Desk of
Fr. Tony**

Jesus tells us today, "For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Jesus is urging his disciples not to be arrogant and self-righteous or smug. We see a Pharisee telling God how great he is but God is not impressed. The Pharisee exalted himself before God by saying, "O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity --greedy, dishonest, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector." The Pharisee went home humbled by God.

We then see a tax collector who would not even look up into heaven because of his sins. The tax collector says from the heart, "O God be merciful to me a sinner." The tax collector's prayer was heard because he spoke to God from the heart and he humbled himself before God. This act of humility on our part takes a willingness to let go of pride. I have to see myself as a sinner. At times people do not want to admit their weaknesses or sinfulness to God. At times we brag about how great we are but God is not impressed. When you brag be ready to be put in your place. When people tell you how great you are, Jesus tells us to say, "I am an unprofitable servant, I have done what was obliged of me."

Jesus wants us to be humble because he is humble. Arrogant and self-righteous people do not always see the needs of others. Arrogant people have no need of God because they can do anything without God. That is why Jesus finds arrogant people hard of heart.

I want to encourage all of you parishioners to attend St. Bonifest. Take the opportunity to eat some good food and get to know your parishioners. Thank you volunteers who helped support this great event.
