

Today is not the Feast Day of St. Gaspar his actual feast day is October 21 which would have been Friday. I am your pastor and I am a Missionary of the Precious Blood, St. Gaspar is the founder of our community. As your pastor I think it is important for you to get to know me and because I am a Missionary of the Precious Blood, I think it is important for you to learn and know about my community. I can think of no better way to learn about my community

than for you to learn about our founder. Who is St. Gaspar?

St. Gaspar was born on January 6, 1786 in Rome the Solemnity of the Epiphany so his parent named after the three Magi, Gaspar Melchior Balthazzar. St. Gaspar as child had a concern for the poor and in prisoned his father was a cook for a palace so Gaspar would take part of the food from his meals and share either with poor or those in prison. As families would come into the city to trade their goods Gaspar would talk to children and would tutor them children that would not otherwise receive an education.

This was also during reign of Napoleon and Napoleon wanted priests to sign an oath of allegiance to him. Gaspar was among them to which Gaspar responded by saying "I cannot, I must not, I will not." Since Gaspar would not sign, he was sent into exile and imprisonment it was during this tough time of imprisonment and exile Gaspar begins to develop a devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus. After Napoleon was overthrown and Gaspar was released to return to Rome and when he returns Gaspar wants to become a Missionary like Saint Francis Xavier and go to India. The Pope tells him that this is a noble task but not for you. I need you to stay here and help rebuild the church here in Rome. Gaspar obediently stays and begin to preach missions throughout Rome. Gaspar is known for preaching particularly in the mountain town of Sonio.

In the aftermath of Napoleon Sonio became with robbers, they would go down the mountain rob the people as the journeyed down the road and then run back up into the town. Many said the town should be destroyed. Gaspar said let me go and preach there, he goes to the town with a crucifix and the gospels and converts the town.

St. Gaspar was a gifted preacher, I never heard him preach, never seen a transcript or any translations of what he said. I think I know what his message was, and it was that God loves you so much that Christ shed his blood for you out of love. St. Gaspar wanted people to experience that gift of our God's love at the foot of crucifix St. Gaspar said, "Listen to God's voice at the foot of the crucifix." Through the gift of the sacrament of confession for it is here for it here the sinner that is far off is drawn near to experience the love and forgiveness of our God. As we celebrate St. Gaspar today may we experience the gift our God's love through the shedding of his son's blood, may we draw others to experience the gift of his love, particularly those that would seem to be the farthest from that love.


