

FROM THE DESK OF FR. MATT

I would like to wish all great-grandmothers, grandmother, mothers, and Godmothers a Happy Mother's Day. I would like to extend a warm welcome to Fr. Steve Dos Santos, C.PP.S. the National Vocation Director for the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. I invited him to come and preach at our Masses this weekend. We often view someone in Fr. Steve's position as being like a military recruiter someone needing to get x number of good men recruited to go to the seminary each year. This is not exactly the role of a vocation director. Each one of us has the task of paying attention to signs in young men that we think would be good a priest and encourage those young men to consider the possibility of the priesthood. We heard an example of this last week in the scriptures when the twelve instructed the "Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with Spirit and wisdom" (Acts 6:3). It is from this instruction that we get the first deacons. Who are the seven reputable young in Glandorf filled with Spirit and wisdom? So, what is the role of a Vocation Director? The role of a vocation director has multiple folds and I would like to highlight a couple of those folds. One-fold that I would like to highlight would be the fold of accompaniment. Fr. Steve's role is about accompanying people, to whatever vocation that God is calling them. Ideally that would mean journeying with young men to seminary to become priests and brothers with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Many would consider achieving this or this accompaniment to be the ultimate goal to 'success'. But sometimes apart of that accompaniment that is leading young men to other places some to a different religious community, some to diocesan priesthood, and other young men to marriage. Some might consider this accompaniment to be 'failure' on Fr. Steve's part, as strange as this may sound this also is a 'success'. This accompaniment is a success because he is leading an individual to where God is calling him. I once heard Fr. Steve tell young man that he was accompanying that was trying to discern priesthood or marriage "I am not sure what vocation God is calling you to marriage or the priesthood, I just want an invitation to your wedding or ordination." A second fold of vocation ministry is about sharing and teaching on the topic of vocations in a variety of different ways. Fr. Steve did this on Friday morning as he talked to our CCD students and as he preaches here this weekend. A third fold of vocation ministry is finding ways to make connections with young men this part of the reason that I invited to preach this weekend. But sometimes Fr. Steve might have young man interested in the priesthood or brotherhood and might bring that young man to different places that we serve to meet other Missionaries of the Precious Blood.

Fr. Steve, welcome to St. John's and may God bless you in your ministry. May your words this weekend inspire, young men to consider the possibility of the priesthood.

Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday- Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident-leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call.

Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.







Shortly after his Resurrection, Jesus accompanied two disciples on their journey from Jerusalem to Emmaus—walking with them in their grief, offering hope, and finally revealing himself through the breaking of the bread. Jesus wants to do the same for YOU!

This will be one of the largest Eucharistic pilgrimages in history. Just as throngs followed Christ throughout his earthly ministry, our nation will process with our Eucharistic Lord through cities, along highways, and past rural towns on his way to the 10th National Eucharistic Congress.
