The readings this weekend point to the end times and this is typical as we wind down to the end of the church calendar. In the first reading Malachi talks about the day when the evildoers will be set on fire. Jesus in the Gospel, talks about wars, insurrections, famines, earthquakes, and plagues that will occur in the end times. And there will not be a stone left on another stone that won't be thrown down. Jesus is talking about the destruction of Jerusalem and of the Temple. For Jews, the destruction of these two meant the end of the world would be near. And for this reason, the Church uses this Gospel passage as one of its readings at the end of the liturgical year. It wants us to reflect on the end of the world. It reminds us of the moment when the world as we know it will pass away. And it also reminds us to ask ourselves, "How prepared are we for this moment when it comes." So, as we think about how we are standing spiritually in this present day, let us ask ourselves how we are doing with this one aspect of life? How are we dealing with this one virtue and the one greatest of all? That of love.? How loving are our thoughts? How loving are our words toward others? How loving are our actions when we deal with others? So, as we listen to the readings this weekend, let us ask

the Lord to give us minds that will think thoughts of kindness and fairness. Let us ask the Lord to give us words that will speak of truth and charity. And give us hands that will help others like You did for Your people in Your time. I hope you have a great a spirit-filled weekend and one that is Christ centered. God bless all.

CHILD ABUSE OR NEGLECT

All suspected or actual acts of physical or sexual child abuse, or neglect, must be reported to the Putnam County Job and Family Services by calling 567-376-3777. Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday-Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident--leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call.

Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.

In response to their inquiries, these people are properly instructed so that you can discern (through reflection and prayer) whether you are indeed called to Catholicism. Catechism Corner

THE LAST THINGS-DEATH, JUDGMENT, HEAVEN, HELL

Death is perhaps the most sobering reminder of our human fragility, yet in the Catholic faith, it is not the end. It is a door through which the soul crosses into eternity. In the Catholic faith, death is the end of earthly life but not of existence. It is a consequence of original sin, yet, through Christ's own death and resurrection, death is no longer a final defeat but a passage (CCC 1006–1009).

Particular Judgment: A Personal Encounter With Truth The Church teaches that at the moment of death, the soul separates from the body (CCC 1005) and undergoes what the Church calls the Particular Judgment (CCC 1021–1022). This is a revelation of truth in the presence of Divine Love. The soul sees its life laid bare before God, In Hebrews 9:27 we read, "It is appointed for men to die once, and after that comes judgment." Jesus also affirms this when He teaches that every idle word shall be accounted for (Matthew 12:36). The Particular Judgment determines the soul's eternal destiny: entrance into Heaven (immediately or after purification in Purgatory), or separation from God, which the Church calls Hell. This judgment reflects the soul's state at death — its openness to grace and its friendship with God.

Heaven: Union with the Holy Trinity The Catechism (CCC 1023–1029) teaches that Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness. In Heaven, all who are perfectly purified enjoy eternal communion with the Triune God, the Virgin Mary, the angels, and all the saints

Purgatory: The Fire of Mercy, Not Punishment For souls who die in God's grace but are not yet perfected in holiness, Purgatory is a gift of purification (CCC 1030–1031). This doctrine is rooted in Scripture and tradition. In 1 Corinthians 3:15, Paul speaks of a person being saved "as through fire." This isn't damnation, but purification. 2 Maccabees 12:44–46 shows Judas Maccabeus offering prayers for the dead, indicating belief in a purifying state after death.

Hell: The Reality of Free Will and Rejection of God While God's mercy is boundless, His justice honors human freedom. The Church affirms the reality of Hell (CCC 1033 –1037), not to frighten, but to uphold the seriousness of our moral choices. Jesus speaks plainly about Hell in Matthew 25:41–46, where He describes the final separation of those who have served Him in love and those who have rejected Him in their treatment of the poor and vulnerable. Hell is self–exclusion from communion with God and the blessed, chosen freely and definitively by the soul that refuses repentance. Yet the Church never presumes to know who is in Hell. Her saints — including Faustina, Catherine of Siena, and Ignatius of Loyola — constantly affirm God's desire that no soul be lost. Even as we affirm Hell's reality, we are called to trust God's mercy and labor in hope for all souls.

The Elimination of the Theory of Limbo Historically, some theologians posited the idea of Limbo — a state of natural happiness for unbaptized infants who died without personal sin but carried original sin. This was never official Church doctrine. In 2007, the International Theological Commission, with the approval of Pope Benedict XVI, concluded that we may hope unbaptized infants are saved. The Catechism (CCC 1261) now affirms that "the Church entrusts these children to the mercy of God." This shift reflects a deeper theological insight into the nature of God's mercy, sacramental grace, and the mysterious workings of divine love.

Living in Light of the Last Things, The saints have shown us the way to live in hope, love, and readiness. The sacraments, especially Confession and the Eucharist, keep us tethered to grace. The Church, drawing from Scripture, tradition, and reason, offers these teachings not as threats, but as invitations. Christ has gone to prepare a place for us (John 14:3). When He returns in glory, He will gather all to Himself, and the dead shall rise incorruptible (1 Corinthians 15:52). This is the hope that animates Catholic life. Not fear of death, but the promise of eternal life — the homecoming of every soul into the loving arms of the Father.



We're blessed with a dedicated team who each take a half-hour time slot to lead prayer in church.






