FROM THE DESK OF DEACON MIKE October 26, 2025

This Sunday's scriptures and many of the readings in the last few weeks, including the weekday mass readings, have been about prayer. What does your prayer life look like? The range of prayer methods and time spent in prayer, I'm certain, vary quite a bit among all of us. One of the thoughts from the Gospel is that prayer may not be about quantity or even quality but our attitude in our prayer time. The Pharisee prays for God to notice all he does and he even compares himself to others, telling God how he is not like others including this tax collector. He seems to be more focused on his righteousness and accomplishments than he is on asking God for forgiveness for his sins, or help with his struggles. The tax collector on the other hand, shows so much humility that he beats his breast and can't even raise his eyes to God because of his guilt. He is crying out for the mercy of God. You can sense the remorse for his sins in his attitude. How can you help yourself to take the right attitude during your prayer time? Our attitude in prayer starts with our attitude towards God in our life. If we are truly centered on God, our attitude will follow. Even on the bad days. The more we focus our prayer life toward the mercy of God, the more humble our attitude in prayer becomes.

Some days it may be hard to get in the mood for prayer. With so many activities to get to and from and all of our responsibilities at home and work, prayer time may get neglected. Take some time to examine your days. When do you think you can add some prayer time? Maybe during your commute or while your waiting to pick up your kids. Maybe while your sitting in the waiting room at the doctor or what about replacing some screen time with prayer time. There are a few prayer apps I use occasionally. I enjoy following along with the rosary meditations by Saint Luke Production in the AMEN app on my phone. Other apps to check out include Ascension, Hallow, Divine Office, Laudate, or EWTN. Your days may be so busy, you can only squeeze in a couple minutes of prayer time. DO IT! An Our Father takes about 20 secs, a Hail Mary about 14 secs. Think how many Hail Mary's you can get in just driving from one place to the next. Offer each of those Hail Mary's for one person you know needs some help. Another good way to fit some prayer time in is to get involved in activities in the parish. We have "That Man Is You" two days a week and we always take a small amount of time to pray together. There's a Saturday morning group for the women and I'm sure they work some prayer time into their gatherings.

Take advantage of the prayer days at Christ the King Center. Attend a parish Welcome Retreat, the women have their next one in just a couple of weeks. Let's all focus on our attitude in prayer. Enter prayer time with a humble attitude so we can recognize God's great mercy all around us. I ask you to pray for all of our parishioners and know that I am praying for you. God bless and have a grace filled week.



In response to their inquiries, these people are properly instructed so that you can discern (through reflection and prayer) whether you are indeed called to Catholicism. Catechism Corner GOD'S JUSTICES

This week's readings speak of God's justice. The first reading from Sirach 35 says, "The LORD is a God of justice ... nor will it withdraw till the Most High responds, judges justly ..." The second reading from 2 Tim. 4 states, "the Lord, the just judge, will award to me on that day..." And the Gospel of Luke 18 says, "I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former." So what is the justice of God? Should we fear His justice? How does it apply to our lives?

"Justice [one of the cardinal virtues] is the moral virtue that consists in the constant and firm will to give one's due to God and neighbor." (Catechism of the Catholic Church # 1807) When speaking of the justification of God, it is "the grace of the Holy Spirit that has the power to justify us, that is, to cleanse us from our sins and to communicate to us "the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ" and through Baptism." (CCC #1987) We can see that God does not desire to throw brimstone and hail at us. Instead, by His Paschal Mystery he has justified us. His justice, while it may involve due punishment, is intertwined with mercy, righteousness, and healing.

Pope Francis said that God's justice is often misunderstood as mere punishment when in reality it "raises us up" by "freeing us from the snares of evil. Jesus reveals God's justice." He went on to say, "Very often we have a limited idea of justice and think that it means: those who do wrong pay ... and in this way compensate for the wrong they have done. But God's justice, as the Scripture teaches, is much greater: it does not have as its end the condemnation of the guilty, but their salvation and rebirth, making them just. He came to fulfil divine justice, which is that of saving sinners; he came to take on his own shoulders the sin of the world and to descend into the waters of the abyss ... of death, so as to rescue us from drowning."

And, in 2008, Pope Benedict XVI said: "God desired to save us by going to the bottom of this abyss himself so that every person, even those who have fallen so low that they can no longer perceive Heaven, may find God's hand to cling to and rise from the darkness to see again the light for which he or she was made."

While Jesus saved us from our sin, we can't simply say our work is done. "Justification is at the same time the *acceptance of God's righteousness through faith in Jesus Christ*. (#1991) Justification *establishes cooperation between God's grace and man's freedom*. (#1993) Man must cooperate with the saving grace of Christ's justification for our sins. Believers are called to be instruments of God's justice by developing a social conscience, working for a more humane world, and supporting the poor. Justification can involve accepting personal suffering with love and offering it as a sacrifice, allowing it to be transformed by God's mercy. It is also a call to forgive those who have wronged us, trusting that God will ultimately right all wrongs.

How can we apply justice to our life today? Reflect on how you can apply the virtue of justice in your own life by showing kindness to those in need and striving to create a more just and humane world, reflecting the values of Christ. Reflect on any hurt you have experienced and pray for the grace to forgive and offer mercy, allowing God's justice to be worked out through you. Finally, entrust your desire for justice to God, trusting that he will make all things right in his time and his way.







YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT

CYO student eligibility for St. John the Baptist, Glandorf

The following student eligibility guidelines were established and adopted by St John the Baptist Catholic Church after review and consultation of the Diocese of Toledo eligibility requirements. Refer to Diocese of Toledo, CYO Athletics, Athletic Director Handbook.

Any high school student whose parent/guardian is a registered member of St John the Baptist parish and attends St John's high school CCD is eligible to play.

If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish, simply attending the CCD program does not make them eligible.

If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish but the student attended the St John K-8, 5 day a week, CCD program, and attends St John's high school CCD, they would be eligible to play.

Minimum attendance of 2 school years of the K-8 CCD program. If neither a parent/guardian or the student are registered members of St John the Baptist parish and the student has not attended the St John K-8, 5 day a week, CCD program, but the student does attend St John's high school CCD, they would be eligible to play CYO sports after attending St John's high school CCD for one full year. Attendance tracking would begin at the start of the first year of enrollment.

Any HS student currently participating in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), would register at the parish, and they would be eligible. (The parish does not recommend going through OCIA just to play CYO).

St. John the Baptist Glandorf requirements:

All students must be enrolled in high school CCD before the first class for the beginning of school year to play. Students are expected to attend both the Fall and Winter Semesters of High School Religious Education (CCD) classes. Attendance at these classes will be monitored and reviewed.

For each class missed beyond 3 classes the player will sit out one game per absence. Attendance resets at the end of the team's season for each respective sport.

The Eucharist is why our parish exists and it is the reason why you get the privilege to play on the parish team.

Attendance at a Saturday evening or Sunday Mass at a Catholic Mass is required.

We also ask you to come for one hour of Adoration during Eucharistic Sunday (generally the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary time)

Each player is asked to give 5 hours of service to St. John's parish during the year.



The Ottawa Food Pantry, located at Trinity United Methodist Church in Ottawa, consists of 6 local churches. It includes the Catholic churches of Kalida, Glandorf, and Ottawa, and Ottawa's Lutheran, Presbyterian, and Methodist churches. Since there are six churches, each church takes care of 2 different months. St. John's months are April and October. Seeing that it will soon be our turn again, we need your support (volunteer hours). The Food Pantry is open to needy families on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month, this coming month being Oct. 14 and Oct 28. There is prep work to be done on the Mondays before these dates, as well, but no clients come until Tuesday morning. Here is a rundown of what happens each day and where we need YOU.

> Preparation Days (9:30 - 12:30)

Get empty boxes from local businesses (to carry each family's groceries)

Pick up food order from Lima Food Bank (Need a pickup truck and a trailer)

Unload and put away food from the Lima Food Bank (Men are needed, for the cases and boxes are heavy.)

Set up tables in Trinity's assembly hall for distributing eggs, butter, produce, bread, pastry items, refrigerated items, slightly expired items, etc., Set up chairs for waiting clients.

Sort, check expiration dates, and put away items that have recently been donated (for example-anything from the box in the back of our church)

TUESDAYS Distribution Days (9:30 - 2:00)

Stand behind the tables set up on Monday in the assembly hall (control how much each client can take/ restock as the tables

Walk along with clients, perhaps pushing their carts for them and filling their boxes, as they choose items from our "choice pantry". It is called a choice pantry because the room is set up like a small grocery store, and clients choose what they want. We control the amount they take, depending upon the size of their family. For example, a large family may take 5 canned vegetables, 3 fruits, 1 ready-to-eat soup and 1 condensed soup, 2 meat packages, 1 baking item, etc. (A clipboard with the amounts each client can take of each category is provided for you, and you check off each food group as it is chosen.) Stay in the choice pantry and restock shelves as certain items get low.

Carry out and load food boxes into customers' cars.

Make lunch for the Glandorf volunteers

Clean up the assembly hall (put leftover food away, stack chairs, put tables back in their original places, stack and store remaining boxes, wash down the tables, clean up the kitchen from lunch, etc.)

NOTE: Glandorf St. John's is also in need of a person/couple willing to:

Attend 3 - 4 meetings per year, along with representatives from each church, to make decisions for the pantry and to keep each parish informed of any changes being made.

Call to remind/line up parish volunteers.

Write thank you notes to generous donors.

Periodically submit church bulletin announcements.
