# **FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT**

In 1848 the Missionaries of the Precious Blood began serving St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Glandorf, Ohio. Since a Missionary of the Precious Blood is your pastor this weekend you are joining with the Missionaries of the Precious Blood in celebrating the founder this weekend. Who is St. Gaspar del Bufalo?

In our church we have a statue of him if you look over to your left he has a crucifix in his left hand and his right hand pointed to the sky. But who is St. Gaspar del Bufalo what is his story? I encourage you to read the insert to learn little more about him.

St. Gaspar is known for his gift to preach in Rome, probably most noted for preaching in the mountain town of Sonio. It was a very violent town after Napoleon with robbers, they would go down the mountain rob the people as the journeyed down the road and then run back up into the town. Many said the town should be destroyed, wiped off the face of the earth even the Pope. Gaspar said let me go and preach there and so he went to the town with a crucifix and the gospels and converts the town. The bandits and they laid down their weapons and the town was saved.

In 2015 I went on pilgrimage to Rome for our community's 200th Anniversary and we visited Sonio our bus got police escort in and out of town, I thought it was out safety in mountain town be of the curvy roads. It turned out because we were are sons of Gaspar that we got the escort.

On August 15, 1815 St. Gaspar founded in the Missionaries of the Precious Blood

St. Gaspar was a missionary but you know he did not go far he never left Rome. Like St. Gaspar each one of us can be missionary and never have to leave Putnam County. St. Gaspar had the gift to preach but you know what I think it is ironic is I never saw translation of the message that he preached. But I have a guess to what he preached. He preached with a crucifix saying because of Christ blood shed on the cross you are loved by our God St. Gaspar would preach to those who seem to be far from Christ's love and bring them close to Jesus by his precious blood.

Like St. Gaspar we are called reach out to those who would seem to be farthest from Christ's love and bring them near through Christ precious blood. We are all called to bringing those who are far from Christ's love, we called to draw them near to Christ love.

Our CCD students when they come over for class, they are given the opportunity to go to confession. And the class before they come, I visit the class and talk about the going to confession. This year so far I have visited grade sixth thru eighth. At the end of class I give the students two stickers from the vocation's office one I tell them they can keep and the second has an image of a chalice on it and says

'You are worth the Precious Blood of Jesus'. I instruct them that they need to give it to someone who is having a bad day. If you are parent or grandparent of a 6th, 7th, or 8th grader in our CCD program you can ask them what they did with that sticker. (Just a note due to a fog delay I did not visit 8A).

When we are having a bad day we tend to feel the farthest from Christ's love and it is in these moments we need to have an encounter with Christ Blood to remind ourselves that we are precious.

As the Precious Blood of Jesus touches our lips through the gift of the Eucharist, may it help us to reach out to those who feel farthest from Christ's love.

Select "O" and ask to speak with someone from children's services and needing to make a referral. Hours are Monday- Thursday, 7AM to 4:30 PM, and Friday 7 AM to Noon. If incident is after hours, please call the Sheriff's Department at 419-523-3208. They will contact the caseworker on call and the caseworker will get back to the one reporting the incident -- leave your contact number with the Sheriff Department person. The person who witnessed or was told is to be the person to make the call.

Report incident to the Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified by calling the Diocese of Toledo Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-244-6711, ext 4880. Notify Pastor, if not already notified. With Pastor's discretion, next call parents and give basic information, while not disclosing any personal information. If abuse is by a teacher, parish staff, or volunteer, report incident to Diocese of Toledo after County Caseworker has been notified.

#### Joint Parish and Finance Council Meeting Minutes August 16, 2023

Access Control Update:

- The keypad on the Brockman Street entrance is not yet installed. Renters currently need to pick up a fob from the rectory for access.
- Parish staff are working on setting up measures for efficient utilization of the access control system, including set-up on multiple devices for Michelle, Fr. Matt, and Joe.

Contact strips need to be added to some of the doors for effective operation.

- Discussion around the necessity of card readers on the back church doors was had at this time do not plan to move forward.
- Access to the rectory on the north side door has changed for those who need to access, including counters. When the green light is on, push to enter, the doorknob will not turn.
- Ongoing discussion about the inclusion of a "threat button" to be put in place to effectively use the church and parish center as a "safe haven" in the event of emergency per Glandorf Elementary School policy.

Summer Updates: Various projects were completed on church property including: Painting of classrooms and cafeteria at the Parish Center.

Replaced steam piping.

Trimmed bushes and trees on church grounds.

Added stone to the church landscaping.

Passed boiler inspection.

Motor repair of condensate pump.

Planted grass.

Cleaned and waxed all floors at the Parish Center.

Cleaned Preschool.

Repaired/replaced the brick foundation on the church bell monument.

Cleaned carpet on the church and parish center

Recommended for replacement of carpet. This project takes significant advanced planning (approximately

1 ½ years plus). Recommended that the Parish Center carpet to replaced as soon as possible.

#### New Business:

- Property Update: Council was notified of the status of the easement and request for utilization of church property near the end of Brockman St. between Glandorf Elementary and the property currently owned by Giesken Holdings. This project remains under legal review by the parish attorney locally, Anna Mae Blankemeyer, and the attorney of the Diocese of Toledo, Tom Antonini, including consideration of liability regarding the utilization request.
- **SONday Fun Day:** The parish will be hosting SONday Fun Day on October 8<sup>th</sup> after 10:30 mass until 3:30. This will be a fundraiser for the parish and a community event that allows parishioners to learn more about various groups and opportunities of the church. This will include open house for the CCD program, inflatables, carnival games and activities for kids. Raffles, hamburgers and fries from the Jaycees, Wrasman's ice cream stand, food trucks, etc. The parish is accepting donations of baskets to raffle in the \$50-\$75 range or an amount of a local businesses choice. This event will replace St. Bonifest. Parish and Finance Council will be responsible for working the concession stand.
- Divine Renovation: Parish and Finance Council members were provided a copy of the book Divine Renovation and asked to read and offer feedback on how to move our parish from maintenance to mission. Feedback and suggestions are requested.
- CYO Policy for Sports: Updates to this policy were reviewed adding a requirement for players and coaches to attend Saturday evening or Sunday mass and for players to provide 5 hours of service to the parish.
- Church Acoustic Concern: Parish Council and Finance Council President received a letter from a parishioner noting the difficulty in hearing from the north gallery seating. Finance Council President attended mass from the seats and inquired with others who sit there with many experiencing the same difficulty hearing. Ashley will make a call to Torrence Sound to assess and provide recommendations for resolution.

### St. Gaspar del Bufalo, founder, Missionaries of the Precious Blood



St. Gaspar is often pictured holding a large crucifix.

Small in stature, St. Gaspar was a powerful preacher who knew the value of a dramatic pose. The crucifix held the people's attention while Gaspar's voice captured their imagination.

St. Gaspar was born in Rome on January 6, 1786. Because he was born on the Feast of the Epiphany, his parents named him for the three wise men, Gaspar Melchior Baltazar del Bufalo.

From an early age, he felt compelled to help the poor, sick and imprisoned. He knew he wanted to be a priest and a missionary, and was ordained at age 22.

Gaspar lived in turbulent times. Napoleon had invaded what is now Italy, and demanded an oath of allegiance, which Gaspar refused. He was sent into exile along with many priests and even the pope! When he returned to his home country, he founded his religious congregation, the Missionaries of the Precious Blood (C.P.P.S.) on August 15, 1815. Gaspar preached parish missions, founded mission houses and guided his Missionaries in their new way of life.

Gaspar never left Italy, but his Missionaries now serve in 20 countries. They proclaim our salvation in the Precious Blood of Christ for the spread of the Gospel and the renewal of the Church.

St. Gaspar, who died on December 28, 1837, was canonized in 1954. His feast day is October 21.
