START A NEW HABIT - SPEND TIME WITH GOD'S WORDS

1st SUNDAY ADVENT - LECTIO DIVINA – DIVINE PRAYER

Lectio divina is a method of praying the Scriptures. What better way to get to know God than by spending time with God's spoken word?

The practice of *lectio divina* traces its roots back to the early centuries in the Church. By the sixth century, [St. Benedict](#) had made it a regular practice in most monasteries. Today *lectio divina* is a widely held practice by many laymen and laywomen.

Lectio divina is a slow, rhythmic reading and praying of a Scripture passage. You pick a passage and read it. Notice what arises within you as you read it. Then you read it again, and then again, noticing what words and phrases grab your heart and noticing the feelings that arise. You respond to God about whatever is stirring within as you read and pray with the passage. Finally, you rest and let God respond and speak to you.

Let's consider the formal steps. To begin, you might open with a short prayer, (see Holy Spirit Prayer below). Ask God to guide your prayer time. Try to silence your mind and put off the cares of the day. You could make an act of Faith, Hope, and Charity. Simply; Lord I believe in You help my unbelief, Lord I Hope in You increase my Trust in You, Lord I Love You show me how to love You more. Then do the following:

Read.

Slowly and thoughtfully, read the Scripture passage the first time.

Did a word or phrase capture your attention and grab your heart? Linger with it whenever this happens.

Reflect.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. What is God saying to you in this passage? offering you? asking you? What feelings are arising within you?

Respond.

Slowly and prayerfully, read the passage again. Respond to God from your heart. Speak to God of your feelings and insights. Offer these to God.

Rest.

Possibly read the passage another time. Sit quietly in God's presence, asking, "What are you saying to me?" Rest in God's love and listen.

Concrete resolution.

What is God calling you to do with what He has said to you. Practice a virtue like generosity, apologize to someone, do a kind act for someone who may have come to mind during your prayer time etc.

As you end your prayer period, you might close with an Our Father or another short prayer. It might be helpful to jot down in a journal what arose during this time. What did you say to God, and what did God offer you?

Come Holy Spirit Prayer:

*Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful, enkindle in us the fire of your love, send forth your Spirit and we shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth
O God, by the light of the Holy Spirit you have taught the hearts of your faithful. In the same Spirit, help us to know what is truly right and always rejoice in his consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen*

1st Sunday of Advent

Gospel

Mt 24:37-44

Jesus said to his disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. In those days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day that Noah entered the ark. They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away. So will it be also at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be out in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

**From the
Desk of
Fr. Matt**

Happy New Year! Today we begin a new liturgical year, and we begin a new liturgical season, the Season of Advent. As we begin this season the day light hours during this time of the year keep getting shorter and shorter each day. We long for more day light hours like what we have in the summer but the light that we long for is for the light of Christ to come present. As part of that longing, we light the candles on our Advent Wreath. At the end of

this season, we anticipate celebrating the birth of Jesus. As journey in this season, we anticipate the coming of Christ. In the scriptures today, we hear Jesus echo the words “you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come” (Matthew 24:44).

Be ready for the unexpected hour is what we are called to do during this season. But I will be honest and say this is not exactly my lived of this season. We live busy lives, if at normal busy speed for life moves at 75 mph, when the Season of Advent comes the speed of life seems to get even faster from 75 mph to 100 mph. Which can seem to make it hard to live up to the expectation of this season is supposed to be.

I remember back in the days when I was a student, the start of Advent coincided with the end of semester. Which meant finishing up final papers and projects and getting ready for final exams. It was a busy and chaotic and sometimes I wonder how I ever got everything done? Much less do anything to prepare for Christ to come. Even my life as a priest in Dayton life during Advent life seemed to get rather busy, so busy I found it hard get my Christmas Shopping done. Life seemed to be so busy, I am not sure if I did anything to prepare for Christ to come. Now I am in Glandorf, I do not anticipate anything being any different. Our lives are busy how can we have time to be prepared?

This week I plan to get away for a few days to go deer hunting and I like to think deer hunting and Advent share some similarities. When I go deer hunting it is important to stay quiet and still and you do not know when the deer will be coming. I typically do not have success in my deer hunting hopefully that changes this week, but I always enjoy the gift of sitting out in nature in silence and studying the gift of God’s creation even if I do not get a deer.

In our scriptures today, Jesus repeats the phrase “one will be taken, and one will be left” (Matthew 24:40). This phrase can make many of us feel uncomfortable, questioning what it means to be taken or what it means to be left. Do I want to be taken or do I want to be left? We are called to be ready for Christ’s coming at the unknown hour. So often we associate our needing be ready to mean that we need to do something extraordinary. Do we really need to do anything extraordinary? Perhaps we do not need to do anything extraordinary. Perhaps it is in doing the ordinary that we can also be ready. In our scriptures today, we hear of two doing work, working in the field and grinding at mill. Work that would seem to be rather ordinary. It is in this ordinary that they were proved to be ready. How in the ordinary things that you do each day are you preparing for the Lord to come?

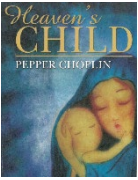
