When is the end of the world going to come? No one seems to know when it is going to happen, but you know as much as no one knows, people like to guess the when. I remember several years ago I went on a silent retreat, and I was disconnected from television, internet, and most connections from the outside world. During the retreat I met with a spiritual director and when we met the spiritual director said that world was supposed

to end that day and I think I was told the exact hour of the when. Either we missed the end of the world or whoever made this prediction was wrong. think this predictor got it wrong and not that we missed the end. People keep trying to guess and they keep guessing wrong. You think after a while they just might give up. Jesus in the scriptures tells us about the end. Jesus tells us that "of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Be watchful! Be alert" (Mark 13:32-33). Point being we do not know when the end is coming, it is a mystery but we are called to be ready for the end. Jesus in our scriptures today does not speak of the when but tells us about the signs to pay attention to that points to the end. Jesus says that there is going to be wars, insurrections, earthquakes, famines, plagues, awesome sights, and mighty signs. Jesus speaks of a time of great persecution. Jesus tells us the signs to pay attention to and you know as I look at what is going on in our world right now it would appear that some of these signs are happening, are we nearing the end? Perhaps? If we are nearing the end, what should we be doing? Is there anything different that we should be doing? Are you ready for the end?

I think it depends, are we living our lives the way that the Lord wants us to be living our lives? If our answer is yes, then no we do not need to be making any changes to our lives. If our answer is no we are not living our lives the way the Lord wants us to be living our lives then we need to make some changes. In our scriptures today we hear "you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays" (Malachi 3:20). Jesus tells us in our time of persecution that we are not to fear, he will gives us the words to speak and no harm will come to us.

Are we living our lives the way the Lord wants us to or are we not living our lives not the way the Lord wants us to? The answer would seem to be black and white we are either doing what Lord wants or we are not. But I do not think the answer is that simple. If we look at our lives we can point to plenty of examples in our lives how we are doing what the Lord wants to do we pray, we go to Mass, we help people that are in need, and the list goes on. At the same time there are examples in our lives where we are not doing the things Lord would want us to do, each one of us are sinners, we have room for growth in our lives, we need to make a few changes. As we anticipate the coming end what more do you need to do to be ready for the end. What do you need to do to prepare for your finals?


