FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Today is referred to as Respect Life Sunday. On this Sunday we are called to pray for a greater respect for human life from the moment of its first conception in the womb to its natural end in the tomb.

In our scriptures today we encounter a man with two sons. The first son the father asked to work in the vineyard said no and later went and worked in his father's vineyard. The second son, when the father asked him to work in the vineyard, the son first said yes but never went. Jesus asks "Which of the two did the father's will?" (Matthew 21:31). The answer here is rather obvious, the first son did his father's will. You could perhaps say that the first son initially had a little bit of an attitude, but after an adjustment pulled through. The second son on the other hand you could say had good intentions, he did say that he would work in his father's vineyard, but his intentions did match his actions, he never worked in the vineyard. It is good to have good intentions; but it is equally important that our good intentions match our actions.

On this respect life Sunday as we pray for a greater respect of human life, the question for us to ponder is how are, our good intentions to respect human getting put into action? On the surface we like to think of all our good intentions are getting put into action. But if we look just below the surface sometimes our good intentions do not get put into action. Let's face it to follow through on our good intentions at times can be a challenge. I wonder if this is what happened with the sons in the scriptures today. Both sons were aware of the challenges that were part of working in the vineyard. Perhaps that is why the sons responded in the way that they did.

We have our intentions to respect life but sometimes following through on our challenges at times is not always easy. I think of the care that is needed for a family member that is slowly dying, family members intentionally adjusting their lives to help out. Or I think of taking a stand against abortion. Our culture tells us it is not popular to be against abortion. Or on Friday when folks will be going to Columbus for the March for Life and for the November Election as we educate ourselves and our neighbors to prepare to Vote No on issue 1. It is easy to have good intentions to take a stand in these situations, but it can also be hard to follow through in the face of voice of strong opposition. I think also of those women that are most vulnerable to seeking an abortion 75% involving women that are poor or low-income and women of color. It is easy to

have good intentions to want to do things to help these women so that seeking an abortion is not an option, but let's face it, it can be hard to follow through on these intentions and help.

Having good and hard intentions and following through can be a challenge, but we are not alone. Jesus provides us with a model of humbling "himself becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a

cross" (Philippians 2:8). Jesus followed through on his good intentions. May we follow Jesus humbling ourselves and following through on our good intentions.






