In this weekend readings we celebrate the Ascension of Jesus. In the first reading we hear of Jesus ascending into the sky. The clouds cover Him, and the disciples stand and stare at the point of His disappearance. Where has Jesus the Messiah gone? And what are we to do until He returns? As to the first question, we can say without hesitation that His physical ascension does not tell us

where he has gone; but the opening prayer does. "God our Father," we pray, "may we follow him into the new

creation." By His physical ascension, Jesus expressed His

passage beyond time and space, into eternity, to dwell with the Father and share His glory. What does Jesus' departure mean to us? In a negative way, it means He will no longer be visibly present. His work on earth as mortal man is finished. But let us also see what it means positively. Jesus spoke of its meaning for us. At the Last Supper He said, "I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go, I will send Him to you." Thus, the departure of Jesus is the necessary prelude to Pentecost. But what are we to do until He returns? Certainly, we are not to stand staring up to the sky, as the two men in white tell the disciples who witnessed the Ascension. We have work to do. After death, we will be raised up and ascend to the father. Until then we must live as a people destined for eternity. And if that is so, we need God's new game plan for human life. Jesus expressed part of the game plan in today's Gospel. Make disciples of all the nations, baptize them, and teach them the way of Christ. We, His body, are to complete His task. The work of Christians is to

spread the Gospel. And we do this by living it out in our lives through social reform and charity. We become that beacon of Light that Christ calls us to be. We live out our lives as followers of Jesus Christ.

At the National Eucharistic Congress, the Church will draw into a deeper intimacy with our Eucharistic Lord, allowing our eyes to be opened and our hearts to be set on fire with his love.

The whole Congress will be an experience of prayer: a liturgical act offering the Catholic Church—those in attendance in Indianapolis as well as across the country—to the Father, through the Son, and in the

Holy Spirit. This reconsecration will result in a massive outpouring of grace and renewed missionary sending as participants are moved to share the Eucharistic love of the Lord "for the life of the world" (John 6:51).
