Hello Everyone,

I hope and pray that all are well. THANK YOU again for all of the continued love, prayers, and support.

Overall, life at the seminary has been going pretty well, but as in life, there can be bumps along the way. My classes this semester have been really enjoyable, especially the preaching, church history, wisdom scripture, and sex ethics classes. I have learned quite a bit; now, it is just a matter of trying to remember everything. That is where I rely on the help of the Holy Spirit.

We had an in-house retreat back in October, with Bishop Robert Coerver, from Lubbock, Texas, as our retreat master. It was a nice relaxing break from the academic workload and busy daily schedule. All of the bishop's conferences were very informative, summarizing the Ignatian spiritual exercises while including great human and pastoral information from his own experiences as a priest and bishop. Some short takeaways from the week were:

- Always remember God is always by your side. No matter if you are in a group or alone. He is there.
- We are all from love, of love, and for love and God is love.
- The preacher first is preaching to himself.
- Vocation is to do the will of God. (When we do God's will, we are at peace interiorly.)
- We are all broken, and God can make use of our brokenness. (God can make good come from an evil act.)
- You may know of God. But do you know God? (Do you have a personal, prayerful relationship with Jesus Christ?)

Recently the second theologians, including myself, received the institution of acolyte. This is another stepping stone towards the priesthood. Before the Second Vatican Council in the early 1960s, there were seven of these steps divided into minor and major orders. The four minor orders were: porter, lector, exorcist, and acolyte. The three major orders were: subdeacon, deacon, and priest. Now there is lector, which I received last fall (2020), acolyte, and then the next step is the diaconate, and then the priesthood. Now, in addition to being able to, in a sense officially lector, as an instituted acolyte, I am officially able to serve the Mass, distribute Holy Communion, expose and repose the Eucharist, prepare the altar, and I can help remove items from the altar and purify the sacred vessels after Holy Communion. I am still an extraordinary minister, and not yet the ordinary minister for Holy Communion as the priest is, but being instituted means I can help do more than just what a commissioned extraordinary minister can do.

Some other happenings this semester was our annual seminary golf outing and Solemn Vespers and choral concerts. With the next Solemn Vespers and concert being on Tuesday, December 7th at 7:30p.m. If you are interested, feel free to tune in online to enjoy the music and to experience just a small part of the vast treasury of music the church offers. It will be live-streamed on the seminary website: www.athenaeum.edu

Helping at RCIA has been a blast. It is always great to be out in a parish helping others. I even recently taught my first lesson on the "Universal Call to Holiness." Teaching was something that I was nervous about, but it went really well. I was comfortable and clear, and all understood the points I was trying to make. I just need to remember to keep the volume of my voice loud enough to be heard in the back of the room. But overall, all positive feedback. For some ideas about the call to holiness, look up St. Francis de Sales and his book *Introduction to a Devout Life* and the Little Way of St. Thérèse of Lisieux.

Here in November is Vocation Awareness Week. As I stated above, as an insight from the retreat, our vocation is to do the will of God. For some, that is married life or single life, but for some, that is religious life. Pray to God, and ask Him what He needs us to do. Stop in the church if possible, and if you can pray before the Eucharist, whether in the tabernacle or in the monstrance at adoration, for He is the giver of all. God is who gave us our life. Shouldn't we at least ask Him what He would like us to do with it? Also, every religious vocation comes from where? A Family! So, parents, grandparents, uncles, aunts, friends, neighbors, parishioners encourage kids and young adults to pray and ask God what He wants them to do and to try and explore religious life. For if it is not even mentioned by adults, are we really doing our part to help kids discern? Many are quick to ask what do you want to be when you grow up? But maybe we should ask what does God want you to be when you grow up? He must increase. I must decrease. (John 3:30)
