FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MATT

Paul in our scriptures today instructs us "to love another" (Romans 13:8). On the surface we like this instruction, this instruction gives us a warm fuzzy feeling on the inside, and many easily jump on board to follow this instruction without giving any thought. I mean who would object to loving another?

It is easy to love another that thinks like me, it is easy to love another that I agree with, and it is easy to love another that listens to me. But let's go a little deeper below service can I love another that is opposite of me, that thinks differently than me, that I disagree with, and that does not listen to me. When I think about the one that is opposite of me and the invitation to love. This invitation has me second guessing myself not so much if I could follow this instruction but more about wanting to follow this instruction, let's face it, it can be hard to love someone who is different.

In our scriptures today through Ezekiel and Jesus we are given examples to love in away that can make us feel uncomfortable. We are instructed today on the importance of confronting the wicked and sinners about their wrong. Many of us like the idea of confronting the wicked and sinners but sometimes doing this can make us feel very uncomfortable. Many, me included, fear the negative response that I might get when I speak up. Will they even listen to what I have to say? Ezekiel points out if we do not speak up the wicked will die because of their sin, and if we do not speak up, we will be responsible for their death because we did not speak up. We do not want to be responsible for another person's death so we need to speak up. Perhaps we are looking at it wrong. Rather than speaking up to confront the wicked or the sinner, what we are called to do is care-front the situation. We speak up to the wicked or the sinner because we care, because we love the wicked or the sinner.

But what if they will not listen when we speak to them? Jesus gives us a practical solution speak one on one, if that does not work "take one or two others along with you" (Matthew 18:15), if that does not work tell the church, and if that does not work then treat them "as you would a Gentile or tax collector" (Matthew 18:17). So often we might interpret treating a Gentile or tax collector as to treat them like dirt and many in the culture of Jesus time would have treated these people this way. If we look to Jesus example he did not, Jesus treated Gentiles and tax collectors with

love, respect, and dignity he ate and socialized with them. And it is usually when he spent time with them that there was a change of heart. For example, when Jesus went to spend time at Zacchaeus's house, Zacchaeus said "'Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have exhorted anything form anyone I shall repay it four times over" (Luke 19:8).

For it is when we treat the wicked and sinners with love, dignity, respect, and Christ light that we make darkness, wickedness, and sinners uncomfortable and it fights but fleas away and hearts get changed and we win over.

Parish Council and Finance Committee Meeting on May 30, 2023

- Meeting was joint meeting of Parish Council and Finance Committee. See Finance Committee Secretary meeting minutes for joint session.
- The prior meeting minutes were reviewed.
 - Correction to the minutes include adding Parish Council Members Kim Ansley, Kelly Morman, Carl Siefker, Nick Ellerbrock, and Jodi Schroeder as present. Parish Council Members not present included Tara Gerding, Becky Schroeder, Jon Leopold, Myah Kuhlman, Will Schmitz.
 - It was suggested to add "each" to the approved dollar amount for the AED units.
- Council members were updated on the Access Control Project. Project is progressing slowly while waiting on supplies needed as well as the door specialist to complete the work.
- Discussion surrounding purchasing a new tractor for the parish has been tabled until next spring.
- Council discussed the potential updates to the rental house, including updating kitchen, bathroom, adding laundry room, new flooring, adding can lights, creating a concrete pad for the back of the house, adding a privacy fence, and fixing concrete patch in the garage. A motion was made and passed to move forward with Brent Leopold on the renovations. Another motion was made and passed to approve a \$50,000 budget for the project. Additionally, a discussion was held regarding increasing the rent for the house to \$1,000/month.
- Ashley informed both councils of improvements happening in the parish center throughout the summer. Several rooms will be repainted and the boilers are being serviced. The potential replacement of carpet was mentioned as a project in the near future.
- **Maintenance Committee:** A parish grounds committee has been formed and will begin analyzing potential projects on parish grounds.
- New business discussion around various ministries within the parish and how awareness could be spread regarding them. Council also discussed potential replacements for St. Bonifest.
- Parish Council Roles.
 - The Parish Council and Finance Committees separated to discuss and vote for roles for the next year.
 - For President, Mike Karhoff self-nominated to continue in this role. All members present agreed.
 - For Vice President, Kim Ansley self-nominated. All members present agreed.

Mexico, 2006

In October 2006, Fr. Leopoldo Roque, pastor of Saint Martin of Tours Parish, invited Father Raymundo Reyna Esteban to lead a spiritual retreat for his parishioners. As Fr. Leopoldo and another priest were distributing Communion, assisted by a religious sister, this latter turns towards Fr. Leopoldo with tears in her eyes: the Host that she had taken to give Communion to a parishioner had begun to effuse a reddish substance.

The scientific research conducted included the following conclusions, presented on May 25, 2013:

1. The substance analyzed corresponds to blood in which there are hemoglobin and DNA of human origin.

- 2. Two studies conducted by forensic experts have shown that the substance originates from the interior, excluding the hypothesis that someone could have placed it from the exterior.
- 3. The blood type is AB, similar to the one found in the Host of Lanciano and in the Shroud of Turin.
