourage you to watch it on cable channel 3 or on our Youtube page. Level 1 and 2 snow emergencies, come if you can get here safely. If Ottawa-Glandorf Schools cancel youth activities, St. John's youth activites will also be cancelled.

# FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

"He was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them conversing with him." (Matthew 17:3). In our scriptures today we hear the story of the transfiguration, a story where Jesus reveals his glory to his disciples, and I will not deny that this is a story of Jesus's revealing his glory. But what I think we can forget about this story is the context, the where, the how this story gets placed in the scriptures. Because I think this is an important detail that we can miss.

Six days before this Jesus took Peter, James, and John up the mountain Jesus tells them something that they find troubling. Jesus tells them that he is going to "suffer greatly from the elders, the chief priests, the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised" (Matthew 16:21). Peter rebukes Jesus no such thing will ever happen to you then Jesus rebukes Peter "Get behind me, Satan!" (Matthew 16:23). Jesus does not sugar coat his message, he does not back down from the coming reality but shows the disciples there that something greater to come beyond suffering when he takes them up on the mountain.

We are disciples of the Lord and there many blessings, graces, and good things that come from being a disciple of the Lord. But a misconception that we have in being a disciple of the Lord is that it means a problem free life. Which is not true, being a disciple of the Lord means that we are called to carry the cross and when we carry the cross sometimes the cross is heavy and not easy to carry. I remember in my youth being on a retreat and one of the activities was for my small group to carry a wooden adult-size cross made from branches of a recently cut tree, for a distance. At first my young blood, masculine instinct was to carry it on my own, I got this, this is going to be easy. I picked it up and it was heavier than I thought, there no way I could get this on my own, I was going to need help it was too heavy the cross. Typically, when we are called to carry the cross typically it is not a literal cross but more figurative like illness, or some other obstacle in life, nonetheless these crosses are heavy and hard to carry sometimes we need help to carry them. As disciples of the Lord, the Lord does not take these crosses away from us, I mean Jesus himself carried the cross. But the Lord calls for us to place our trust in him and the Lord helps us to carry our cross. The Lord calls for us to carry our cross even when we do not know were we are being lead.

We hear of example of this with Abram in our scriptures. God's promise to Abram to make of him a great nation and it is with Abram's faith in that promise that he leaves the land and house of his father. We hear of the promise today but what we can so easily forget is that Sarai, Abram's wife, was barren, they were childless and had no heir to carry on their legacy. Yet it is with Abram's faith and trust in God's promise that he does as the LORD instructs him to do. And eventually God does come through on his promise.

In the midst of this challenge, God reveals God's glory. Not to change reality: Sarai and Abram were still childless, Jesus still goes to the cross, and we still have obstacles we face in this life. But the revelation of this glory becomes a way of assuring us that God is with us. Regardless of the struggles that we face, may we be assured that our God is with us.

The food pantry at St. Joan of Arc, in Toledo (the internship parish Eric Kaufman is at) is empty. Since Mid-October the parish food pantry has been helping 200-250 families each week. # START A NEW HABIT - SPEND TIME WITH GOD'S WORDS

# 2<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY LENT LESSON ON LECTIO DIVINA – DIVINE PRAYER

Lectio divina is a method of praying the Scriptures. What better way to get to know God than by spending time with God's spoken word? The practice of lectio divina traces its roots back to the early centuries in the Church. By the sixth century, St. Benedict had made it a regular practice in most monasteries. Today lectio divina is a widely held practice by many laymen and laywomen. Lectio divina is a slow, rhythmic reading and praying of a Scripture passage. You pick a passage and read it. Notice what arises within you as you read it. Then you read it again, and then again, noticing what words and phrases grab your heart and noticing the feelings that arise. You respond to God about whatever is stirring within as you read and pray with the passage. Finally, you rest and let God respond and speak to you.

Let's consider the formal steps. To begin, you might open with a short prayer, (see Holy Spirit Prayer below). Ask God to guide your prayer time. Try to silence your mind and put off the cares of the day. You could make an act of Faith, Hope, and Charity. Simply; Lord I believe in You help my unbelief, Lord I Hope in You increase my Trust in You, Lord I Love You show me how to love You more. Then do the following:

**READ** - Slowly and thoughtfully, read the Scripture passage the first time.

Did a word or phrase capture your attention and grab your heart? Linger with it whenever this happens.

**REFLECT-** Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. What is God saying to you in this passage? offering you? asking you? What feelings are arising within you?

**RESPOND** - Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. Respond to God from your heart. Speak to God of your feelings and insights. Offer these to God.

REST - Possibly read the passage another time. Sit quietly in God's presence, asking, "What are you saying to me?" Rest in God's love and listen.

CONCRETE RESOLUTION - What is God calling you to do with what He has said to you. Practice a virtue like generosity, apologize to someone, do a kind act for someone who may have come to mind during your prayer time etc. As you end your prayer period, you might close with an Our Father or another short prayer. It might be helpful to jot down in a journal what arose during this time. What did you say to God, and what did God offer you?

# **Come Holy Spirit Prayer:**

Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful, enkindle in us the fire of your love, send forth your Spirit and we shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth

O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit, help us to know what is truly right and always rejoice in his consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent

Gospel <u>Mt 17:1-9</u>

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."
