#### Hello Everyone,

Well, as the leaves on the trees have changed their colors this autumn from green to yellow, orange, and red, so too has my hair started to change this fall semester, with more gray appearing each time I get it cut. Everyone here is healthy, but things here at the seminary are still rough, not just for me but for almost every guy in the house. For it feels like we are in the darkness of the tomb on Holy Saturday. Meaning there is hope, for the joy of Easter morning is coming; it just might not be until Christmas break, but it is coming. So, <u>THANK YOU</u> for all the love, prayers, text messages, phone calls, cards, letters, etc., not just for me, but for every guy who pursues the priesthood. It is so greatly appreciated, especially this semester.

We have reached the mid-semester break. This means our retreat week is the next week, and it is so needed right now, even if it is still at the seminary this year. For it is only the mid-semester break, but it feels like we should be at Christmas break. We recently, just held one of our Solemn Vespers here at the school, which was closed to the public and just live-streamed online. If I remember, I will try to let the parish know when our next Solemn Vespers and our Advent Lessons & Carols will be, so you can tune in online to enjoy the music and to experience just a small part of the vast treasury of music the church offers.

Since we are limited in our travels and what we can do for volunteer work in the community, we have been assigned to help at a local cemetery. This cemetery is where people are buried who cannot afford a funeral; it is quite the change from my volunteer work last year at the pregnancy center. At the cemetery, we are trimming grass, removing brush, cleaning/washing the gravestones, and resetting them. The main section we have been working in is a military veteran's section. By cleaning the stones (which is my job), you learn about the person buried there. For you see their name, their birth and death date, about their military career, and learn their faith by the symbol at the top of their stone. Doing this work reminds us of the spiritual work of mercy to pray for the dead. Being in the veteran's area reminds me personally to give thanks first to God for the freedom we have been given and to say thank you to all who have served our country to preserve our freedoms.

Working in the cemetery has reminded me of the importance of life. For without life, liberty and freedom does not matter, and you are not given even a chance to pursue happiness, which God is the source of true happiness. So, by denying any person the right to live, at any stage of life, from conception to natural death, is nothing but evil. And as Catholics, we are called to love God first and love our neighbor; our neighbor being everyone, for we are all brothers and sisters in Christ. So, remember when we make any choice in our lives, God knows it, good or bad, and it will be on our record on judgment day. The best part as Catholics we have the sacrament of reconciliation, to be forgiven of our past mistakes, as long as we are genuinely going to try to change, so to realign our life and heart with God's will.

Coming up during the first week of November is Vocation Awareness Week. That being said, it is time to do more than just continuing to pray for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life. When Jesus sent out the seventy-two to preach and teach, he didn't say pray today and go tomorrow, but he sent them out at that moment. Encourage kids and young adults to pray and ask God what He wants them to do and to try and explore religious life. Everyone loves seeing nuns, monks, and priests around, and you usually hear, I wish there were more. Well, it starts in the home, and it is time for all of us to do more. Start by bringing kids to Mass, for we are all one parish family, do not just stay in the back of the church but sit upfront so they can see, watch or read them stories from the bible. Do kids today even know bible stories? For example, like Jonah and the whale? For high school and college kids and young adults, go on a retreat or to an open house at a convent or with the diocese. What is there to be scared of? Parents pray for your kids' vocation (remember it is not a job; it is life) and teach them the faith. For when you were married in the Catholic church, you promised to accept kids and bring them up in the Catholic faith. You also made that promise for them with their godparents at their baptism. Again, these promises were made to God. Also, know that even if you go to a convent or a seminary, you can leave anytime (before ordination in the case of the priesthood). For that is the purpose of going, so to discern what God is calling you to, and time there will not be wasted, God will be forming you into a better person in ways you won't realize.

Just remember, God helps those who trust in Him!

Mt. 5: 1-12a

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law tested him by asking, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

The love of God brings freedom into your life. You are not dependent on other people's opinions of you. To love God means that you do not have to be needy for other people's attention because God is vying for your attention. Loving God means that you enter into a healthier way of living. It seems like when we give time to God in prayer, our relationships, bodies, and thinking are healthier. But we have to love God first and foremost.

Do I enter my days with the thinking of how I can love God and others more? Not how I can make more money and get my name in the paper. St. John Paul II says, "Life with Christ is a wonderful adventure." Sure, we can control every one of our decisions each day but there is no adventure in that. Christ wants us to be open to the unexpected. Let God lead. Our ways are too predictable and boring. Jesus says, "My ways are not your ways and my thoughts are not your thoughts." God bless you all. # Statement of Bishop Daniel Thomas regarding comments by Pope Francis in a documentary film

Recent unofficial comments by Pope Francis in an unscripted interview in Spanish regarding the question of "civil unions" have gained wide attention. Even though the full context of the interview is not clear, the question he may have been answering is unknown, and the pope's response has been variously translated, many have already rushed to conclusions.

From Pope Francis' words, one can gather his desire to emphasize that persons with homosexual tendencies should not be disowned, but should be treated with respect and dignity in their families. The Holy Father is reaffirming the teaching of the Catholic Church that persons with homosexual tendencies: "must be accepted with respect, compassion, and sensitivity. Every sign of unjust discrimination in their regard should be avoided" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* #2358).

In the documentary film, Pope Francis discussed "a law of civil coexistence" (*una ley de una convivencia civil*) for persons of homosexual orientation. While open to varying interpretations, this statement does not change the teaching of Jesus and his Church on the nature of marriage. Pope Francis, both as a bishop and as pope, has consistently emphasized that marriage should be exclusively defined as the life-long partnership between one man and one woman.

As Pope Francis affirmed in Amoris Laetitia "the exclusive and indissoluble union between a man and a woman has a plenary role to play in society as a stable commitment that bears fruit in new life. We need to acknowledge the great variety of family situations that can offer a certain stability, but de facto or same-sex unions, for example, may not simply be equated with marriage. No union that is temporary or closed to the transmission of life can ensure the future of society" (#52).

Catholics and non-Catholics alike should understand that unscripted comments expressed by a pope in a media interview for a film are not an official and authoritative exercise of the papal teaching office. The pope's recent comments should be weighed within the context of prior official papal and Magisterial teachings, avoiding the spread of misinformation, misinterpretation of settled Church teaching, and misleading headlines.
