In the name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit. We invoke the Holy Trinity when we begin our prayers, at the beginning of Mass, and many other times during prayer and liturgies. By itself, it is a quick short prayer. The Holy Trinity is a mystery we can't fully understand. Three persons, one divine nature. One God in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Trinity is fully embraced in the Sacraments. When we were baptized, the words of the Holy Trinity are one of the requirements to make a valid baptism. "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The Priest's prayer of absolution during the Sacrament of Reconciliation calls down the Holy Trinity for absolution.

We hear the Holy Trinity called upon throughout the Mass, the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist.

In the Sacrament of Confirmation we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit which are given to us by the Father and the Son.

During the Sacrament of Matrimony, the couple's rings are blessed in the name of the Holy Trinity and the man and woman each place the other's wedding ring on their finger in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders includes the Bishop calling for the Holy Spirit to strengthen the gifts of the Holy Spirit in the order of Deacon, renewal of the Spirit of holiness for Priests, and for the Holy Spirit to pour perfect power upon the Bishop. All of these being invoked from the Father and the Son to work in love with the One Triune God in their ministry.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick brings blessing through the Father and the Son in love and mercy to help with the grace of the Holy Spirit asking to save and raise up the sick.

We sometimes take for granted all of the numerous times we call upon the Holy Trinity and how the Holy Trinity is working in our lives.

The importance of the Holy Trinity in the life of the Church can even be recognized in the Catechism of the Catholic Church in which most of paragraphs 189 all the way through paragraph 701 provide us information about the Holy Trinity.

So the next time you make the sign of the cross and say "in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit", remember the mystery and importance of the Holy Trinity in our spiritual lives. One God in three persons.

May the Holy Trinity guide you in all you do.

Catechism Corner

The Most Holy Trinity

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, therefore today's readings reveal to us that God is one, but that His Divinity is revealed in the Holy Trinity: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Though you will never find the word "Trinity" in Scripture, God has revealed this reality throughout many passages in Scripture.

In today's readings you will find reference to the Trinity in the second reading, 2 Corinthians 13:11-13, as St. Paul exhorts us with, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you."

In the Gospel Acclamation, Revelation 1:8, we proclaim, "Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; to God who is, who was, and who is to come."

And in the Gospel, John 3:16-18, we hear Jesus speak of the Trinity when He says to Nicodemus, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son."

This begs to ask, what does the Church teach on the Holy Trinity? The Catechism of the Catholic Church numbers 261-267 states, "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and the Christian life. God alone can make it known to us by revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Incarnation of God's Son reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father, the Son is one and the same God. The mission of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father in the name of the Son (Jn 14:26) and by the Son "from the Father" (Jn 15:26), reveals that, with them, the Spirit is one and the same God. "With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified" (Nicene Creed). The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father as the first principle and, by the eternal gift of this to the Son, from the communion of both the Father and the Son" (St. Augustine). By the grace of Baptism "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit", we are called to share in the life of the Blessed Trinity, here on earth in the obscurity of faith, and after death in eternal light. "Now this is the Catholic Faith: We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Father is one, the Son's is another, the Holy Spirit's another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal". Inseparable in what they are, the divine persons are also inseparable in what they do. But within the single divine operation each shows forth what is proper to him in the Trinity, especially in the divine missions of the Son's Incarnation and the gift of the Holy Spirit."

In short, God has revealed Himself as one God, yet three Divine Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Since each Person is *the*

THE PROMISE

My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment."



HOW TO PRACTICE

1. Go to Holy Communion
2. Make a Sacramental Confession (within about 8 days before or after)
3. Pray for the intentions of the Sacred Heart

All on the First Friday of 9 consecutive months.



WHY?

To make reparation for sins and to grow in love and trust in the Divine Heart of Jesus.

WHAT THE CHURCH TEACHES

♥ At Fatima in 1917, Our Lady asked the children to make reparation for sins committed against Her Immaculate Heart.

THE PROMISE

Our Lady promised:

"I promise to assist at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation all those who, in order to make reparation to Me, on the first Saturdays of five consecutive months, shall go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep Me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries."



HOW TO PRACTICE

1. Go to Holy Communion
2. Make a Sacramental Confession (within about 8 days before or after)
3. Pray 5 decades of the Rosary
4. Keep Our Lady company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries

All on the First Saturday of 5 consecutive months.

To console the Immaculate Heart of Mary, to make reparation, and to help bring peace to the world and the conversion of souls.

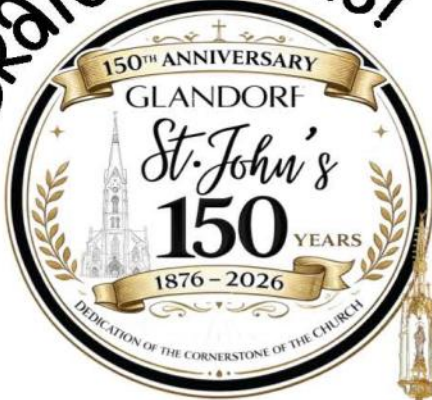

Cornerstone 150 - Article #3 (Continued)

Not until 1888 were new pews finally purchased for the current church. Seating in the current church was originally brought over from the 1848 building, and additional simple pews were made by parishioners. Each pew had a number, and it would be auctioned off yearly to raise funds. At one time, women sat on the left side of the church and men on the right. Also, the country kids would sit with the Sisters up above the sacristies, never really seeing much of the Mass, other than incense rising to the ceiling.

Over the years, more shrines were added: The Mission Cross, Sacred Heart of Mary, the Pieta (Sorrowful Mother), Sacred Heart of Jesus, St. Gaspar, and the Holy Family. Another statue once in the church was that of St. Jude (Thaddeus).
