# FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Do you got talent?

We often associate having talent with athletes, musicians, actors, and anyone who might have a specialty skill. We often want to know the source of the talent; we often attribute it to genetics or hours of training and practice, or even one that mentored the talent. We look to these examples of talent but what about those that have talent with were it really matters like being a father or mother, a good friend, being depended on in time of need, or to get to heaven. These are also qualities that go into having talent that we can overlook, and they would seem to be most important. Sometimes we can possess a talent that can seem to not make a difference, or it might seem to be not true or honest, sometimes we might even have talent that we are little embarrassed that we have. In these instances, we might shy away from or not want to share our talent. But the Lord wants us to share this talent. In our scriptures today we encounter a landowner going on trip and the landowner entrusts his possessions to his servants. To the first servant he gave five talents, to the second servant two talents, and the third servant one talent. We hear that the servants that received five and two talents, trade and double the number of talents that they were given. These two servants get awarded for their efforts. We also hear about the servant that started with one talent that buried it in the ground. We hear this master call this servant lazy, gets the talent taken away from him, and this servant gets thrown out. This third servant gets punished it is easy for us to want and join in the criticism of this third servant.

But you know I find interesting what this third servant says about his Master's wealth "Master, I knew, you were a demanding person, harvesting where you did not plant and gathering were you did not scatter" (Matthew 25:24). This servant knew that his Master's wealth was not honest he harvested where he did not plant and gathered things where he did not scatter. And so, this servant did nothing with his master's money.

This parable of trading of talents is like a stock market trading/investing of money, we often associate talents with things that we are good at, things that set us apart from others. And in a certain sense the market trading of money and the use of what we consider to be talents are similar. The Lord blesses each one of us with honest, great, and true talents. As we use and develop those talents the Lord seems to bless us with more and new talents. Sometimes the talents we can receive at times might not seem to honest or true talents, and like the third servant in our scriptures we do not want to use those talents. Yet the Lord challenges us to use those talents for as we use those talents that seem to not be true or honest, we become comfortable with them and not afraid to use them.

A talent that all have when it comes to Mass is to sing. Now some are more gifted with this talent than others. Regardless of our talent level we are called to share. Those that have good voice to give thanks to God for giving you that

voice and for those that think they have a bad voice to get back at God for giving you that bad voice.

As we begin this week of Thanksgiving there are many things for us to be grateful for. One of the things that I think we are called to be grateful for are our talents God has given us. May we use all the talents God has given us even those that we might think are true, as a way of giving thanks to God.
