

Hi Everyone,

Thank you for your continued prayers and support. Please know that you remain in my prayers as well. It seems hard to believe that I am ten weeks into the pastoral internship year at St. Joan of Arc. Time is just flying by.

Here, at the parish, they have welcomed me with open arms, and it is a busy place. There are many different parish groups and organizations, from the parish school, adult education, and food pantry to the Knights of Columbus, the Daughters of Mary, the comfort quilters, and many more. All of them are doing what they can to bring Christ to others.

As for me, I am involved with helping with the different liturgies (daily and Sunday Masses, weddings, and funerals), adoration, and benediction. I also get the chance to sit in on marriage prep meetings, and recently I attended the Joy-Filled Marriage program for engaged couples. The couples who presented did a fantastic job, and I enjoyed learning from their experiences. I am convinced that a strong marriage prep program is one of the best ways to get and keep couples and families focused on God and involved in the Catholic Faith.

I have given several presentations over my internship; from funeral home ministry, prayer and discernment, to vocations. I am also teaching the 8th-grade kids who attend PREP/CCD on Wednesday nights, preparing them for Confirmation in the spring—helping them to understand that, as a friend of mine said, the sacrament of Confirmation is not graduation from the Catholic Faith.

A few other highlights from this fall semester have been stopping in at a couple of the local nursing homes, sitting in on the adult faith education classes, visiting with the school kids at lunch and after Mass, and helping out with the food pantry at the parish each week. I love the parish life.

Each day in the parish is always different from the rest, for you never quite know what will come up or how things will go. I start my day with quiet time for prayer and Mass, so to be ready for the day and open to what might come up. I accomplish what I have scheduled daily and do my best to exercise a ministry of presence, being present to others, listening, and talking with them about whatever is on their hearts and minds. I continue to take time for more prayer throughout the day while including time for some self-care.

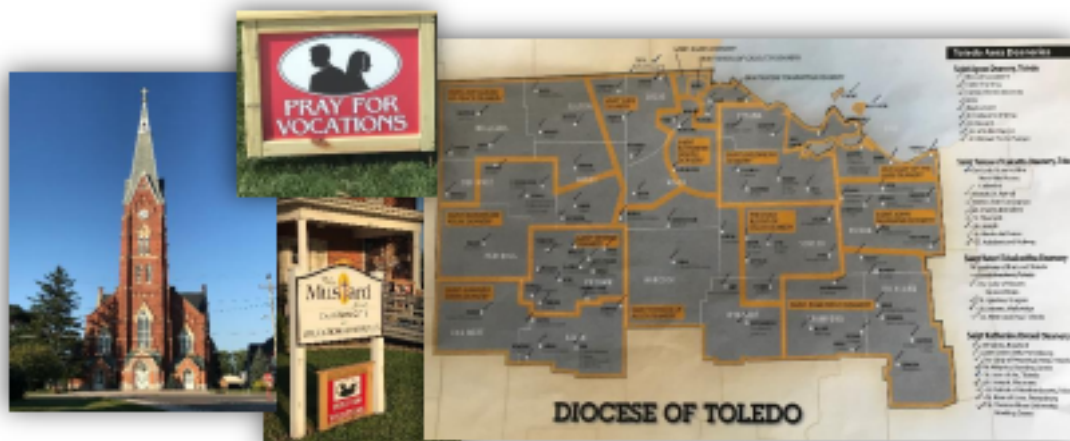
Monsignor Borger has been great to live with and is an excellent priest to learn from, whether about the liturgy or canon law, parish life or priestly life, and even cooking. My recipe collection continues to grow. Looking back, I have been very blessed to have lived with and learned from many wonderful priests: from priests that have served in Glandorf, to different priests at the seminary, to priests here in the Toledo Diocese, to friends of mine who are now ordained or soon will be ordained. I thank God for them all and their example of how they bring the love of God to others in different ways.

In my letter from September, I mentioned information on vocations, from the number of religious vocations that have come from St. John's in Glandorf, to the vocation umbrella idea I had, to ways to help encourage vocations. I briefly mentioned the Pray for Vocations yard signs. Well, with the help of a local parishioner and others who donated, this idea grew from six signs, around the Glandorf area, to signs being placed throughout the entire nineteen-county Diocese of Toledo. With a sign given to each of the 122 parishes in the diocese, the Sorrowful Mother Shrine, Catholic high schools, and to several homes in Putnam County. It is incredible to see one small idea take off and grow. If you are interested in a pray for vocations sign for your home, they are located at the Mustard Seed Gift Shop. The cost is just a donation, with the proceeds going towards more signs and the diocesan vocations office. Let us all do our part to help encourage discernment and prayer, so all will come to know the vocation God has planned for them.

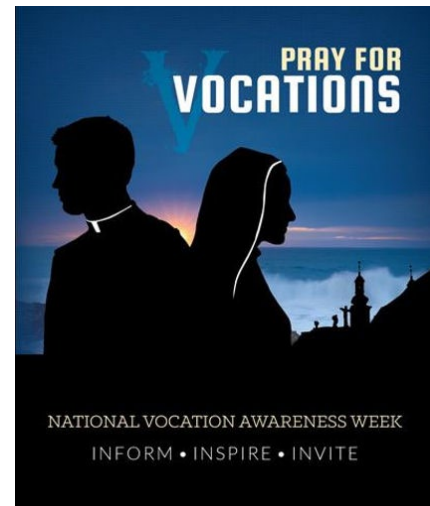

**From the
Desk of
Fr. Matt**

Today we begin National Vocations Awareness Week. During this week we are called to be aware and pray for the increase in vocations to the priesthood, religious sisters and brothers, deacons, married life and single. Each vocation is important, and each vocation has a special gift to give to the church. Each one of us, by the grace of our baptism, has a special gift to share with the church and if we do not share the gift the gift will never be

shared.

In our scriptures today we learn that the Sadducees do not believe in a resurrection. So, they question Jesus about resurrection. Many times when we ask questions, we ask because we want to learn/know something. What time is it? How can I? Where is? When? Why? The Sadducees questioning Jesus about resurrection they are not trying to learn or wanting to know something. Rather, they ask to ridicule and make the point that there is no such thing as resurrection. They use the example of a woman married to a man; he dies with them having no children between them. In the Jewish culture of the time women relied on the protection of a man, either a father, husband, or a son. In our scriptures we learn of Moses instruction “If someone’s brother dies leaving a



wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother” (Luke 20:28). They go on to say if seven of this man’s brothers were married to this woman and they want to know at the resurrection who she will belong to. They ask thinking that they are right. But Jesus counters the Sadducees point by pointing out that our God is a God of the living, not of the dead.

As we journey in life and in faith, we journey thinking we know things and a lot of the things we think we know are not necessarily true. We get stuck in knowing what we think we know and shut ourselves off from learning what is true. As we begin National Vocations Awareness Week, I think we can do this with vocations. For example, we might see a person that is single as a ‘failed’ vocation ‘why can they not find the right person to marry? Being single is not a ‘failed’ vocation but rather a vocation that has gifts to share that a priest, a married person, or religious cannot offer. Or priests and religious often are thought to have lonely and boring lives, yes, I live alone but I am a Missionary of the Precious Blood and I have brothers in community that support me and I support them in return. I am surrounded by a lot of great people; people love and care for me. And we can make similar assumptions with people who are married. It is when we take time to listen to those who are living their vocation in one other than our own do we learn about another or take the time vocation to do research about the various vocations. The barrier of what we think we know comes down and we really learn about the vocation.

I like to learn about other people’s vocation, I particularly like to hear other people’s vocation story. When I meet with a couple preparing for marriage the first question that I ask the couple is their story. Sometimes they will say their story is nothing special, but it is special, it is their story. I also like to hear about the joys and the struggles, it helps me to see the beauty of the church.

I also reflect on the gift of my own vocation story of what brought me to the Missionaries of the Precious Blood and what lead me to the priesthood. As we journey this National Vocations Awareness Week let us pray for all vocations, let learn about all vocations, and most importantly let us see the gift that each vocation is to the church and the world.
