

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT October 19, 2025

The actual Feast of St. Gaspar del Bufalo founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, is October 21st. But since this feast is a solemnity for us as Missionaries of the Precious Blood we can and are encouraged by our superior to move the celebration to this weekend so that we can celebrate this feast with as many of parishioners that we can. Who is St. Gaspar del Bufalo?


St. Gaspar was born on January 6, 1786, the Solemnity of the Epiphany so his parents named him after the magi Gaspar Melchior Balthasar. When Gaspar was three months old, he suffered from a smallpox that threatened to leave him blind. His mother took him to the Church of the Gesu and she prayed at the altar of St. Francis Xavier and Gaspar was cured totally and immediately. In his early years Gaspar was concerned for the poor and those in the hospital, often sharing a portion of the food from his meals with them. He would also tutor children that would come in from the countryside to sell their goods, children that otherwise would not receive a formal education.

In 1808, after being ordained a priest, Napoleon wanted Gaspar to sign an oath of allegiance to him. To which Gaspar said, "I cannot, I must not, I will not." Because he would not sign Gaspar was sent into exile and prison and his time in exile was tough. It is during this time that Gaspar begins to develop a devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus.

After Napoleon was overthrown, Gaspar returned to Rome, and he had spirit of wanting to be a missionary and wanted to be like St. Francis Xavier and go to India. The Bishop of Rome, the pope recognizes a gift in Gaspar. Calls him in and tells him that it is a noble task to want to go to India, but a task that is not meant for him. You have a gift for preaching and are needed here in Rome. During the reign of Napolean, the church had become a mess there were priest that signed the oath of allegiance and some that had not. Church attendance had dropped, and some churches even got turned into barns. Gaspar obediently stayed and preached in and around Rome. The gift of his preaching saved the town of Sonnio. A place in the aftermath of Napoleon became very violent, many said the town needed to be wiped off the face of earth. But Gaspar goes to the town with gospels and crucifix and converts and the violence ceases.

St. Gaspar was a missionary and never left far from home. On this World Mission Sunday, we are reminded that we are called to be missionaries, and we do not have to leave from home either. Gaspar wore a mission cross with chain close to his chest and when he preached in the streets, he would also

have a twenty-five-foot crucifix, he used the image of the crucifix to show the depth of God's love through the shedding of Christ's blood. I likewise on Sundays and on other occasions wear a cassock and mission cross with chain close to my chest. When I wear my cassock and mission cross people have made comments wearing that mission cross is a way of attracting vocations, some may see it as a taking a step back in time, and many know our mission cross to be an heirloom that gets passed down to a next Missionary of the Precious Blood. While this may be true, it is not the only reason I wear a cassock and Mission Cross. I wear my Mission Cross because I am a Missionary of the Precious Blood. I wear my Mission Cross to remind myself and others that this is depth of God's love for us through Christ's shedding his blood on the cross, we need this sign of love when the farthest from Christ's love. As missionaries sometimes, we might be called leave far from home and other times stay close to home, regardless of how we are called to be missionary, at the heart of our called to be missionary we called to draw people into the love of our God.

Catechism Corner

St. Gaspar, Salvation and the Precious Blood

St. Gaspar del Bufalo, born in 1786, founded the Congregation of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in 1815. He was a devoted priest and a dedicated missionary. In his missionary travels he invited the faithful to reflect upon and to adore the Precious Blood of Christ. For this reason, he is known as the apostle of the Precious Blood.

Of all devotions the faithful have, devotion to the Precious Blood of Christ is of great significance, as it is the Blood of Christ that we have gained salvation. Christ could have chosen any way to offer salvation for our sins, yet He chose the Cross and the shedding of His blood. Blood is a life force; without it we have no life. The Israelites knew blood was a source of life and saw shedding of blood as an expiation for sins. In the Old Testament (see Leviticus 4:4-7), the Israelites would offer an animal to be sacrificed for their sin. The priest would slaughter the animal and sprinkle their blood around the altar before burning the animal as an offering to God. In the New Testament, St. Peter reminds us salvation was won by the Precious Blood of Christ, "For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect." (1 Peter 1:18-19)

During Gaspar's priesthood, Napoleon was in power in Italy and suppressed the Catholic Faith. Pope Pius VII was arrested and all priests were asked to take an oath of allegiance to the emperor. Gaspar refused saying, "I would rather die or suffer evil than to take such an oath. I cannot. I must not. I will not." He was sentenced to prison. After Napoleon's defeat in 1814, Gaspar was free to return to Rome and the priesthood. He found the faith of the people to be in chaos from their oppression under Napoleon. He, along with a community of men and women, went out to the streets proclaiming the grace of salvation of the Precious Blood in hopes of reinvigorating the Faith in the people. Through the preaching of the truth of the Precious Blood, St. Gaspar assisted in bringing about a spiritual renewal.

We can ask ourselves today: Is our Church in need of a spiritual renewal to understand and respond to the saving power of the Precious Blood of Christ? It seems to be the case, as just this past Spring, the United States completed a three-year Eucharistic Revival. What is it that needed to be "revived"? The latest Pew Research results (Feb 2025) show that among Catholics, only 46% believe receiving the Eucharist is an essential part of the Faith, while 33% said it is important, but not essential and 19% said receiving the Eucharist is not essential. Jesus definitively taught about the Eucharist in John 6: 53-56: "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them."

Let us call upon the intercession of St. Gaspar to bring about a spiritual renewal in our hearts today as he did in 1814. Let us come and adore and receive the Precious Body and Blood of Christ today and every Sunday. Let us not be silent in our faith, but imitate St. Gaspar in the love he had for Christ and His Church by spreading the saving Truth and love of the Precious Blood of Christ.

St. Gaspar is often pictured holding a large crucifix.

Small in stature, St. Gaspar was a powerful preacher who knew the value of a dramatic pose. The crucifix held the people's attention while Gaspar's voice captured their imagination.

St. Gaspar was born in Rome on January 6, 1786.

Because he was born on the Feast of the Epiphany, his parents named him for the three wise men, Gaspar Melchior Baltazar del Bufalo.

From an early age, he felt compelled to help the poor, sick and imprisoned. He knew he wanted to be a priest and a missionary, and was ordained at age 22.

Gaspar lived in turbulent times. Napoleon had invaded what is now Italy, and demanded an oath of allegiance, which Gaspar refused. He was sent into exile along with many priests and even the pope! When he returned to his home country, he founded his religious congregation, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood (C.P.P.S.) on August 15, 1815. Gaspar preached parish missions, founded mission houses and guided his Missionaries in their new way of life.

Gaspar never left Italy, but his Missionaries now serve in 20 countries. They proclaim our salvation in the Precious Blood of Christ for the spread of the Gospel and the renewal of the Church.

St. Gaspar, who died on December 28, 1837, was canonized in 1954. His feast day is October 21.

CYO student eligibility for St. John the Baptist, Glandorf

The following student eligibility guidelines were established and adopted by St John the Baptist Catholic Church after review and consultation of the Diocese of Toledo eligibility requirements. Refer to Diocese of Toledo, CYO Athletics, Athletic Director Handbook.

Any high school student whose parent/guardian is a registered member of St John the Baptist parish and attends St John's high school CCD is eligible to play.

If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish, simply attending the CCD program does not make them eligible.

If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish but the student attended the St John K-8, 5 day a week, CCD program, and attends St John's high school CCD, they would be eligible to play.

Minimum attendance of 2 school years of the K-8 CCD program. If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish and the student has not attended the St John K-8, 5 day a week, CCD program, but the student does attend St John's high school CCD, they would be eligible to play CYO sports after attending St John's high school CCD for one full year. Attendance tracking would begin at the start of the first year of enrollment.

Any HS student currently participating in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), would register at the parish, and they would be eligible. (The parish does not recommend going through OCIA just to play CYO).

St. John the Baptist Glandorf requirements:

All students must be enrolled in high school CCD before the first class for the beginning of school year to play. Students are expected to attend both the Fall and Winter Semesters of High School Religious Education (CCD) classes. Attendance at these classes will be monitored and reviewed.

For each class missed beyond 3 classes the player will sit out one game per absence. Attendance resets at the end of the team's season for each respective sport.


The Eucharist is why our parish exists and it is the reason why you get the privilege to play on the parish team.

Attendance at a Saturday evening or Sunday Mass at a Catholic Mass is required.

We also ask you to come for one hour of Adoration during Eucharistic Sunday (generally the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary time).

Each player is asked to give 5 hours of service to St. John's parish during the year.


