From the Desk of Fr. Matt Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical year and today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe. We celebrate Jesus as our king today and when we think of kings and queens and people of royalty certain images come to our minds. We think of this person wearing a crown. A crown that is made of precious metal gold and/or silver with diamonds and rubies helping it to stand out even more. We think of this person dressed

in the finest robe, a robe that is made of the finest materials perhaps silk and perhaps even some stones are sewed into the robe. We think of the throne that they are sitting on the finest piece of furniture made from either wood and/or stone. Crafted by the best carpenters and/or stone masons. We might picture this person having a



scepter in hand. And I picture this person of royalty thinking very highly of himself or herself, they have a high ego, they are all about them and how their subjects can better serve them.

Today as we celebrate Jesus Christ King of the Universe, in our scriptures today we encounter a different king then what is described above. The Jesus that we encounter in our scriptures today does not have a crown made of gold or silver but is a crown of thorns, thorns that cause blood to drop from his head. Jesus is not dressed in finest robe, rather he is not clothed but full exposed for us to see. The thrown is not the finest piece of crafted furniture, it was not crafted by the best carpenter or stone mason, his thrown is two pieces of wood that have come together to make the cross. There is no scepter in his hand, are nails through his hands fastening him to the cross. I present to you, Jesus Christ Our King of the Universe. Jesus crucified and dying a criminal's death, I would imagine this is not what you think of when you think of Jesus as being king. Then again Jesus is not your typical king either.

Jesus as king is not about himself but of his subjects us. In this scene of his crucifixion that we read in scriptures "Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34). Jesus from the cross is not seeking revenge but is giving forgiveness and mercy. The repentant criminal, whose crime is deserving of death cries out to Jesus for mercy and Jesus tells him "Today you will be with me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43). Jesus our king, is not your typical king, he is a king of mercy. We read about in the scriptures but most importantly each one has experienced the mercy of Jesus Christ King of the Universe as well. We experience this mercy every time we go to confession or receive the gift of the Eucharist. Another way that I like to experience the mercy of Jesus is at the foot of the crucifix. It is here that I place my brokenness in the brokenness of Jesus our king and receive healing.

Jesus Christ is the king of universe, let us celebrate him as our king. Let celebrate him not as we picture him to be, but who he really is.


